Riverside Community School District will remain open, if at all possible, on all scheduled school days, even when weather conditions may be extreme in the belief that it is in the best interest of the students. The District is concerned about the safety of all students, staff and patrons. We encourage everyone to use caution traveling safely to and from our schools and buildings. Please know that parents can keep children home when weather is extreme. Schools understand and respect this decision and will work with families. Remember, no announcement means normal school operation. School closure or delayed start information will always be posted no later than 6:00 a.m. on the Riverside Community Schools website at riversideschools.org, through social media and local news outlets.

3. Keep Phones Accessible

Phones will be used for emergencies; therefore, parents are asked not to call the schools or the District.

4. Closures Posted on the Web and Social Media

School closure information will be posted by 6 a.m. on Riverside Community School District website at riversideschools.org, District Facebook Page, District Twitter account, Superintendent Facebook Page and Superintendent Twitter account.

5. Phone, E-mail and Text Notification

Parents will also receive a text, e-mail, phone call from our automated Student Information System (JMC). It is important that parent contact information is updated on a regular basis to make sure you receive this notification.

6. Authorized Statements

The media will only announce school closures when authorized by the Superintendent or his designee after he has consulted with the Transportation Coordinator the National Weather Service, other area schools and other state, county and city agencies.

7. Closures for One Day Only

All announcements are for one day only.

8. Normal Operation

No announcement means normal operation.

9. Parents Need an Emergency Plan

Parents are encouraged to establish an emergency plan for their children in the event that schools are closed, start late or are dismissed early. Parents should instruct their children where to go or what to do if a parent is not at home.

10. Bus Stops

On severe weather days, understand that buses may be running late due to road conditions and/or traffic delays. Please watch for email, phone or text messages regarding delayed bus routes. Parents are asked to wait with and/or meet their students at bus stops when buses are running on delayed or emergency schedules.

11. Make-up Days

Whether or not the day will be made-up once canceled will be determined by the Superintendent.

12. Late Start

When the District has designated a school day as "Schools Will Start Late," the expectation is that employees will arrive at their schools/departments based upon the amount of time the delay has been announced , or as soon as they can arrive safely.







Building Progress-Sports Complex

The top dressing and laser grading has been completed. The outfield sod has been installed on both fields. The infield sod on the baseball field has also been completed. The pitcher's mound and home plate have been completed on the baseball field. The softball infield, baseball infield, warning tracks on both fields will be completed early next spring prior to the start of the season. We will be purchasing and storing the sound system equipment until early spring. They will be back to do the install prior to the start of the season. The Construction Trades classes are completing the platforms for the Scorer and Announcer for both fields. The Bleachers, Batting Cage and Memorial Rock from the old field will be moved soon.

Building Progress-Safe Room Addition

They are in the final stages of completing the building. Final inspections are completed and Anderson Construction is addressing the Punch List for the project. We are on schedule for our December completion date.



From October 24th through October 27th, seven Riverside FFA members traveled to Indianapolis, Indiana to attend the 90th annual National FFA Convention & Expo. Students traveled on a charter bus with three area chapters: the Audubon FFA, the Exira-EHK FFA, and the Harlan FFA.

The National FFA Convention & Expo is a premier leadership conference that nearly 62,000 FFA members from all 50 states, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands attend in Indianapolis each October. Riverside School Improvement Advisory Meets (Lisa Putnam)

The Riverside School Improvement Advisory Committee met on Monday, November 6, at the Carson Community Building. Over 20 people attended the meeting, including parents, students, school board members, teachers, support staff, and community members. The purpose of SIAC is to make a recommendation to the school board after looking at district data. Based on the committee members' analysis of the data, they provide input to the board of education regarding educational needs, student learning goals, desired level of student performance, and harassment or bullying prevention goals or programs. The SIAC makes decisions to benefit Riverside students and the school district as a whole and is a very valuable component of the school improvement process.

Dr. Mitchell welcomed the committee and then presented information regarding the purpose of SIAC, superintendent goals, instructional focus update, Riverside's 2017-2018 enrollment and enrollment trends. He also presented the Riverside District Wellness Program. Dr. Mitchell discussed the progress being made with the We R Riverside branding and marketing, and two high school students presented how the yearbook staff is also incorporating the We R Riverside theme into the 2017-2018 yearbook. The committee also looked at the results of the Needs Assessment which yielded positive results in the areas of school safety, emphasis on reading and math, and use of technology at school. Areas that appear to need improvement include respectful behavior by students, discipline, and communication. Iowa Assessment data was also presented; the committee looked at percentage of students who scored proficient in the areas of reading, math, science, and social studies. The SIAC committee members also looked at and discussed college and career readiness scores.




WELLNESS POLICY

The Riverside Community School District Board of Education is committed to the optimal development of every student. The board believes for students to have the opportunity to achieve personal, academic, developmental, and social success, there needs to be a positive, safe, and health-promoting learning environment at every level, in every setting.

The school district provides a comprehensive learning environment for developing and practicing lifelong wellness behaviors. The entire school environment, not just the classroom, shall be aligned with healthy school district goals to positively influence a student's understanding, beliefs and habits as they relate to good nutrition and regular physical activity. In accordance with law and this belief, the board commits to the following:

The school district will identify at least one goal in each of the following areas:

- **Nutrition Education and Promotion:** Schools will provide nutrition education and engage in nutrition promotion that helps students develop lifelong healthy eating behaviors.
- **Physical Activity:** Schools will provide students with age and grade appropriate opportunities to engage in physical activity that meet the Iowa Healthy Kids Act.
- **Other School Based Activities that Promote Wellness:** As appropriate, schools will support students, staff, and parents' efforts to maintain a healthy lifestyle.

The following nutritional guidelines for food available on school campuses will be adhered to:

- Meals served through the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Program will be appealing and meet, at a minimum, nutrition requirements established by state and federal law;
- Schools providing access to healthy foods outside the reimbursable meal programs before school, during school and thirty minutes after school shall meet the United States Department of Agriculture ("USDA") Smart Snacks in Schools nutrition standards, at a minimum. This includes such items as those sold through a la carte lines, vending machines, student run stores, and fundraising activities;
- Snacks provided to students during the school day without charge (e.g., class parties) will meet standards set by the district in accordance law. The district will provide parents a list of foods and beverages that meet nutrition standards for classroom snacks and celebrations; and
- Schools will only allow marketing and advertising of foods and beverages that meet the Smart Snacks in school nutritional standards on campus during the school day.

The superintendent or superintendent's designee shall implement and ensure compliance with the policy by:

- Reviewing the policy at least every three years and recommending updates as appropriate for board approval;
- Implementing a process for permitting parents, students, representatives of the school food authority, teachers of physical education, school health professionals, the school board, administrators and the public to participate in the development, implementation, and periodic review and update of the policy;
- Making the policy and updated assessment of the implementation available to the public (e.g., posting on the website, newsletters, etc). This information shall include the extent to which the schools are in compliance with policy and a description of the progress being made in attaining the goals of the policy; and
- Developing administrative regulations, which shall include specific wellness goals and indicators for measurement of progress consistent with law and district policy.

Our school is participating in an important district initiative. It is called Positive Behavior Support (PBIS).

What is Positive Behavior Intervention and Support?

PBIS is a process for creating safer and more effective schools. It is a systems approach to enhancing the capacity of schools to educate all children by developing research-based, school-wide, and classroom behavior support systems. The process focuses on improving a school's ability to teach and support positive behavior for all students. Rather than a prescribed program, PBIS provides systems for schools to design, implement, and evaluate effective school-wide, classroom, non-classroom, and student specific plans. PBIS includes school-wide procedures and processes intended for all students and all staff in all settings. PBIS is not a program or a curriculum. It is a team-based process for systemic problem solving, planning, and evaluation. It is an approach to creating a safe and productive learning environment where teachers can teach and all students can learn.

We have adopted a unified set of classroom rules. These rules define our expectations for behavior in our school. You will see these rules posted throughout the school and your child will be learning them during his or her first days at school. As part of our PBIS process, teachers and other staff members use evidence-based practices to increase student learning and decrease classroom disruptions.

If you have questions about Positive Behavior Intervention and Support, please feel free to contact your child's teacher. We look forward to a wonderful year of teaching your child.
