Riverside Allergy Awareness (Mr. Meek and Mrs. Palmer)

There have been some discussions about the expectations of food allergies at Riverside Schools. Here is what we consider when it comes to peanut/tree nut allergies.

1. All Riverside kitchens are peanut/tree nut free.
2. Any snacks sent to classrooms for birthdays, celebrations, or other classroom parties should be peanut/tree nut free. Any purchased or homemade snack should include the ingredient list. A recipe is OK to send if made at home.
3. We do allow peanut butter to be brought in a lunch. We ask that students not share/trade lunch items.

If there are any changes to a specific classroom regarding food allergies, parents will be notified in writing.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Effective April 1, Riverside is pleased to offer PayForIt to our parents to pay fees, fines and lunch balances online. Parents will also be able to check payment history, review purchases and set up automated email reminders.

PayForIt.net

What is PayForIt?

PayForIt (PFI) is a Secure Online Payment system which simplifies payment, collection and balancing of funds for School Districts. It enables parents to pay fees, fines and fund accounts quickly and easily online. PayForIt allows parents to opt into and manage email reminders about their student's accounts.

Benefits:

- ✓ Using PFI, secretaries spend less time taking cash at the serving lines, so students have more time to eat. Additionally, there is not a chance of lost lunch money from home to the serving lines or building offices.
- ✓ Payments can be made by credit card or electronic check 24 hours a day, 7 days a week at the parents' convenience.
- ✓ Parents can review what their students are actually purchasing along with account balance information.
- ✓ PFI supports increased communication between the school & the parents.

Features:

- ✓ Parents can opt to receive an email when a family balance dips to a certain threshold (set by the parent).
- ✓ Parents can opt to use an automatic payment feature which replenishes their family account(s) when a balance dips to a specific level (specified by the parent).
- ✓ School messages are automatically emailed to parents.
- ✓ A continuous online survey is provided to monitor parent feedback and ideas.
- ✓ Student information is automatically transferred from year-to-year and from school-to-school.
- ✓ Parents can manage more than one student account.
- ✓ PFI is PCI, or Payment Card Industry, compliant and maintains industry standard SSL certificates. This ensures all data is safe & secure as defined by the industry.

How to sign up

Log on to www.payforit.net.

Select the "Sign Up" option from the menu. The screens will guide you through the process to establish your account.

1. The internet convenience fee will be charged at 4.00% per credit card charges and \$1.75 per electronic check.
2. You will be prompted to enter your contact data, password, payment information, etc.
3. You will need to indicate which student(s) to attach to your account. Student names must be entered exactly the same as they appear in JMC (Riverside's student information system). Students are already loaded in the PFI system from JMC so the names must match exactly. PFI utilizes the same student ID number already used throughout Riverside's student information system. If you are unsure of your student's ID number, you can check it in your JMC online access account, or contact your child's building.
4. Once you have an account, you can choose to pay lunch balances, fees and fines at school using a credit card.

Once all information is entered, PFI will email a validation code for you to confirm the registration. Once confirmed you can begin using PFI as often as you'd like.

How to get help

How Do I...? Each major function used in PFI, has online help available under the menu option of "How Do I...?". The "How Do I?" provides step by step instructions as well as screen examples.

FAQ: When starting to use PFI, it is a good idea to review the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) available within the Help menu option.

Backpack Program (Jana Hensley)

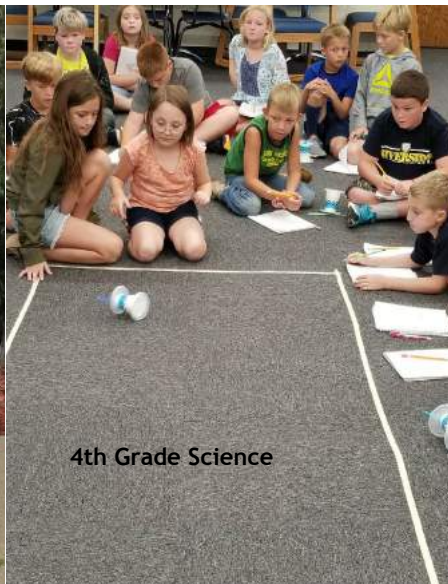

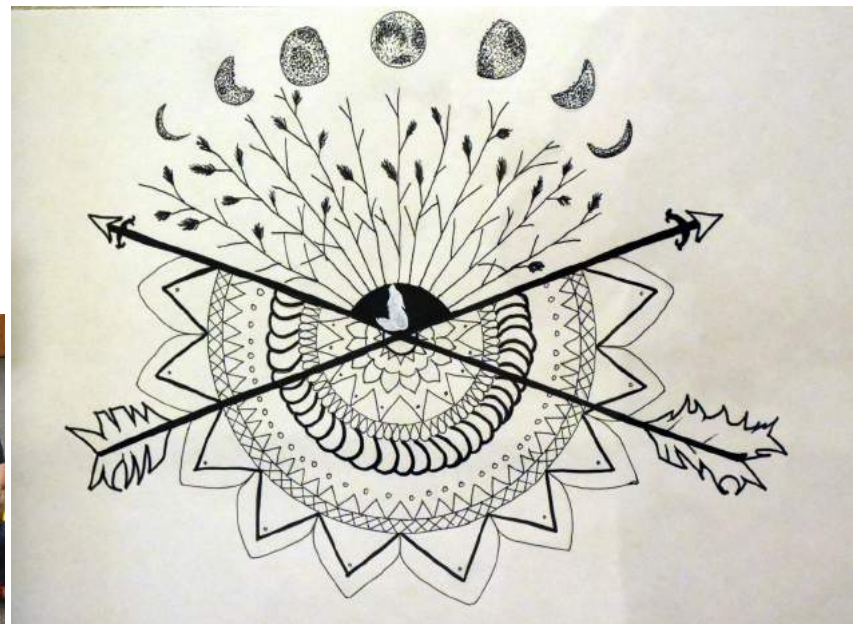

Help Your Child Succeed in School: Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early

School success goes hand in hand with good attendance!

DID YOU KNOW?

- Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, college, and at work.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Set a regular bed time and morning routine.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Find out what day school starts and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your child to her teachers and classmates before school starts to help her transition.
- Don't let your child stay home unless she is truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make her feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session.

On Thursday, September 14th, the 7th - 12th grade students heard a message from guest speaker Bobby Petrocelli. Bobby's message of "You Matter" was very well received by students and staff. Bullying and Harassment

Law and Definition According to Iowa Code section 280.28, defines harassment and bullying as: “Any electronic, written, verbal, or physical act or conduct toward a student which is based on any actual or perceived trait or characteristic of the student and which creates an objectively hostile school environment that meets one or more of the following conditions:

1. Places the student in reasonable fear of harm to the student’s person or property.
2. Has a substantially detrimental effect on the student’s physical or mental health.
3. Has the effect of substantially interfering with a student’s academic performance.
4. Has the effect of substantially interfering with the student’s ability to participate in or benefit from the services, activities, or privileges provided by a school.”

“Trait or characteristic of the student” includes but is not limited to age, color, creed, national origin, race, religion, marital status, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, physical attributes, physical or mental ability or disability, ancestry, political party preference, political belief, socioeconomic status, or familial status

Tips:

- A formal written complaint is not needed to investigate a potential harassment or bullying situation. As soon as a school hears about a bullying and harassment incident it should be investigated. Schools should follow their bullying and harassment board policy when investigating.
- Never have the bully and the individual being bullied sit down together to discuss the issue.
- Review the district bullying and harassment definition, policy and procedures with students, staff and parents each year.

Fee Reminders

Every school year we get questions regarding fees. Please be aware that the district does not have a registration fee but does charge a curriculum fee. Iowa Code does state that a Board of Education is authorized to rent curriculum (textbooks) at a reasonable fee set by the board. Under Iowa Code fees are expressly authorized and can be charged for: textbooks, school supplies, summer school programs, driver education programs, transportation, eye protective devices, ear protective devices, school meals and nonresident student tuition. A full waiver of all fees shall be granted if the student or student’s family are eligible for Free Lunch, transportation assistance or the student is in foster care. A partial fee waiver is granted for a student or student’s family that qualify for Reduced Lunch.

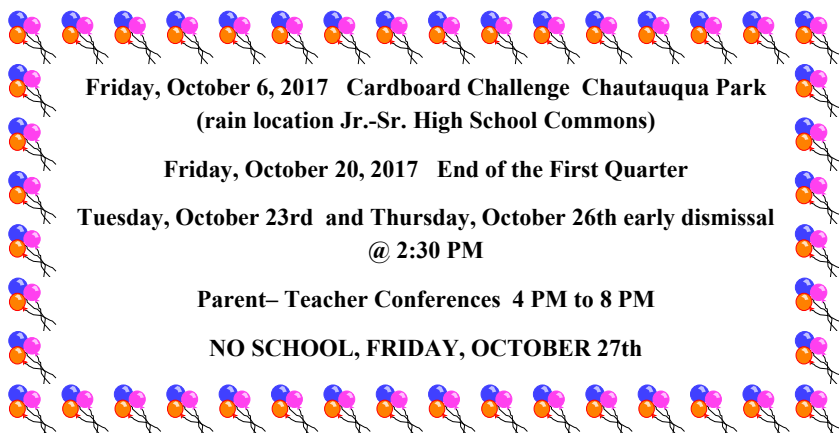

Teachers have put in extra work to make sure that a struggling reader gets what he or she needs to be successful. We are also working hard this year to implement our new math curriculum, Investigations Math, in grades K-5th grade.

The intermediate school in Carson has had a strong start with our new Chromebooks. Students are using them a great deal during the day for a variety of reasons. As I walk around, I am seeing some great things being created, researched, and read about by using this great technology. Take some time and ask your child how they use their Chromebook. Most of them use the computers for many things during the day.

I cannot stress enough that having open and honest communication is vital to the success of your child in school. Teachers, paraeducators, and I want both you and your child's experience to be a positive and successful one. It is important to talk with any member of our school when an issue comes up. Be open with problems that your child is having at school, even if your child asks you not to talk to the school. Send emails or make phone calls so that everyone who is in contact with your child is on the same page. We want everyone in the community including families, students, and staff to have the best Riverside experience that they can!

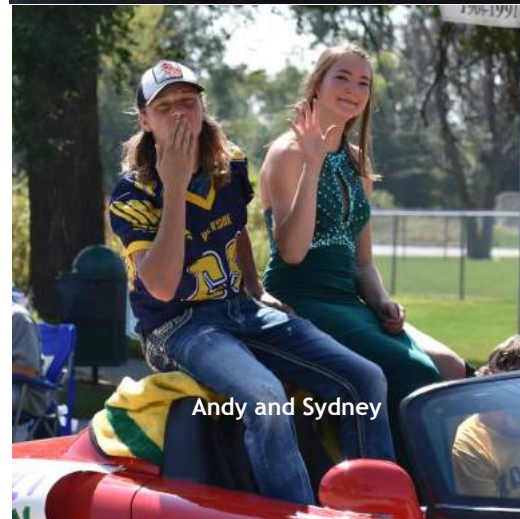

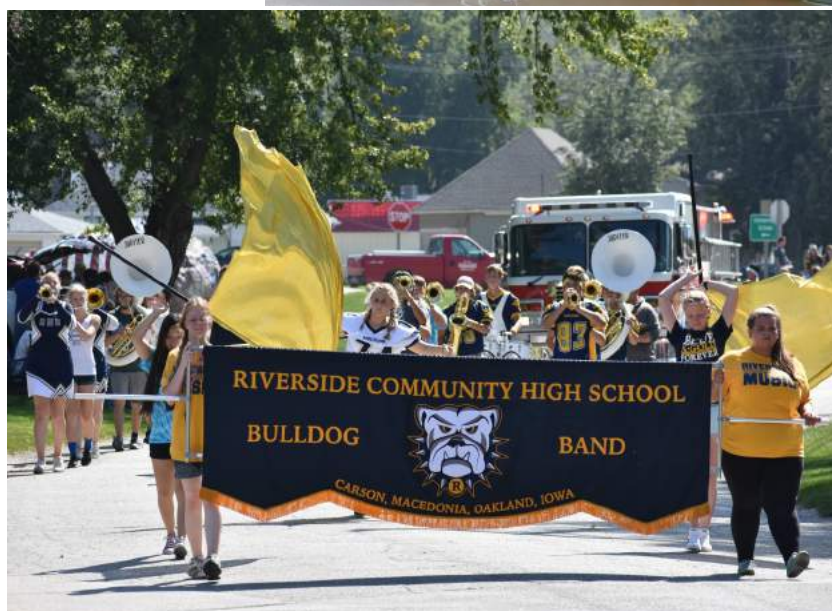
