BUS STOP DESIGNATED PLACE OF SAFETY

What is place of safety?

- 1. A designated safety spot assigned by the bus driver where students are to stand and stay for the bus when loading and unloading.
- 2. The place of safety is such a place that the driver can account for the location of the child before moving the bus.

Why is it important?

- 1. The purpose of a place of safety is to reduce, as much as possible, the potential of a student being hit by a school bus while they are in the process of being picked up or dropped off.
- 2. The place of safety is more important during inclement weather when visibility by the driver is reduced.

What can you do as a parent?

- 1. Review the safety rules with children. Help them to understand why each rule is important.
- 2. Help children to be ready at the bus stop before their bus arrives.
- 3. Parental involvement at bus stops is encouraged. Take turns supervising bus stops. Please be a role model for your child and observe the place of safety together.
