Updates and the Future

I would like to extend my appreciation to the stakeholders that took time to take our survey regarding how we should use our ESSER funds to address student issues related to the pandemic (academic struggles, emotional and social setbacks, learning loss, air quality, etc.) The top choices from our stakeholders were:

Deliver interventions for struggling students by providing small group instruction

In response: Created 2 new paraprofessional positions and looking to expand our teaching staff and keep the teachers we have.

Provide social emotional learning and support through things such as counseling, mental health and wellness lessons/classes for students, staff, and families

In response: Contract with Comm. Mental Health to provide preventative and counseling services to all students and create a certified position that will provide behavior and academic interventions and support to all students with a need.

Ensure students receive high quality instructional materials

In response: Update curriculum materials and technology support where needed

The next three received equal support:

Add interventions and/or instructions support for special education

Improve facilities

Staff recruitment and retention

In response: Creative planning for next year. We would like more teachers to provide instructional support but we must acknowledge that there is a shortage nationwide. Improved salaries will allow us to be competitive with other districts in the area and small bonuses will help us keep staff. Improved facilities - single unit air and heat with outdoor air and filtrations for classrooms.

\*\*\*

We recently completed "stay interviews" with our certified staff. These interviews provided the administration with insight into what staff struggle with, what they love about Burr Oak Schools, and how we can do better. This is a practice we will certainly do more often. A major takeaway: Teachers want to feel supported by administrators and parents.

Buildings and grounds update: Our architect is working to get bids on a much needed new roof. The majority of this cost will come from the sinking fund that was supported by the community. We continue to analyze where improvements need to be made and plan for the future.

Our Burr Oak Virtual Academy continues to grow! We are now over 200 students and one of the few public schools that offer a virtual program K-12. While the pandemic was definitely a catalyst for an explosion of students entering a virtual program, we do not see a decrease of students in the future. Many families have found that virtual schooling fits their lifestyle or their students' needs for a variety of reasons. Our virtual program is statewide and we continue to look for ways to improve options for students.



**TO: Parents of students in grades 8-11** 

SUBJECT: Dual Enrollment Notification for the 2022-23 School Year

Goals 4 and 5 in Michigan's Top 10 Strategic Education Plan are to expand secondary learning opportunities for all students and to increase the percentage of students who graduate from high school, respectively.

The Postsecondary Enrollment Options Act (<u>PA 160 of 1996</u>) establishes and outlines provisions for the enrollment of eligible high school students in postsecondary courses of education, which allow for what is most commonly referred to as dual enrollment. **Students who meet the criteria set forth in the above law will be notified of their eligibility by the school counselor**.

- For students who meet all eligibility criteria, a school district or state approved nonpublic school is required to allow a student up to 10 dual enrolled courses during their high school career. Further stipulations within the law may allow this limit to be exceeded by grade level, through a written agreement by both the district and the postsecondary institution.
- Dual enrollment may occur outside of the regular school year if the course is included in the pupil's schedule during the closest count period that the pupil is registered for the course, and the course has been paid in full.




