The City of Warren Lead Hazard Control **Grant** Program offers assistance to applicable households occupied by **children under six or pregnant women**. Available to eligible "low" and "moderate" income households, the **grant** funds are used to address lead-based paint hazards by overseeing repairs to owner- OR tenant-occupied single-family residences.

The maximum **grant** amount is \$20,000; these funds will be dedicated to certifying property compliance with national lead safety guidelines. These guidelines seek to protect families living in homes built prior to 1978, when lead-based paint use was widely prevalent in home-building.

In order for the City to begin processing a request for a Lead Hazard Control grant, the resident OR landlord must complete an "Expression of Interest" form. Forms are available in the City of Warren Community Development office, or reach out to us by phone at (586) 574-4686 or by email at home@cityofwarren.org





The City's Community Development staff will assist applicants by:

- Helping to prepare and file an application
- Advising the applicant of eligibility
- Inspecting the property to determine necessary repairs
- Administering the contractor bidding process
- Reviewing bids with homeowner
- Inspecting the completed work to ensure contract compliance

While applications will typically be reviewed on a first come, first served basis, households featuring a child exhibiting an elevated blood lead level above 5mg/dl will be given priority processing.

NOTE: only owned or rented Single-Family Residences are eligible for the Lead Hazard Control Program Grant For Lead Hazard Control **Grant** Program qualification, the following minimum criteria must be met:

- Applicants must own or rent the home to be rehabilitated; property must be a single-family residence housing (OR expecting to house) at least one pregnant woman or child under age 6
- ❖ If a child under 6 does not occupy the property full time, then a child under 6 must spend a significant amount of time at the home (call for more information)
- The house being rehabilitated **must** be located in the City of Warren and must have been built prior to 1978
- Property must be insured
- Total household income must be below the following income limits for the program as established by The Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD):
