Inspiration in Education - Jessica Duff

Jessica Duff, Executive Director of Communications, presented the Inspiration in Education award to Tracy Bailey, Instructional Coach, at Robinson Elementary School.

NWEA MAP Testing - Dr. Alesia Smith

Dr. Smith gave the board an update on MAP testing, the State's interim assessment tool, which measures the academic growth of students. She stated that students take these assessments three times a year and the start of the school year, in the winter and again in the spring. Dr. Smith shared that the purpose of the testing is to give students what they need assistance with or to be challenged on and is driven by data. She also shared that the data is looking good and that celebrations will begin toward the end of the month. Dr. Smith closed by stating that every school with growth data would be celebrated next month.

Judge Marshall's Latest Ruling - Devin Bates

Mr. Bates provided an update to the Board on Judge Marshall's latest ruling regarding facilities. He shared the history of the case with the new board members. Mr. Bates stated that the Judge had approved the Facilities Proposal, which included 10 additional classrooms, improvements to the ROTC building, a softball field and a 2200 person arena at Mills High School. He added that the District was obligated to pay attorney's fees for the Intervenors and after attempts to negotiate the Judge awarded fees in the amount of \$325,000 to be paid over a 12 month period. Mr. Bates added that the Intervenors rejected the ruling and has filed a motion to reconsider.
