## Dual Credit Information

**What is Dual Credit?** Dual Credit is an actual college course that counts as both a high school half credit and three hours of college credit. This course is online with a professor from Lone Star College Montgomery. Student must be independent learners and comfortable with online courses. Completing a dual credit course begins a student's college transcript. This transcript is required as part of the college applications along with the high school transcript.

**Should my student take a dual credit course next year?** If your student is a high achieving academic student and independently completes work without help remembering, then they might be ready for dual credit. This is a college course and students need to be able to balance starting high school, extra-curricular activities and homework expectations. Students making a D or F in a dual credit course are removed from the program. Students removed from the program or drop a course are required to reimburse the school district for the course fee. Most students begin dual credit their junior year.

If students do not have a qualifying score with ACT, PSAT or SAT, they will need to see Mrs. Choate regarding the TSIA2 test at Lone Star College.

Students must have their Lone Star application completed on the [www.goapplytexas.org](http://www.goapplytexas.org) website before taking the TSIA2 test.

After applying, you will receive an email with your Lone Star College ID number.

- Enter your Lone Star College ID #
- Set up your new account

- You will use your myLoneStar account to pay for your classes after registration
