

New Jersey Graduation Proficiency Assessment



Q: What is it?

A: The NJGPA is an assessment that will be given to all 11th grade students in English and Math.

Q: When am I taking it?

A: From March 14-March 18. You have to be at school normal time. Don't be late these days.

Q: What does it look like?

A: There are *three* units in English & two units in Math. Each unit is 90 minutes and you will be taking one per day.

Q: What am I being tested on?

A: In English: skills you learned in high school English thus far; in Math: Algebra I and Geometry.

Q: Do I have to take it?

A: Yes. In order to graduate, you have to take the test. The test is scored between 650-850. 750 is considered passing.

Q: What happens if I don't pass?

A: There are other avenues to graduate, but this is the most straightforward one. If you don't pass and you haven't met any other avenue, you will be enrolled in a skills class next year to complete the portfolio.

Q: What room and I testing in?

A: Testing room assignments will be posted a week before the test.

Q: Anything else I should know?

A: Put yourself in a position to be successful—eat breakfast and bring something to drink.
