School Cancellation

As always, weather predictions for the Southwest R-V School District are going to be difficult concerning school on Wednesday, February 23, 2022.

I have watched both Northwest Arkansas and Southwest Missouri weather and communicated with the National Weather Service several times today. It looks as though hazardous weather it is inevitable. The only difference in the two forecasts is a couple of hours. NWA is saying that the precipitation is starting at 9:00 a.m. while SWMO is predicting 11:00-noon as the starting time. Since the temperature is already well below freezing and going to stay in the upper teens to very low 20's, we do not have the advantage of warm ground and highways to keep and falling moisture from freezing.

Just in case inclement weather was to happen, all teachers were supposed to send work home with your children for Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday.
