PENDER PUBLIC SCHOOL BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING MINUTES

Pender Public Schools – Room #305 June 11, 2018 – 7:00 p.m.

The Pender Public School Board of Education met in regular session in Room 305 on Monday, June 11, 2018. President Matt Peters called the meeting to order at 7:08 p.m. with the following members present: Jason Roth, Dan Wichman, Matt Peters, Jean Karlen and Matt Heineman. Absent: JJ Maise. Also present were Superintendent Jason Dolliver, Secondary Principal Eric Miller, Elementary Principal/SPED Director Kelly Ballinger and Recording Secretary Deanna Hansen.

As required by Nebraska Statute 84-1412(8), President Peters drew the attention of those present to the location of information regarding the Open Meetings Act posted in the meeting room and accessible to all members of the public.

President Peters reviewed the agenda as presented, affirmed that every board member had received notice of the meeting, and confirmed that the time and place of the meeting had been published or posted as required by Board Policy 8342.

A motion was made by Roth, and seconded by Heineman to approve the agenda as presented. President Peters stated the motion and the result of roll call vote being all ayes; motion carried.

Motion to approve the minutes of the regular Board meeting held on May 14, 2018 was made by Heineman and seconded by Wichman. President Peters stated the motion and the result of roll call vote being all ayes; motion carried.

A motion to approve financial reports as presented and payment of bills as follows: General Fund - \$274,936.90; School Nutrition Fund - \$11,589.91; Activity Fund - \$22,360.81; and Payroll - \$180,862.67 was made by Wichman, seconded by Roth. President Peters stated the motion and the result of roll call vote being all ayes; motion carried.

Board member Maise arrived at 7:28 p.m.

Secondary Principal Eric Miller, Elementary Principal/Special Education Director Kelly Ballinger and Superintendent Jason Dolliver presented their administrative reports. Following Administrator Reports, the board took a short break to tour the progress of summer projects including the art room cabinetry, nurses room cabinetry, distance learning room remodel, old gym scoreboards, new elementary carpet and the north parking lot.

Dr. Dolliver presented a plaque to Matt Heineman for 10 years of service as a coach, and thanked him for his service to the District.

President Peters implemented the Procedures for Public Comment. No one took advantage of the opportunity to address the Board.

Extended contracts for additional days beyond a regular 185-day teaching contract were considered for the FFA advisor, guidance counselor and media instructor. Board members discussed the length of each extended contract and benefits provided through the additional days. Mr. Dolliver recommended that the board approve the 2018-2019 extended contracts for the FFA advisor, guidance counselor and media instructor.

A motion was made by Wichman, and seconded by Roth to approve extended contracts as presented for the 2018-2019 school year as follows: 1) FFA Advisor – 15 days; 2) Media Instructor – 10 days; and 3) School Counselor – 10 days; at a total cost to District of \$12,942.39. President Peters stated the motion and the result of roll call vote being all ayes; motion carried.

Tech Director Jennifer Davis asked if she could hire an hourly employee to help complete some of the tasks needed over the summer. Dr. Dolliver shared his support of this need and recommended approval of hiring a part-time hourly employee.

A motion was made by Wichman and seconded by Heineman to approve the 2018 summer work agreement with Isaac Davis for part-time technology help. President Peters stated the motion and the result of roll call vote being all ayes; motion carried.

Superintendent Dolliver informed Board members that Kelly Schrunk was offered and accepted the elementary teaching position available for the 2018-19 school year. Schrunk also submitted her letter of resignation effective June 1, 2019. Schrunk is essentially hired on an interim basis to make sure it is a good fit for her and the District. If it is a good fit, the District would move forward as we would with any other position, and if not, we will work to hire someone permanently for the 2019-20 school year. Dr. Dolliver recommended approval of the probationary teaching contract as presented as well as accepting Schrunk's letter of resignation.

A motion was made by Roth and seconded by Heineman to approve the probationary contract for an elementary position for the 2018-2019 school year. President Peters stated the motion and the result of roll call vote being all ayes; motion carried.

A motion was made by Heineman and seconded by Roth to accept the letter of resignation from Kelly Schrunk, effective June 1, 2019. President Peters stated the motion and the result of roll call vote being all ayes; motion carried.

Superintendent Dolliver presented a list of items identified as surplus. Using Board Policy 3090, Board members reviewed the list as presented. Mr. Dolliver recommended declaring the list as surplus and authorizing the sale or disposition of those items.

A motion was made by Wichman, and seconded by Maise to declare the list of items presented as surplus and authorize their disposition as provided through Board Policy 3090. President Peters stated the motion and the result of roll call vote being all ayes; motion carried.

Members of the Policy Committee met with Superintendent Dolliver to review new and amended policy provided by legal counsel as a result of the recent legislative session. As a result of the review, Board Policy #1102, 3570, 4003, 5101, 5401, 5402, 5403, 5406, 6212, 6213, 6410 and 8231 were presented for first reading approval. In addition, Administrative Regulation 5418.1 was presented for consideration. Mr. Dolliver recommended approval of first reading of the amended policies and approval of the amended Administrative Regulation.

A motion was made by Wichman, and seconded by Karlen to approve first reading of Board Policy #1102, 3570, 4003, 5101, 5401, 5402, 5403, 5406, 6212, 6213, 6410 and 8231 as amended. President Peters stated the motion and the result of roll call vote being all ayes; motion carried.

A motion was made by Karlen and seconded by Maise to approve Administrative Regulation 5418.1 as amended. President Peters stated the motion and the result of roll call vote being all ayes; motion carried.

Karlen reported that the bi-annual Policy board review had been completed. There were no changes in the 7000's.

A P2T Board Meeting will be held June 18, 7:00 pm at Bancroft. President Peters reminded Board members of the Alumni Omelet breakfast scheduled for June 23 from 8-10 a.m. Board members indicated their availability to assist with the Alumni Omelet breakfast. A School Board Candidate Forum is also available either July 12 in Kearney or July 26 at ESU3. The next regular meeting is scheduled for July 16, beginning at 7:00 p.m.

A motion to adjourn was made by Wichman and seconded by Roth. President Peters stated the motion and the result of the vote being all ayes the meeting was adjourned at 9:29 p.m.
