VOTING DAY ON MARCH 8, 2022 at WINNACUNNET HIGH SCHOOL CAFETERIA

Dear Marston Families,

We hope our students and their families had a joyful and relaxing winter vacation! As we welcome students back to school, we are anticipating many exciting learning opportunities and special events to come. As you may know, the Hampton School Board and the Governor's Office have directed that masks are no longer required in school. This means that each family must make a choice based on what is in the best interest of your children and your individual family dynamic. Please know that since we are still in the "red zone" our other mitigating safety factors will still be in place. These include: general social distancing of 3-feet, social distancing of 6-feet while eating, frequent handwashing, deep cleaning, cohorting students, etc. With that said, please remember that all students are required by federal mandates to wear a mask on the bus ride to and home from school.

Finally, please consider having a conversation with your child regarding your expectations about mask wearing, for them personally and for their classmates. In the recommended stage, mask wearing is a personal choice made by families. It is important that our students understand how to comply and respect their own family's decision, and the decisions made by their classmates' families.

For your future planning purposes March 8 is voting day for town elections. Winnacunnet High School Cafeteria is the official polling site for Hampton. Students WILL be in school on Voting Day. If you would like more information regarding the Hampton School District's proposed budget and warrant articles, they will be posted in the local newspapers and on the SAU 90 Website.

We would like to remind you that the Report Card window for the second trimester will be opened on Monday, March 21 for all students. We will hold our Spring Parent Teacher Conferences virtually on Wednesday, March 23. Additional information will be sent out by your child's classroom teacher during the month of March.
