






ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY






ELL ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY

These regulations recognize the importance of engaging students' interests in rigorous and relevant academic programs in the Arts; Languages other than English (LOTE)/Biliteracy; Career and Technical Education (CTE); Humanities; Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM); Civic Readiness (CIVIC) and Career Developmental Occupational Studies (CDOS). The revised regulation allows students to use a passing score on an approved pathway assessment or successful completion of program requirements for the CDOS credential toward meeting the assessment requirements for graduation.



ELMONT MEMORIAL HIGH SCHOOL ENROLLMENT (2021 - 22)








ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY

These regulations recognize the importance of engaging students' interests in rigorous and relevant academic programs in the Arts; Languages other than English (LOTE)/Biliteracy; Career and Technical Education (CTE); Humanities; Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM); Civic Readiness (CIVIC) and Career Developmental Occupational Studies (CDOS). The revised regulation allows students to use a passing score on an approved pathway assessment or successful completion of program requirements for the CDOS credential toward meeting the assessment requirements for graduation.






ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY

H FRANK CAREY HIGH SCHOOL ENROLLMENT (2021 - 22)








ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY

The Board of Regents approved regulations establishing multiple, comparably rigorous assessment pathways to graduation for all students. These regulations recognize the importance of engaging students' interests in rigorous and relevant academic programs in the Arts; Languages other than English (LOTE)/Biliteracy; Career and Technical Education (CTE); Humanities; Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM); Civic Readiness (CIVIC) and Career Developmental Occupational Studies (CDOS). The revised regulation allows students to use a passing score on an approved pathway assessment or successful completion of program requirements for the CDOS credential toward meeting the assessment requirements for graduation.



NEW HYDE PARK MEMORIAL HIGH SCHOOL ENROLLMENT (2021 - 22)








ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY

The Board of Regents approved regulations establishing multiple, comparably rigorous assessment pathways to graduation for all students. These regulations recognize the importance of engaging students' interests in rigorous and relevant academic programs in the Arts; Languages other than English (LOTE)/Biliteracy; Career and Technical Education (CTE); Humanities; Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM); Civic Readiness (CIVIC) and Career Developmental Occupational Studies (CDOS). The revised regulation allows students to use a passing score on an approved pathway assessment or successful completion of program requirements for the CDOS credential toward meeting the assessment requirements for graduation.



SEWANHAKA HIGH SCHOOL ENROLLMENT (2021 - 22)








ENROLLMENT BY ETHNICITY



GRADES 3-8 ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS RESULTS (2021-22)



These regulations recognize the importance of engaging students' interests in rigorous and relevant academic programs in the Arts; Languages other than English (LOTE)/Biliteracy; Career and Technical Education (CTE); Humanities; Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM); Civic Readiness (CIVIC) and Career Developmental Occupational Studies (CDOS). The revised regulation allows students to use a passing score on an approved pathway assessment or successful completion of program requirements for the CDOS credential toward meeting the assessment requirements for graduation.
