## Getting Started

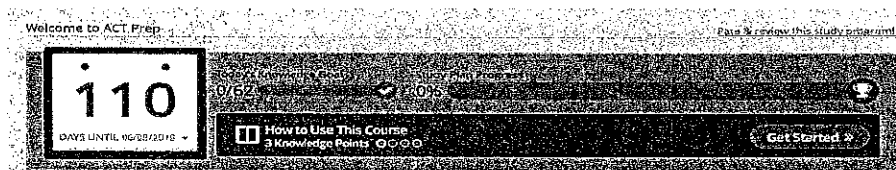
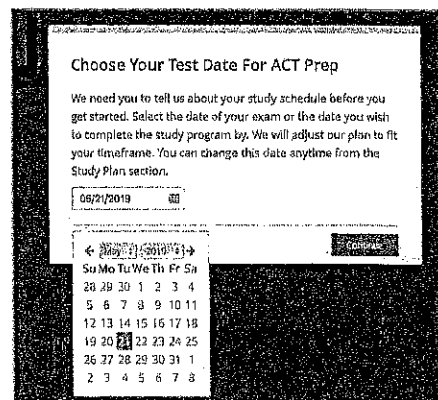
*One of your first lessons is to orient yourself with all of the features available (Get Started with Naviance Test Prep). Naviance Test Prep takes you through a tour of all of the features! Learn how to use Naviance Test Prep in the most efficient and effective way. (This feature is only available for SAT and ACT Prep.)*

Complete these three easy steps to get started with your test prep:

**Step 1:** Upon logging into Naviance Test Prep the first time, you are prompted to **Choose Your Test Date**. Choose the date of your exam or the date you wish to complete the course. This action helps plan the study schedule.

**Optional:** If your school has purchased more than one test prep course, confirm the test for which you wish to prepare under the **My Studies** drop-down.

**Step 2:** Once you have selected the test date, click the **Get Started** button. Depending on the exam, you are preparing for you may review some introduction information (AP Courses) or go straight to a diagnostic or practice test. Completing this step allows Test Prep to analyze your strengths and areas for improvement.














# Naviance Test Prep Features

## Study Plan

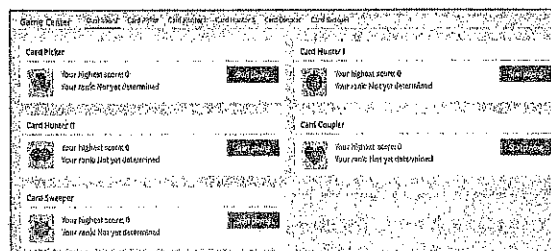
The Study Plan guides you through the course in the most efficient way possible and helps you stay organized and on track. By selecting your desired end date or test date, the study plan automatically adapts to your timeframe and feeds you the appropriate amount of content each day.

Study plans are broken down into individual study tasks. A study task can be comprised of Lessons, Flashcards, Practice Questions or Tests. Each study task is given a number of Knowledge Points based on length, difficulty, and importance. The Daily Knowledge Goals informs you how many points are needed each day to complete the course on time. If you miss a day or complete more than the daily goal, the study plan automatically re-adjusts.

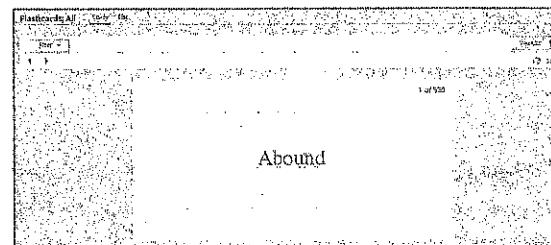
## Game Center

The Flashcard section presents you with the key terms and concepts you need to know. The digital flashcards help you to learn terms quickly.



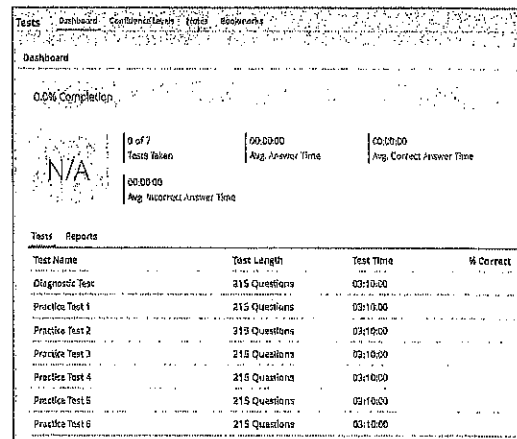
## Practice Questions

Practice Questions give you a causal environment to test your knowledge of specific categories and concepts. You can complete as many or as few questions at a time and can select to review questions directly after answering or at the end of a session. ## Tests

The Tests section is designed to simulate a real test experience. Full-length exams are broken down into sections and breaks that mock real life exams. Allow enough time to complete the entire exam without having to pause it!



## Achievements

Achievements in Naviance Test Prep courses are an alternative method for you to track your progress. While you progress through Naviance Test Prep, you can unlock achievements when you reach milestones, such as answering a question correctly within ten seconds, create 50 bookmarks, or reply to a public discussion. You don't have to unlock every achievement in Naviance Test Prep – they're just for fun!

### Naviance Test Prep Dashboard

The Dashboard is where your personal progress and performance information is displayed. On the homepage, you can view your performance over time, strength and weaknesses, student status, top game scores, and achievements. The homepage gives you a good overview of your status.

*Messages and Notifications appear in the top right-hand corner of the page providing in-app messages and notifications regarding activity in a topic of discussion you follow or when you unlock an achievement.*

## PSAT

Score used for Dual Credit and a predictor of college admissions testing.

Students in grades 9, 10 and 11 may test.

PSAT date is Wednesday, October 18 - *October each school year.*

Score used for College Admissions.

Register online [www.collegeboard.org](http://www.collegeboard.org)

## ACT

Score used for College Admissions.

Register online [www.act.org](http://www.act.org)

Test spring of sophomore year, anytime junior year and if needed beginning of senior year.

Schools take the best score! It does not matter if you take this test more than once.

Some schools will super score (take the best subject test grades from multiple ACT tests). You need to ask colleges/universities admissions if they super score.
