Notice: The GISD Board of Education has called a bond election to be held on May 7th, 2022. The bond package is designed to accommodate the growth in our district and plan for the future.

The key areas of focus in the bond include a new elementary school, land purchase for a future high school, additions to the middle school that will include a full size gym and dining area, and additions to the high school that will include more classrooms and expansions to the locker rooms and Fine Arts program.

Other district wide improvements include addressing the drainage deficiencies at the softball field and along Tiger Lane, as well as a roof replacement at the high school.

## Gunter High School

Enchiladas Rojas (Red Enchiladas) a main dish of Mexico was on the menu in Coach Castorena's Spanish 3 class. The students were tasked to create a presentation on how to create this dish from shopping, to preparing, to eating. Some chose to do a slide presentation, others chose a video. It was fun to watch the students go through the process of cooking the enchiladas. The skills varied, which made it even more entertaining, but they all learned that they CAN cook! All of the students did an amazing job, and you can tell by the pictures that their food was tasty!


Nurse Layman's students in Principles of Health Science class studied the Cardiovascular System, focusing on the structures of the heart and how the blood flows through the heart and to the body. Drawing and creating models are hands on experiences that allow the students to actually visualize the concept.



Mrs. Foster's GHS Robotics class has had some fun lately. They are building robots from VEX kits and challenging each other. The last challenge the students had was to pick up and/or move objects. Each object had point values and these points were awarded to the team depending on the piece the robot was able to get back to its home base. More points were awarded for actually being able to pick up an object and placing it in a specified area. To pick up an object the students had to build manipulators (arms and claws) which is not always an easy task! Mrs. Foster said, "It was interesting to watch the students build their robots, test it out and decide to change something. I think more is learned from hands on and trial and error rather than just being told what to do. Out of the box thinking is good!" Students seem to have fun as well. During this last challenge, the students were having fun during the robotic run and telling their driver what piece to get in order to earn more points. The next challenge - bumper bots!
