Stratford Public Schools Social Studies Curriculum Grade 2 – Unit 1

Synopsis: Students will learn about historical individuals, holidays, and events and the importance of each one.

*Constitution Day is September 17th. Federal law mandates that on this day students learn about the U.S. Constitution.

- Create and share in-class artwork on a social studies topic [e.g. holidays, people, events]
- Participate in classroom discussions.
