Parents of 6th and 11th Grade Students

Get ready for 2018-19. Students entering the 7th and 12th grades are required to have immunizations to start school. There is no grace period for these boosters; they must be completed before the 1st day of attendance for the '18-'19 school year.

1. Students entering 7th grade and above must have a 1 time dose of tetanus/diphtheria/acellular pertussis-containing vaccine (Tdap), if born after September 15, 2000; regardless of the interval since the last tetanus/diphtheria-containing vaccine.
2. Students entering 7th grade and above must have 1 dose of meningococcal if born after September 15, 2004; and 2 doses of meningococcal vaccines for the applicant in 12th grade, if born after September 15, 1999; or 1 dose if received when the applicant is 16 years of age or older.

Interpretation: Incoming 7th graders need a Tdap and a meningitis shot. Incoming 12th graders need a meningitis shot, if they had the meningitis vaccine before 16 years of age they need a booster!

We request these be completed and to Mrs. Palmer by May 22, 2018 for records to be updated and no interruption to a student's education. If you have any questions contact Vicki Palmer RN at one of the schools or by email vpalmer@riverside.k12.ia.us

Determining if a Student Should Attend School When Sick

Riverside Community School District Hall of Fame

Building Progress-Safe Room Addition

The furniture has arrived and we have a certificate of occupancy. The space is currently being utilized. Final inspections and Substantial Completion are to be completed soon.

Transition Planning for the 2018-2019 School year

We have been working on the initial parts of the Transition Plan for the 2018-2019 school year. This includes moving 6th Grade to the new Safe Room Addition at the JHS and moving 3rd Grade to the Intermediate School in Carson. We are in the process of collecting issues and concerns from the staff and the public. Watch for the scheduling of a Public Meeting this spring.

Riverside Continuous Improvement Plan

Administration, District Leadership Team and the Teacher Quality Committee have started discussion on the development of a Riverside Community School District Continuous Improvement Plan. We will focus on developing specific activities in the areas of:

Bridges (Susan Berndt, Kara Plagman)

Here are some pictures of the 6th grade Inca suspension bridges. Our compelling question was: What allowed the Inca Empire to become the largest empire to ever exist in the Americas? That question led us to a supporting question: What engineering techniques did the Inca Empire use to build their massive empire? This question led to the study of the engineering the Inca roads and bridges. The students learned the techniques (twisting, braiding, and tying) the Inca's use to build suspension bridges. The students used these techniques to make their own bridges out of newspapers. Their challenge was to see who could build the strongest bridge that spanned a distance of 24 inches. 7 teams bridges held the following weight. 6 big washers, 1 small washer, 185 pennies, 1 hand sanitizer bottle (12 oz.) 1 D battery, and two 2 scientific calculators.

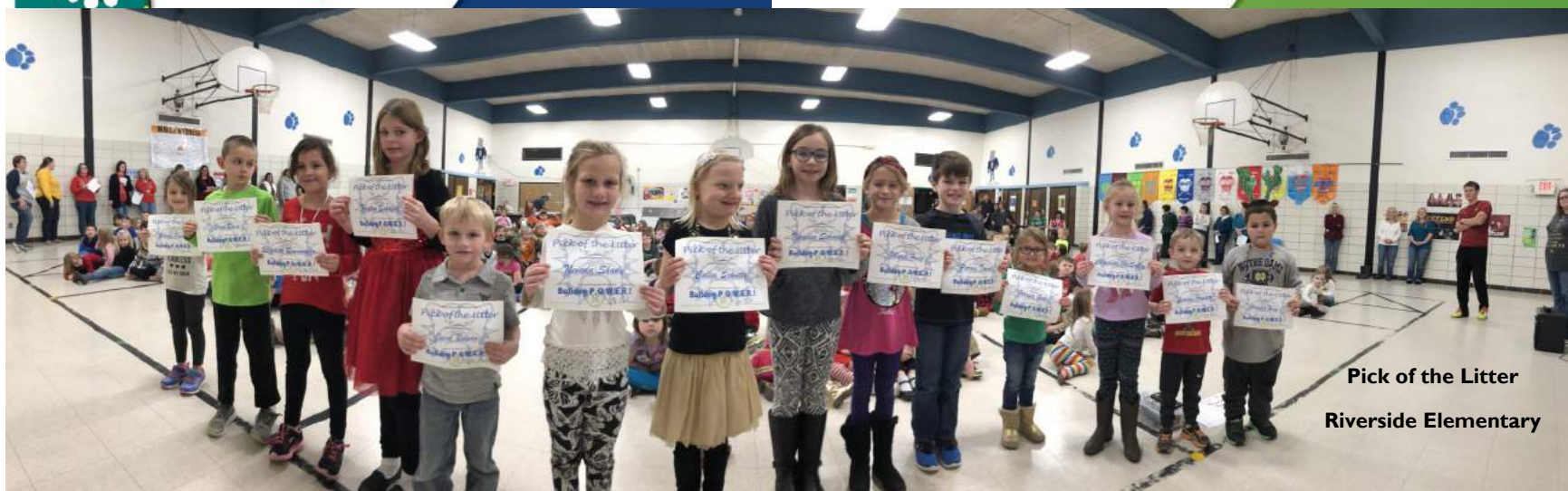

Almost every month at the bottom of my newsletter article I have something about keeping communication open with you and your child’s teacher(s). Here are some of the examples that I have used in the past:

Please do not wait until the Parent-Teacher conferences to ask questions about your child’s progress in academics or maybe some behaviors that you are seeing at home that might also be occurring at school. For 4th-6th grade students, you can see grades as they are entered into our system via the JMC Parent Access portal at, <https://riversideschools.onlinejmc.com/>, click on the Parent icon, enter your username and password and you can see grades. The more staff and families that are on the same page, the more successful a student will be.

One last unrelated note: Please do not wait until the Spring Parent-Teacher conferences to ask questions about your child’s progress in academics and/or behaviors that you may have concerns about. Riverside staff works hard to connect with you as often as possible; we discuss often as a staff how crucial this is, but their days are packed full just like yours and mine. Our children are our most important assets, so take some time and email, call, or drop in and have a conversation about how we can all have the best school experience possible.

Before coming to the parent-teacher conferences, make a plan about what you are going to discuss with your child’s teachers. Think about things that your child has come home from school talking to you about... Are there concerns that they have expressed to you? Are you not getting information from your children about school and need to set up a plan to have more communication with their teacher? What do you want to see your child complete and move forward with by the end of the year? If you make a plan ahead of time, you have a better chance of asking those things at the conference.

There is a lot more to school than just academics and many of those non-academic things can affect the academics. Having an open dialogue with your child’s teacher(s) is the best way to make changes if there are issues or asking about a chance to push your child farther. Use email or make phone calls to teachers to be the best informed that you can be.

Riverside Community Schools Winter Weather Procedures and Guidelines

With the arrival of winter weather season it is time to remind everyone about the procedures and guidelines regarding snow/weather closures or delays. Riverside Community School District will remain open, if at all possible, on all scheduled school days, even when weather conditions may be extreme in the belief that it is in the best interest of the students. The District is concerned about the safety of all students, staff and patrons. We encourage everyone to use caution traveling safely to and from our schools and buildings. Please know that parents can keep children home when weather is extreme. Schools understand and respect this decision and will work with families. Remember, no announcement means normal school operation. School closure or delayed start information will always be posted no later than 6:00 a.m. on the Riverside Community Schools website at riversideschools.org, through social media and local news outlets.

On occasion, weather may be so extreme the District will close schools or implement a late start or early dismissal. The following information outlines the communication procedures that will be followed if such school closures or delays become necessary.

1. Media Announcements

Parents and employees should listen to these designated radio or television stations for school closure information between the hours of 5:30-8:00 AM (If schools dismiss early, the media will air the announcement as soon as possible.)

2. Listen for One of These Messages

- "Schools Will Dismiss Early" (day and date)

3. Keep Phones Accessible

Phones will be used for emergencies; therefore, parents are asked not to call the schools or the District.

4. Closures Posted on the Web and Social Media

School closure information will be posted by 6 a.m. on Riverside Community School District website at riversideschools.org, District Facebook Page, District Twitter account, Superintendent Facebook Page and Superintendent Twitter account.

5. Phone, E-mail and Text Notification

Parents will also receive a text, e-mail, phone call from our automated Student Information System (JMC). It is important that parent contact information is updated on a regular basis to make sure you receive this notification.

6. Authorized Statements

The media will only announce school closures when authorized by the Superintendent or his designee after he has consulted with the Transportation Coordinator the National Weather Service, other area schools and other state, county and city agencies.

7. Closures for One Day Only

All announcements are for one day only.

8. Normal Operation

No announcement means normal operation.

9. Parents Need an Emergency Plan

Parents are encouraged to establish an emergency plan for their children in the event that schools are closed, start late or are dismissed early. Parents should instruct their children where to go or what to do if a parent is not at home.

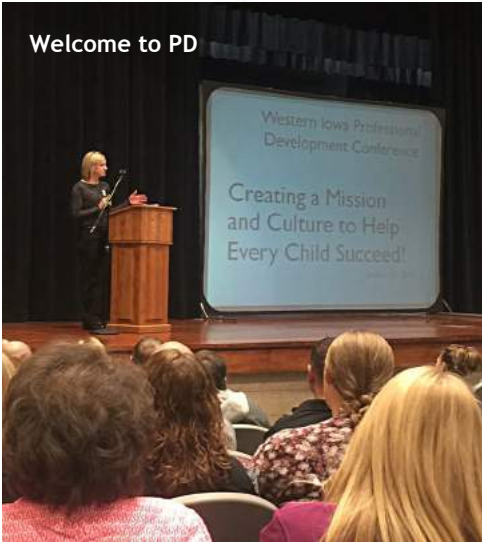

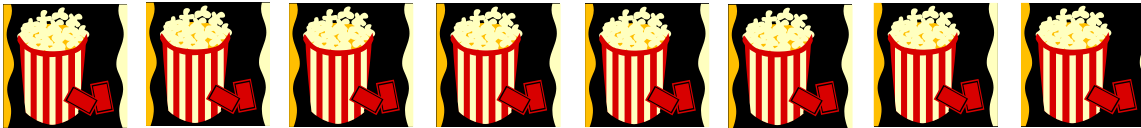
