

## Parents of 6th and IIth Grade Students

Get ready for 2018-19. Students entering the 7<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grades are required to have immunizations to start school. There is no grace period for these boosters; they must be completed before the 1<sup>st</sup> day of attendance for the '18-'19 school year.

- Students entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade and above must have a 1 time dose of tetanus/diphtheria/acellular pertussis-containing vaccine (Tdap), if born after September 15, 2000; regardless of the interval since the last tetanus/diphtheriacontaining vaccine.
- 2. Students entering 7<sup>th</sup> grade and above must have I dose of meningococcal if born after September 15, 2004; and 2 doses of meningococcal vaccines for the applicant in 12<sup>th</sup> grade, if born after September 15, 1999; or I dose if received when the applicant is 16 years of age or older.

Interpretation: Incoming 7<sup>th</sup> graders need a Tdap and a meningitis shot. Incoming 12<sup>th</sup> graders need a meningitis shot, if they had the meningitis vaccine before 16 years of age they need a booster!

We request these be completed and to Mrs. Palmer by May 22, 2018 for records to be updated and no interruption to a student's education. If you have any questions contact Vicki Palmer RN at one of the schools or by email vpalmer@riverside.kl2.ia.us





#### Southwest Iowa Schools Make History in China (Supt. Justin Wagner, Harlan Community Schools)



Last week, eighteen students from four schools in Southwest Iowa made a historic visit to China. The trip was sponsored by Syngenta and included a meeting with Ambassador Branstad as well as establishing the first-ever sister-school relationship between an Iowa school district and Chinese school district. The participating school districts included Harlan Community, AHSTW, Riverside, and Woodbine. The trip was focused on a cultural exchange with an emphasis on agriculture and business ideas in education.

The first Chinese school they visited was the Beijing No. 80 International School. This is a private school that approximately 2,200 students attend and live on campus during the week. The lowa students were able to interact and participate in several lessons with the Chinese students and staff.

The students also visited a public school in Chengde City where a sister-school relationship was established with Chengde No. I High School. An official signing ceremony was held where the lowa students were honored guests. The Chinese students and staff were very excited to meet students from the United States. The lowa students were given the opportunity to attend classes and learn more about the public education system in China.

Both of the Beijing No. 80 and Chengde No. I schools would be considered boarding schools by

United States standards. The Chinese students have a rigor-

ous course schedule. For example, the Chengde students begin classes at 6:00 am and end at 10:00 pm each day. Students are able to go home on the weekends if they choose.


In addition to visiting schools, the students experienced the history and culture of China. Students visited Tiananmen Square, Puning Temple, Beijing Summer Palace, Chengde City Summer Palace, Kung Fu show and the Great Wall of China. The students also toured the Syngenta Innovation Center where they learned about agricultural innovations.

"This trip is focused on providing educational opportunities for kids in rural communities. This is only one piece of a larger project we're working on, said Justin Wagner, Superintendent of the Harlan Community School District. The collaboration among the school districts in this area is historic as well. The intention is to include more school districts in the future and allow their students to experience these 'once in a lifetime' kinds of experience. We need to reimagine what education can look like in rural communities and then do whatever we can to make those opportunities possible for our kids in southwest Iowa."

Riverside students were Katie Messerschmidt, Caiden Goodman, Joel Henningsen, and Taten Williams. Their FFA advisor accompanied them and provided the photos.









#### INTERMEDIATE NEWS

On Tues. April 10th, 2018, Logan-Magnolia Community Schools hosted the SWI Regional Math Bee event for area sixth graders at the Logan Community Center. According to Lori Lockwood, regional coordinator of the event, students were selected to compete by being the top four math students that are currently enrolled in the sixth grade in their home district. Twenty-five teams, across our region, competed in this event with a goal of determining which schools had the top three math teams and which competitors were the top twenty-five individual students. After nearly sixty-four minutes of testing student abilities in the areas of: the number system, expressions and equations, geometry, statistics, and ratios and proportional relationships; the results for both teams and individuals were tallied. Three teams were chosen as the top teams. The team taking first place was from Treynor. Taking second was Glenwood Middle School Team A. Third place was awarded to Harlan Team A. The top twenty-five individuals were also recognized. From Riverside, Kyler Rieken and Anthony Bernard tied for 10th and Abe Schechinger tied for 8th. Jay and Charles Klemmensen were also part of the Riverside team.

This was Riverside's first year to participate in this event. The team was sponsored by Bonnie Kramer.





#### Five Year Capital Project List

e are finalizing the Project List for our Five Year Capital Improvement Plan and will be setting a Board Work Session in June to discuss and prioritize the projects. We will also be discussing how the fund the JHSH Project completion and future projects.

Legislators have almost completed their work for the 2018 legislative session. Much of that work is taking place behind closed doors as Senate and House leaders and the governor try to reach agreement on a tax bill. Work on the rest of the budget is on hold until that occurs – as is work on the remaining substantive policy issues such as the state penny for school infrastructure (SAVE) and operational sharing incentives. Both of those bills are in the Senate, awaiting consideration on the floor. Riverside Community School District supports the passage of both of these bills and will continue to work with the Senate to hopefully move the bills forward.






