From the Principal:

Hello Pinewood Families,

It's time to kick it in. It's like the end of a race with only four months of school left. Yes, it is hard to believe. Our students came in behind and from looking at the data we are closing the gap, slowly but surely. Our staff and our kids are working hard to make up for that lost time, but working over the summer will still be needed for most! Summer school will be online this year and information will come out soon.

Of course you will hear all about your student and his or her progress at our spring conferences. They will be held Monday, March 28, through Friday, April 2. Most teachers will stay late on Tuesday, March 29 and then not do conferences on that Friday. Watch for an invitation from your teacher to sign up for your conference soon.

It's also time to March into Kindergarten! If you have a student who is ready to become a Panther this year, it's time to register. Or if you know of someone, help us spread the word. We will also have our office open during conferences on Tuesday evening, March 29. We will have computers set up so you can register. That night from 6:00 to 6:30 pm there will be an informational meeting for parents only (sorry, no kids, but they will have an opportunity to meet their teachers and see the classroom in August), followed by a campus tour from 6:30 to 7:00 pm.

Guess what else is coming up soon?! The Smarter Balanced Assessment (SBA) and the Washington Comprehensive Assessment of Science (WCAS). These tests are taken yearly to compare learning across states. It also helps us focus on what skills and standards to focus on for next year. Sample items and practice tests, as well as information about how the writing portion is scored can be <u>found</u> <u>here</u>. I encourage you to go over these resources with your 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders. The testing window for the SBA is March 7 - June 3 and for the WCAS the window is April 11 - June 3. And before we take these amazing assessments, we will enjoy Spring Break. Our break this year is Monday, April 4 through Friday, April 8.

If you are interested, we are ready for volunteers to come back into the school. We also have plans to get Watch D.O.G.S. back up and running. WATCH D.O.G.S. is one of the nation's largest and most respected school-based family and community engagement organizations in the country. Who are WatchDOGS? Fathers, grandfathers, step-fathers, uncles, and other father figures who volunteer to serve at least one day a year in a variety of school activities as assigned by the school principal or other administrator. Lastly, I hope you will join me in learning more about the FACTS of the replacement levy Marysville School District is providing. Levies help cover costs not fully funded by state dollars or Covid dollars. There are so many opportunities and I hope to see you there!

Pinewood Families,

Have you ever had trouble with twisted headphone cords? Annoying right?

That's what our third grade had on their minds as they worked to solve this problem during their STEAM investigation this week. Teams of students are working in groups to design and build headphone cases that also keep cord messes from happening. They had to discuss and try different designs before the build. Each student will make their own case based on the design the group chose. The cases must meet the following criteria and constraints: Ease of use, check! Fit in pocket, check! Keep headphones tangle free, check! Constructed from material provided, check!

Once made, students will also consider the business side of product development. Each will choose a name for his or her business and a price point for the sale of his or her headphone case. Video production experience skills will also be put to the test when students create a commercial for the products filming, sound, and editing will all be done on chromebooks).

Finally, students will be using the powers of persuasion. They are learning how commercials use different types of persuasion to appeal to their market. Using an app called Thinglink, students will create an infographic highlighting the features of their headphone case and why their case is the best one to buy.

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ABSENCES and TARDIES Please call the ATTENDANCE LINE at 360.965.1301

If your student will be absent or late arriving to school for any reason, please call the attendance line. If not answered this line goes directly to voice mail, which makes it available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. When you know in advance that your child has a medical or dental appointment that will keep them out of school or arrive to school late, leave a message at this line. We are able to take the information in advance. If you do not leave a message and your child is not at school, an automated call will go out to attempt contacting you to ensure that your child is safe. Your child will be marked unexcused if contact is not made.. Please help us

by calling in by 9:00 am. When your child is absent, please call or send a note with your child to excuse the absence within 3 days. Your child will also need to make up all work that has been missed during the absence.

Pre-arranged absences for family reasons need prior approval by the principal, provided that the absence will not adversely affect your child's progress in school. Absence approval forms are available in the school office.

If you child arrives at 9:25 or later, please check in at the office for a tardy slip to minimize disturbance in the

classroom.

How Does Your Child Go Home?

There may be days when your child is uncertain of the manner by which they are expected to leave school. Some days a child may be picked up by a parent or other adult and other days they may ride the bus or walk. This may cause some confusion especially as we see the change of weather. An example of such confusion is when it is lightly raining and a student is informed by their parent the student will be picked up when it is raining. It may not be raining where the parent is located and the student waits in the office.

Please help your child know in advance what is expected of them at the end of the school day. It may be a good idea to create a plan with your child, reinforcing each morning how they are to get home.

Of course, emergencies do happen. When the plan changes during the day, the office is happy to send a parent message to the student by 3:00 PM. Our goal is to ensure that your child returns home safely and as quickly as possible.

Student Messages

We are receiving many messages for students concerning end of the day plans. In order to avoid interruption of instructional time, we ask that plans for after school be discussed before school each day. Please keep end of the day messages for emergency changes only!

WELCOME BACK VOLUNTEERS!

We are excited to announce that volunteers will be allowed to work in schools/classrooms starting on March 1, 2022. All volunteers must meet the following requirements in order to be eligible to volunteer:

- Per the Governor's vaccine mandate, all school volunteers are required to show proof of vaccination.
- Volunteers must complete their volunteer packet, including criminal background check (every 2 years). Volunteer applications are available online - click <u>HERE</u>.
- There is an email set up for volunteers to send in their application (<u>volunteer@msd25.org</u>). Since vaccination status will need to be included with the paperwork, it will go directly to the COVID department for processing.

Volunteers will be allowed to work in classrooms at the discretion of the teacher and must follow all DOH Health and Safety Guidelines for schools. Additionally, there may be limits on the number of daily volunteers allowed in a classroom based on physical distancing requirements.

We hope that this is just one of many steps toward a broader sense of normalcy in our schools. It will be great to have parents and families back in our buildings!



Family Access in Skyward (http//family.marysville.wa-k12.net)

Family Access is a great way for parents and guardians to access your child's grades, view attendance, discipline, meal account activity, and update your personal information such as phone numbers or emergency contacts. In some cases, the district will post forms in Family Access that require viewing and/or a signature. Family Access is part of our student data system. Each account is private and viewable only to those who have approved credentials and a login and password. For the protection of our students, this cannot be done over the phone

- Setting up a Family Access Account: In order to set up an account for Family Access, you will need to have an email in your child(rens) records in the data system. This is typically added when you enrolled your child(ren) in school but can become outdated over time. Follow these steps to get connected:
- If you have not provided an email, please contact your child(rens) school office and provide them with parent/guardian email addresses.
- If you have an email but do not have your login information or you need to create an account, go to
 <u>https://www.msd25.org/o/district/page/skyward-family-access--38</u> and choose Family/Student login
 under the resource column.
- Click on the "forgot username or password" link and follow the steps.
- You can also connect to the Family Access App once you have an established account. Search "Family Access" on your smart phone App store.

- Parents must submit a transfer request to have their student attend our school
- Our students are capped at 58 students for each grade level
- We use a Lottery to select the students that attend if we get more requests than spots available

About our educational model:

We believe relationships and routines are important to learning and strive to keep the students with the same teachers through the 6th, 7th and 8th grades

- We strive to connect their education with real-world experiences through field trips
- We feature a core curriculum that requires 3 years of Band, Art, and PE/Health
- At 10th Street, we ask our students to live by a Code of Conduct that encourages Respectful, Responsible and Ready (the 3-R's) behavior
- Students can still participate in athletics through their home middle school
- District transportation to and from school is provided
