Determining Income Eligibility

Acceptable documentation of income shall include a copy of one of the following:

- A month's worth of paystubs dated within the past 30 days
- W-2 forms (current or previous year)
- Income Tax forms (current or previous year)
- Schedule C or Schedule F (for self-employed current or previousyear)
- Free and reduced lunch form showing income amount if verified by school district
- Documentation from DHS caseworker showing family gross income is less than 200% FPL
- Signed and notarized statement that the parent has zero income
- A month's worth of unemployment stubs

In a two-parent household, BOTH incomes must be verified. If one parent is not employed at the time of enrollment, then the following can be used to document zero income:

- Jointly filed tax forms
- A signed, notarized statement of zero income from the nonemployed parent plus income documentation on employed parent

You must verify the income of stepparents who are living in the home.

The following cannot be used as income documentation:

- Child Support
- Social Security payments
- Disability payments If this is the only income a parent receives, then they must submit another form of income verification, such as a signed, notarized statement.

Acceptable documentation of age is a copy of the birth certificate or other official record of age. If the child does not have a birth certificate, please the guidelines of the local district in such instances.

Age-eligible children who fall into one of the following categories are incomeexempt and automatically qualify, if the parent/guardian supplies satisfactory documentation from the list below

- Foster child (at time of enrollment) a. Court record b. Documentation from DHS
- Child has incarcerated parent (during child's lifetime)
 - a. Law enforcement
 - b. Court document
 - c. Documentation from Department of Corrections website
- Child Support
- Child is in the custody of or living with family member other than father or mother (at time of enrollment)
 - a. Court record
 - b. Documentation from DHS
 - c. Notarized statement from family member that the child is living with them and neither parent is residing in the home.
- Child has immediate family member arrested for or convicted of drug-related offenses (within the lifetime of the child)
 - a. Law enforcement
 - b. Court document
 - c. Documentation from Department of Corrections website
 - d. Newspaper article
- Child has parent activated for (may be stateside /out of state or overseas, and must be a minimum of 30 days duration) overseas military duty (at time of enrollment)
 - a. Deployment Orders
 - b. Letter from Department of Defense notifying that parent will be deployed follow your local school district's policy in this matter.
