The staff and students of Riverside Community Schools thank you, our patrons, for your continued support throughout this past school year!

What Do I Need to Turn In??

As we head toward the 2018-2019 school year it is time to get paperwork ready to turn in. The following is a list of paperwork that comes to the school nurse by school registration.

1. PreSchool- list of the child's immunizations, a physical and a copy of their birth certificate.
2. Kindergarten-list of the child's immunizations including kindergarten boosters, a physical and a copy of the child's birth certificate if not on file from preschool, dental screening form, and vision screening form.
3. 7th grade-required tetanus (tdap) booster and 1 dose of meningococcal vaccine.
4. 7th through 12th grades-athletic physical if going to play school sports and a concussion form. (Parents please be sure to sign the physical.)
5. 9th grade- dental screening form.
6. 12th grade-one dose of meningococcal vaccine.

Please note that the meningococcal vaccinations required in 7th and 12th grade were new for the 2017-18 school year.

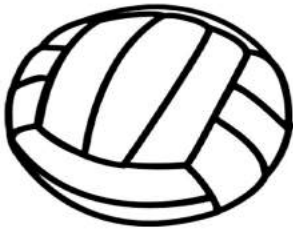

"History and Me" Day Camp at Nishna Heritage Museum

Oakland, Iowa

Soon, school is out. With summer break a few weeks away, children will have more time to use their imagination. Playing school or cowboys and Indians or dressing up as movie stars. Creative moments like these can be experienced at the Nishna Heritage Museum in Oakland, Iowa during the summer day camp series. Gayle Strickland, volunteer and member of Oakland Historical Society, developed the museum day camp idea to interest children and families in this "hidden gem" in Oakland. Participants can escape back in time and learn about the people, the landscape, and Iowa's past, in five different, enrichment camps. Nishna Heritage Museum is partnering with Golden Hills RC&D to provide these day camps for kindergarten to six graders, each Tuesday morning in June and the first Tuesday in July from **9:00-10:30 am**. Below is the day camp schedule:

Tuesday, June 5: Original Iowans

View the Native American collection, act out a story, and create a dream catcher

Tuesday, June 12: Early Settlers and Tool Time

Imagine you're a pioneer. See a thrashing machine and old tool room. Even churn and taste homemade butter!

Tuesday, June 19: No Stop Shop...General Store and Vintage Fashion

Reenact the "good 'ol days" of shared phone lines, a butcher store, and more. Have a tea party dressed in vintage attire.

Tuesday, June 26: Life before Legos

Play old-fashioned games, like croquet, marbles, and more.

Tuesday, July 3: One-room school house

Travel to an original, one-room school house to role-play a day in the life of Laura Ingles Wilder. Even enjoy a game of softball outdoors!

Each day camp provides hands-on learning opportunities, rich in Iowa history and culture. Come join in the fun. Learn something new. Try one or all five! Cost for the each camp is \$10 per child or \$25 if the child attends all five. Snacks included. Strickland's museum work has been inspired by Einstein's aphorism to "Learn from yesterday. Live for today. Hope for tomorrow." She, along with other volunteers, will inspire children to think, feel, and learn about the past and how it influences the future.

Golden Hills RC&D is a nonprofit organization with a mission "to develop and promote sustainable cultural and conservation projects that enhance the quality of life and preserve the assets of rural western Iowa." With another summer comes our summer school program for grade K-3. Families have been contacted about their child participating in the program for the days from June 4 - June 22. Buses' routes have been lined up and are ready to pick up and bring students in for breakfast and take them home after lunch. Teachers are busily planning some reading and math lessons to help strengthen the students' knowledge in areas like reading comprehension, phonics, reading fluency, math fluency, number sense, and other reading and math skills. 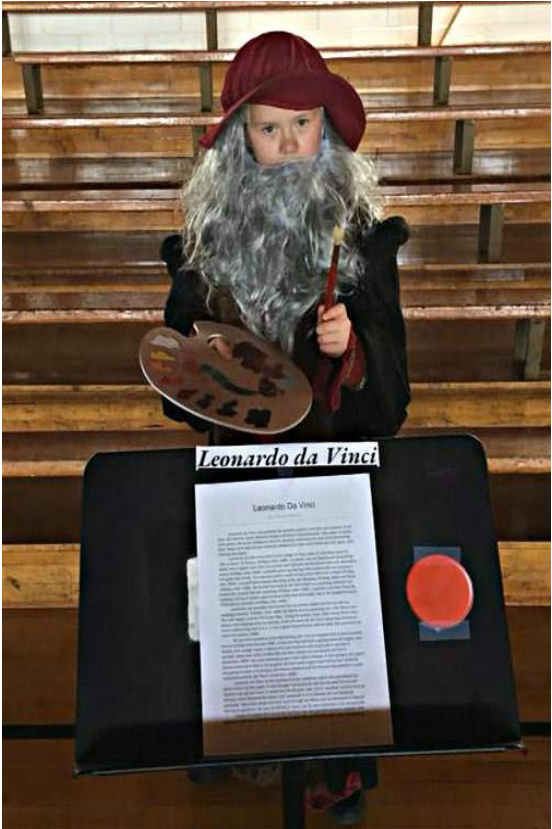

Two Riverside Community School District Teachers were honored on Monday, May 7th. Mrs. Amanda Brandon (5-12 Instrumental Music) and Mr. Brock Johnson (Elementary Physical Education) each received the Charles Lakin Outstanding Teacher Award. They were both surprised at all-school assemblies in their buildings. This award comes with a \$10,000 prize for each winner and a \$2,500 award for their school. This is the first time that any educator at Riverside has been so honored. One teacher per district is rare; two is an exceptional honor. Our congratulations to both Mrs. Brandon and Mr. Johnson. The 4th grade competed against 68 classes in the Green Hills AEA SumDog Math Contest in April. The 4th grade class placed 10th overall. In addition to the class contests, 1,123 students completed to answer 1,000 math question correctly. Dalton Schechinger answered 973 questions correctly which earned him 3rd place. The Teacher Leadership Compensation Initiative at Riverside has completed another successful year. Eighty-four percent of Riverside teachers utilized support from Teacher Leaders during the 2017-2018 school year. Ninety-one percent of the teachers who participated in a cycle said it was beneficial to work with a teacher leader.

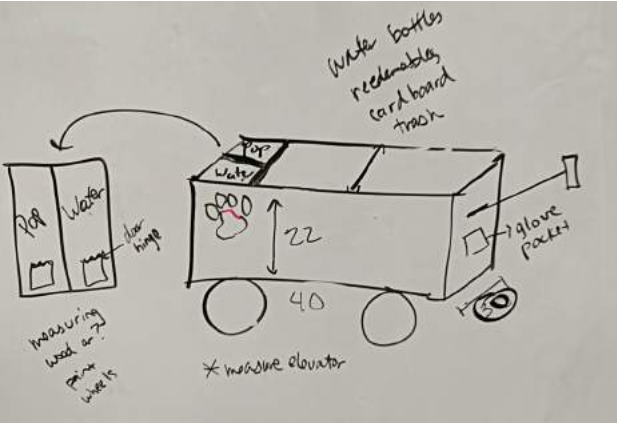

Community Support Creates Farm Safety Day for Youth

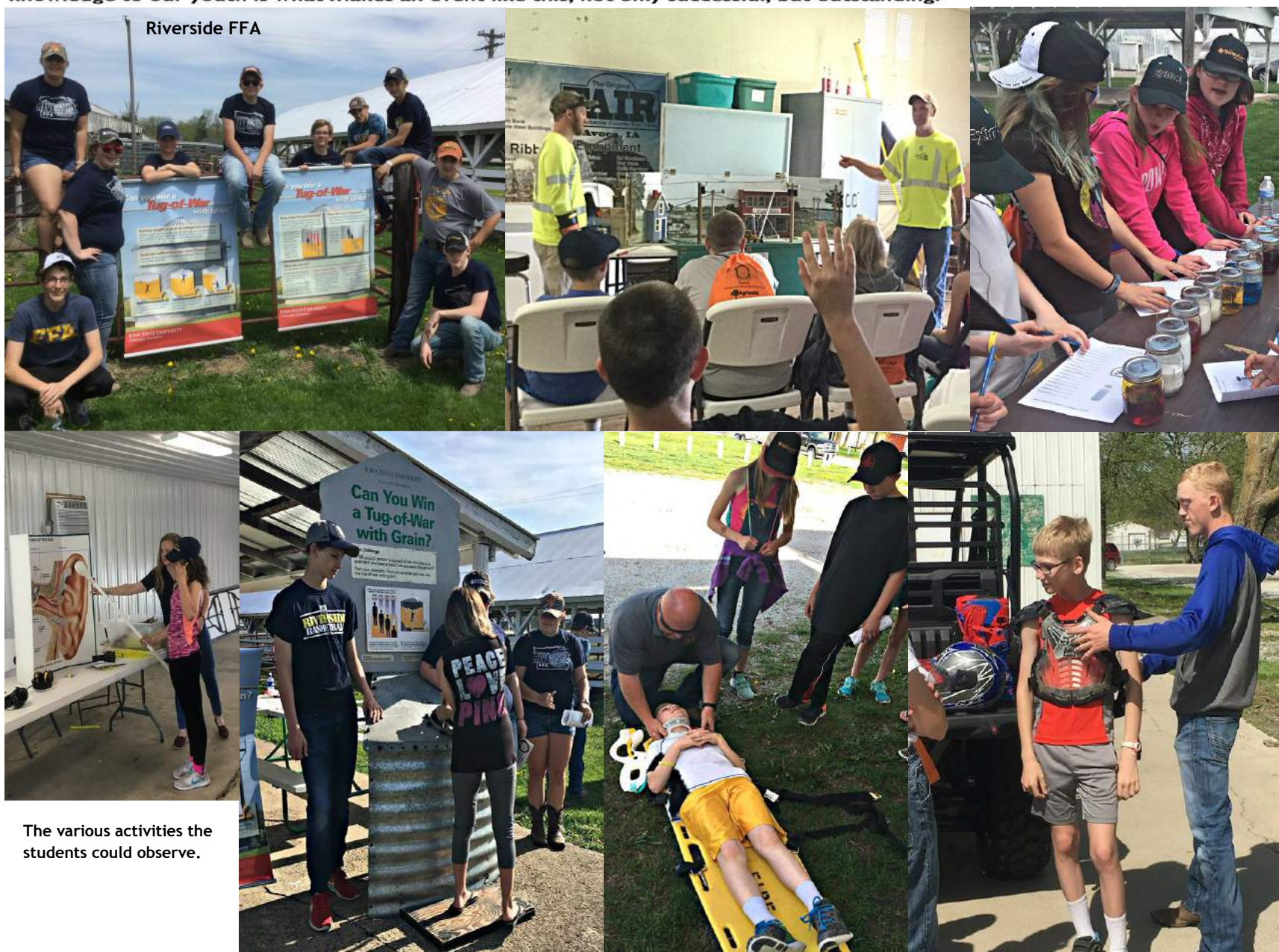
