Superintendent Report

Good News Report

Supt. Bailey congratulated the KWLPG Wrestling team and coaches for their remarkable season and state tournament performances. The team ended the regular season with a 16-0 dual record and placed 2nd in the individual/team and team dual state tournament. The individual state placers included: Grayson Hanson-1st 152 lbs., Kiana Major-Shevling-1st 142 lbs., Chase Varilek- 2nd 138 lbs., and Kasen Konstanz- 3rd 120 lbs.

Abigail DeKam, Joseph Kuipers and Luanna Kuipers were congratulated for being selected to play in the SDSU Honor Band Festival.

Superintendent Report

Advertisement for bids for the elementary and high school renovations and secured entry at the elementary are running in this week and next week's issues of the Platte Enterprise and Charles Mix County News. There will be a meeting and building walk-through on Thursday, March 10 for contractors that are interested in bidding the jobs. Sealed bids are due on Friday, March 18, 2022 at 2 pm, with the bid opening to begin at 2:05 pm. Board members and the public are welcome to attend the bid opening.

A flow test revealed that there is not ample water pressure to operate the sprinkler system that will be installed in the high school building due to fire code. A change order for the civil engineer will be necessary to run a 6-inch water line through the shop. The approximate cost is \$4,000.00.

Equipment for the renovations at the high school are on the way and are expected to arrive in May. There are some concerns with the lead times on the steel beams for the secured entrance at the elementary.

Supt. Bailey attended AASA's National Conference on Education on February 16-19. The highlight was the preview of the Early Childhood & Learning Toolkit which was a culmination of the work put in by the Early Learning Cohort. Supt. Bailey attended several breakout sessions and brought back new ideas for the district, one of which is Wonder Media's Story Maker for the STEAM classes. Story Maker has three different programs that combine the writing process with teaching digital animation. Supt. Bailey has a

conference call with the program creator on Wednesday March 2. He also plans to follow up with representatives from the Cook Center for Human Connection regarding more support for social emotional learning.

Supt. Bailey gave an update on several House Bills pertaining to education. Monday, March 7th, is the last day for a bill to pass both Houses and Veto Day is set for March 28th. The Governor's 6% recommended increase to K-12 education funding is currently in good standing with most legislators.

Business Manager Report

The Impact Aid and SRSA Applications have been completed and submitted.

Four petitions were submitted to the office by the February 25th deadline. Those on the ballot will be Dennis DeBoer, Tom Olsen, Roxanne Summerville, and Heather VanDerWerff. The election will be held on April 12th at the Community Building in Platte and at the American Legion in Geddes. The drawing for the candidate order on the ballot will be on Tuesday, March 8th at 10:00 a.m.

K. Holter will be attending the NAFIS Conference in Washington DC on March 12-16.

Secondary Principal Report

The week of February 28th through March 4th was dedicated as FFA Week. Students and staff put in a lot of time and effort to hold activities including the petting zoo, Ag. Olympics, tractor day, and a hat day fundraiser for former PG graduate, Houston Lamm.

The National Honor Society will be conducting their induction ceremony on March 21st in the Lyric Theatre at 7:30 P.M.

Mr. Frederick will be joining approximately 20 Platte-Geddes juniors and seniors on March 22nd through March 25th as they embark on a trip of a lifetime to Washington D.C., Mt. Vernon, and Gettysburg for a student and parent educational visit.

Elementary Principal Report

The district will hold its annual Kindergarten Screening and Roundup for incoming Kindergarten students on Monday, March 28, 2022. All incoming Kindergarten students will be screened, and parents will be given a recommendation on each child's readiness for a Kindergarten program. During the screening, areas of potential disabilities in academics and motor skills will also be assessed. The screening will be held at Trinity Lutheran Church. Mrs. Knecht urged anyone that has a child who will be turning 5 by September 1, 2022, to please contact Platte-Geddes Elementary to schedule a screening.

A team of four from Platte-Geddes Elementary represented the district at the ESEA Conference in New Orleans, LA. They were honored as a National Distinguished School at the conference and were able to attend a couple of special events because of the distinction. The entire conference was outstanding as was the trip to NOLA. Platte-Geddes Elementary has also been invited to send a team of five teachers to the CCSSO National Conference on Student Assessment in Atlanta, GA in June of 2022.

Mrs. Knecht informed the board of some damage to the elementary school building over the weekend. Platte-Geddes Elementary was host to an AAU Youth Wrestling Tournament. Two doors were damaged, some equipment had been tampered with, and the facility was left a mess. The district is more than willing to share their facilities with others, however there are expectations that the buildings are treated with respect and returned in the condition in which they were lent.
