

Writing Class


4 th Grade: In 4 th grade writing, we are diving into a text dependent analysis essay. Students are reading about how elephants communicate and will then write a response that proves elephants use many senses to talk with one another.



5th Grade: The 5th graders are starting poetry this week. Over the next couple weeks, we will be writing, reading, and learning new types of poetry. So far, we have written alphabet poems (which are not as easy as they sound[©]) and biography poems.

6 th Grade: This week, we have tackled the difference between argumentative writing and persuasive writing. Students are learning how to organize an argument and to support it with facts and logic, not emotions and opinions.



Concepts in Science

4th Grade- Students will investigate how the structure of the plants they chose help each plant survive and research different plants and their structures of the plants they chose.

5th Grade- Students will investigate how temperature affects the ability of a solid to be mixed into a liquid and observe mixtures to see if mass is conserved when substances are mixed.

6th Grade- Students will describe the function of a cell and explore ways parts of cells contribute to their function. They will develop and use models to enhance their understanding of these concepts.


