6. NEW BUSINESS

6.1 WHEREAS, The New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, Division of Local Government Services awarded \$10 million in Local Recreation Improvement Grants to counties, municipalities, and school districts across New Jersey to ensure public access to quality outdoor recreation and community resources. The grants were awarded to 162 local governments after a very competitive application process,

WHEREAS, The Local Recreation Improvement Grant not only supports improvement and repair of public recreation facilities including local parks, municipal recreation centers, but also access to outdoor recreation and community resources which is critical for mental and physical health,

WHEREAS, A community playground is a vital part of the quality of life of the residents for the Mendham Borough and this award helped contribute funds to provide a place of enjoyment not only for the Hilltop Elementary school students but also for the community as a whole, this award will help offset funds to the Mendham Borough Board of Education and obtain an updated and safer playground.

WHEREAS, Mendham Borough School District could not fulfill its mission of obtaining the Local Recreation Improvement Grant in the amount of \$75,000.00 without the input and efforts of the Mendham Borough Mayor and Council President.
