SAT at Lancaster High School

Tuesday, April 26, 2022

Lancaster is administering the SAT on **Tuesday, April 26** during the school day. This is the only administration we are hosting this spring. Q: Who can take the SAT on Tuesday, April 26?

A: This testing is for Lancaster Juniors (seniors may test too).

Q: What is the deadline for letting Mrs. Hutchens know if you are (or if you are not) planning to take the SAT with us this spring?

A: Monday, March 21st

Q: How do I RSVP? (If I am, or am not, planning to take the SAT in April.)

Q: How do I sign up for the April 26 SAT?

A: The sign-up process is different from that of the usual Saturday SAT testing. You do **not** sign up through your College Board account. If you are interested, please make sure you fill out the survey (link above) by Monday, March 21, 2022.

Q: Do I need to take the SAT?

A: Please check the individual websites for any colleges you are interested in applying to. Some colleges are not requiring SATs for their application process, others are.

Q: Is Lancaster giving the SAT at any other time this school year?

A: No, the Tuesday, April 26 testing session is the last SAT Lancaster HS is giving this school year.

Q: What if I need to take the SAT and can't do the Tuesday, April 26 test session?

A: You can sign up for a Saturday testing session at one of the area schools. Testing dates, deadlines, locations, etc. can be found at collegeboard.org.

Q: How do I pay for the April School Day test?

A: Payments are handled through the school, *not through College Board*. You can pay with a check payable to Lancaster High School or cash (exact amount, please).

- Q: How much does it cost to take the April 26 SAT?
- A: It depends:

Answer #1: \$55 **OR** Answer #2: \$8.00 (if you qualify under one of the criteria listed below):

You're eligible for fee waivers if you say "yes" to any of the following:

- You're enrolled in or eligible to participate in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP).
- Your annual family income falls within the Income Eligibility Guidelines set by the USDA Food and Nutrition Service.
- You're enrolled in a federal, state, or local program that aids students from low-income families (e.g., Federal TRIO programs such as Upward Bound).
- Your family receives public assistance.
- You live in federally subsidized public housing or a foster home, or are homeless.
- You are a ward of the state or an orphan.
