Writing Class

<u>**4**</u> th **Grade:** In 4 th grade writing, we are diving into a text dependent analysis essay. Students are reading about how elephants communicate and will then write a response that proves elephants use many senses to talk with one another.

<u>5</u>th Grade: The 5th graders continue on with poetry. This week, we have written cinquains and odes. The word choice and topic selection has been both fun and entertaining.



<u>6 th Grade</u>: This week, we have tackled the difference between argumentative writing and persuasive writing. - We continued to learn about ancient China. We talked about the Great Wall of China and the Silk road. We will test over ancient China, states, and capitals before the end of the quarter.



Concepts in Science

4th Grade- Students will investigate how the structure of the plants they chose help each plant survive and research different plants and their structures of the plants they chose.

5th Grade- Students will plan and carry out investigations to determine if mass is conserved after matter undergoes a chemical or physical change.

6th Grade- Students will research the characteristics shared by all living things which include organization, growth & development, reproduction, response to stimuli, maintaining internal conditions and use of energy. Students will present reports to the class.

The specific type of ABA used may depend on your child's age, challenges, and other factors. **Early intensive behavioral intervention** This is often recommended for children younger than 5. It involves an intensive, individualized curriculum designed to teach communication, social interaction, and functional and adaptive skills.
