
#### Riverside Allergy Awareness (Mr. Meek)

There have been some discussions about the expectations of food allergies at Riverside Schools. Here is what we consider when it comes to peanut/tree nut allergies.

- 1. All Riverside kitchens are peanut/tree nut free.
- 2. Any snacks sent to classrooms for birthdays, celebrations, or other classroom parties should be peanut/tree nut free. Any purchased or homemade snack should include the ingredient list. A recipe is OK to send if made at home.
- 3. We do allow peanut butter to be brought in a lunch. We ask that students not share/trade lunch items.

Parents, did you know that Riverside Community School serves breakfast daily? Every day of the school week, except for weatherrelated late starts, can find our cooks in the kitchen busily preparing breakfast for the students. Breakfasts include: a cheese omelet with a hash brown potato, pancakes, French toast sticks, yogurt, a sausage/egg sandwich, breakfast pizza, and sausage gravy/ biscuit. Cereal and long johns are available daily. Every breakfast includes choice of chocolate, white, or strawberry milk and juice.

The best part about breakfast is the cost--\$1.50--which includes the breakfast entrée, milk and juice. If you qualify for reduced prices, breakfast is only \$.30. Kids receiving free lunch also qualify for free breakfast.

A good breakfast gives students the energy to start the day off right. They learn better, behave better, and perform better than kids who don't eat breakfast. At the elementary school, we average 60+ students eating breakfast every day. Breakfast is an important start to everyone's day. Give breakfast at school some food for thought. 





Good day to you Bulldog Nation. (Nicholas Kroon, 6-12 Principal)

It is kind of surreal to write this update to you now as we have not had students since March 16. First of all, I want to say thank you to all of you for attempting to help your students. Having been confined to our home with 3 school-aged children, I know first-hand how difficult it is to keep children focused on their studies. So thank you and continued blessings on your educational endeavors!:)

Right now, our teachers have been instructed to provide review materials only as we are not certified as an eLearning school. eLearning is not an approved source of instruction in Iowa, and this method is saved for only a few institutions. I do believe these things could be changing, especially if we are required to shut down schools for longer. We will keep you updated on these happenings, and on guidance we receive from the Department of Education and Governor Reynolds. Also important to note, that Governor Reynolds has essentially forgiven all missed days from March 17-April 10, 2020. We are not expected to make that time up. So, tell your students to stay sharp using the review and online resources that their teachers have given them. Also, this is a great time for your student to make up any assignments that they have not completed. Some students could definitely raise their grade during this time with previously incomplete work.

We meet right now as an admin team once per week, and we have weekly staff meetings via zoom. Our teachers also meet separately once per week via zoom in the RCT (Riverside Collaborative Teams) team. Their RCT discussions are centered on their Power Standards and how to implement them via remote/eLearning if we need to go that route. Our teachers are also providing up-to-date resource materials for review. I have been very proud of the efforts that our teachers have made to provide material and continue to stay in contact with your sons/daughters. They are a great bunch of people and very dedicated and passionate about your kids mental health, physical health, and education.

n a time such as this, I am very thankful for our hard working parents who work in healthcare, transportation, industry, agriculture, business, banking, and sanitation. We survive in this time because of you. If any of you parents work in these areas, thank you so much. I appreciate your sacrifice to perform your duties in the face of many obstacles. If you are home based right now because of this virus, I am thankful you are healthy and able to assist your student with their education. If there is anything we can do for you as a school, please reach out.

I am also very thankful in these times for technology that allows us to educate our students, attend church on Sunday, converse with friends, etc. It has been a unique time, but in some parts has been a nice respite from normal everyday life. Stay safe everybody, and hopefully see you and your kids soon!

Pre-K through 6th grade teachers and students have been using this semester to focus on Individualized Daily Reading (IDR) and conferring. Students are taught how to choose a "just right book" anywhere they go (library, book store, or their own personal bookshelf)! After students have made their selection of books, they spend time each school day reading the books they have chosen for themselves. During this IDR time, teachers are also actively engaged in two-way conversations with their students. Teachers are visiting with students about their books and checking for understanding. Perhaps most importantly, teachers are building a love of reading and personal connections in a one-on-one setting with each student. These powerful conversations have made even the most reluctant reader excited to share his/ her book with both adults and peers.


With the closure of school, IDR has become challenging for teachers to do consistently with their students. Luckily, conferring with your child is easy! Please use these questions as a 'jumping off point' to start a conversation about books with your student.

- I. What facts surprised you the most?
- 2. Did you have any preconceived ideas that changed after reading this book?

- 6. Where could you look to find more information on this topic? Does the author use references you could look at?

The educational enrichment approach to continuous learning that Riverside is providing to students and families while the district is closed is called Voluntary Educational Enrichment Opportunities. 

The closure is for public safety to help limit the spread of COVID-19








#### Riverside Guiding Principles During School Closure

As Riverside continues to navigate our current situation and work with the lowa Department of Education and Iowa Department of Public Health, there are five guiding principles that remain at the forefront of every decision and action.

#### I. Health and safety is the first consideration.

- 2. Children with disabilities are entitled to an equal opportunity for participation in any service provided by a district, including modifications and supplementary aids and supports as necessary.
- 3.To the extent practicable, strive to maintain a sense of normalcy for children with disabilities during this public health emergency.
- 4.To the extent that health and safety come into tension with an administrative or procedural requirement, default in favor of health and safety and consider responding to the administrative or procedural requirements once this public health emergency has resolved.
- 5.Parents must be involved in any decision about an individual child's placement or services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Early ACCESS, or Section 504.

#### **Board Meetings**

While still being mindful of social distancing. Board meetings should continue to be held to ensure continuity of district operation and fulfillment of requirements under lowa Code chapter 279. Based on Governor Reynolds's March 20 disaster proclamation, certain open meetings laws are temporarily suspended "to the extent that the statutes could be interpreted to prevent a governmental body from holding the meeting by electronic means, provided that the governmental body properly notices the meeting or hearing and includes a telephone conference number or website address that permits the public to participate in the meeting or hearing." The same proclamation temporarily suspended open meetings laws "to the extent they could be interpreted to prevent a governmental body from limiting the number of people present at an inperson location of the meeting, provided that the governmental body provides a means for the public to participate by telephone or electronically."

#### **Coordinating with Partners**

The Iowa Department of Education is having daily conference calls with all superintendents. I am in contact with other Area superintendents to coordinate services between districts and operate consistently. All Local, State and National Public Health and Educational organizations are supplying information on a regular basis. We continue to review and get the latest and best information to you as possible.

#### Schools Meals Update

School Meal Distribution--All children Birth to 18 years of age will receive enough food to have 5 Breakfasts and 5 Lunches for the week.

Meals are available at four distribution points each school day from 9:00 AM until 11:00 AM. If someone wants a meal delivered, please call 712-249-7312 and meals can be delivered to the home. This is a "Grab and Go Service". Menus will consist of a fully reimbursable meal.

The four distribution centers are:

- Oakland Elementary School-Door F-East Door on North Side of Building
- Riverside Middle/High School-Front Doors
- . Carson Elementary School-Door C on West side of building
- Post Office in Macedonia on Main Street-School Vehicle will be park on Main Street

Next Distribution Date for Meals will be April 13, April 20, April 27

#### Social Distancing-15 Days to Slow Spread

Avoid close contact with people who are sick. Put distance between yourself and other people if COVID-19 is spreading in your community. This is especially important for people who are at higher risk of getting very sick. Guidance has been updated to avoid social gathering with groups of 10 or more people.

The best ways for you to achieve social distancing are pretty simple:



- 1. You and your kids should stay home. This includes not going to church, not going to the gym, not going anywhere.
- 2. Do not travel for enjoyment until this is done. Do not travel for work unless your work truly requires it.

- Avoid groups of people. Not just crowds, groups. Just be around your immediate family. I think kids should just play with siblings at this point – no play dates, etc.
- When you must leave your home (to get groceries, to go to work), maintain a distance of six feet from people. REALLY stay away from people with a cough or who look sick.
- When you do get groceries, etc., buy twice as much as you normally do so that you can go to the store half as often. Use hand sanitizer immediately after your transaction, and immediately after you unload the groceries.

#### Mass Gatherings Recommendation

Large events and mass gatherings can contribute to the spread of COVID-19 because those who attend these events can introduce the virus to new people. Examples of large events and mass gatherings include conferences, festivals, parades, concerts, sporting events, weddings, and other types of assemblies. All events unbuilt April 30, 2020 in the Riverside School District that could potentially have 10 or more people has been cancelled or postponed

#### Instructional Time

At this time, the Legislature has waived the requirement for instructional hours and days through April 12 by passing SF2408. This legislation also gives Governor Reynolds the authority to waive requirements for instructional time past April 12 if necessary. If the emergency proclamation expires, the rules suspension in SF2408 will also expire.

#### School Calendar

We have amended the 2019-2020 school calendar to have a return date of April 30, 2020. More information about the school calendar and rescheduling of events will be available when we are able to transition back to school. We do not plan on extending the school year.

#### Graduation

If districts and nonpublic schools have graduating seniors who are unable to complete their classes for the year due to school closure, illness, family illness, or related COVID-19 issues, the Department suggests the district use local discretion to determine whether the students have completed sufficient course content to consider the units complete. We recommend that districts provide as much latitude for students to graduate on time as possible.

#### **Yoluntary Educational Enrichment Opportunities**

#### What we are doing now

The educational enrichment approach to continuous learning includes those activities that are provided to students and families while the district is closed. This may include packets, teleconferencing, online instruction, or other outreach activities. Student participation is voluntary and no grading or credit is given.

If this approach to continuous learning is used, any educational enrichment activity should be <u>offered as equitably as possible</u>, taking into consideration the needs of students living in poverty, students with disabilities, and students who do not speak English as their first language. Ensuring that all students have access to educational enrichment activities <u>does not mean that each individual engages in an identical manner or even in identical activities</u>. First priority, of course, is to identify those individuals who could participate if they had the technology. Some districts are finding creative ways to get equipment and access to those who don't have them. Once the issue of access to technology is addressed as much as reasonably possible, <u>districts can consider other options such as paper packets with educational enrichment activities which are adjusted to the needs of the individual (e.g., large print, at individual's reading level, in the native language).</u>

There is no prior approval needed for a district to provide continuous learning through educational enrichment opportunities. Districts will need to consider a number of factors including technology access, staff skills, and student access.

## Required Educational Services

#### What we Could Transition to in Future

Continuous learning through the provision of approved educational services ensures that academic work is equivalent in effort and rigor to typical classroom work. All students are required to participate, attendance is taken, work is graded, and credit granted. Typically, instruction is provided through some type of online learning. Hybrid models of learning, involving some online learning and other methodologies like packets, are also available. These services must be approved by the lowa Department of Education.

The provision of approved educational services typically <u>requires detailed planning and preparation to successfully implement</u>. Districts will need to consider whether they have <u>adequate infrastructure</u> in at least three areas: <u>technology</u>, <u>instruction</u>, and student engagement.

Some lowa districts have been working years to build their capacity to deliver educational services through continuous learning and are ready to use this approach to provide educational services during district closures due to the COVID-19 outbreak. Recognizing this, the Department, in partnership with the Continuous Learning Task Force, is currently developing an expedited process for districts to be approved. The expedited process is anticipated to be ready in the next several days.

Before requiring continuous learning, the Department urges districts and schools to consider the extent to which distance or virtual learning is suitable to all students or the circumstances of all parents. Particularly during the COVID-19 crisis, districts and schools should strongly consider the imposition of any mandate that may frustrate the response to COVID-19.

#### Access to Instructional Support Resources During Closure

You can access the Instructional Support materials at <a href="www.riversideschools.org">www.riversideschools.org</a> and then clicking on the Riverside COVID0-19 Information page. Teachers have psoted Weekly Instructional Review Plans or Instructional Review Resources for your students. They will provide websites, different social media feeds and technology tools they will be utilizing. They will direct you and your students where you can go to find the resources. They will provide all links so they can be accessed. They will also share with you sites that can provide you general instructions, technical assistance, or tutorials on how to use the site. Please feel free to contact the teacher directly. Teacher email addresses can be found on our website.

#### Access for All Students

We continue to try and access who in our community does not have Internet. OmniTel has volunteered to help us get Internet to those who may not have it. If you have students and parents that have not engaged, if you could reach out by phone and see if lack of Internet is the issue. Several people have reached out already. National statistics would say at least 14% would not have access and up to an additional 17% only have access by phone which may not be home with the student during the day. If you come across any parents and/or students who need access to the Internet please let me know.

#### Concurrent Enrollment Coursework

A concurrent enrollment course is a community college course, and concurrent enrollment instructors are community college faculty. All concurrent enrollment coursework should adhere to the policies and practices set by the community college. Courses should also continue to adhere to state, institutional, and programmatic accreditation requirements unless specific exemptions are issued. Ultimately, courses delivered through concurrent enrollment must satisfy all criteria for the course as specified by the community college, and <u>students enrolled in a concurrent enrollment course must satisfactorily complete the course</u>. Colleges, in consultation with school district partners, are to determine locally how to ensure students enrolled in a concurrent enrollment course complete the course. This may involve transitioning students to another course section, continuing to have the high school teacher instruct the course online, or other locally developed arrangements.

Each institution should ensure that concurrent enrollment instructors are informed of changes to academic programming and should be provided with the same support and resources as regular college faculty. Similarly, students enrolled in concurrent enrollment courses should be provided with similar support and resources as on-campus students. At a minimum, concurrent enrollment student should understand what services will be accessible through the community college - either on-campus or online.

#### Assessment and Accountability

The state of lowa submitted a waiver to the U.S. Department of Education and received approval on April 1, 2020. This allows lowa to waive the requirements to assess students in mathematics, reading/language arts and science for the 2019-2020 year. This includes assessments for all students, including students with significant cognitive disabilities and English learners. The state will also not be required to designate schools in need of Targeted Support and Improvement. The reporting requirement for specific measures of the ESSA Accountability Index that are provided to the public via the lowa School Performance Profile including: lowa state assessment in mathematics or reading/language arts, percent of students assessed/not assessed, English learner proficiency, Conditions for Learning Survey, Postsecondary Readiness Index, and any progress toward long-term goals/interim progress will not calculated or reported in the 2020-2021 school year.

Therefore, the following assessments will not be implemented in the 2019-2020 year, and results will not be reported in the 2020-2021 year:

- > Iowa Statewide Assessment of Student Progress (ISASP)
- English Language Proficiency Assessment for the 21st Century (ELPA21)
- Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM)
- Conditions for Learning Survey (CfL) student version or optional parent/teacher version.

#### Professional Development

Governor Reynolds has issued an emergency proclamation ordering the closure of many businesses and limiting certain gatherings to less than 10 people. Her proclamation does not restrict the professional development activities of school districts. But to prevent the spread of COVID-19, Riverside School District will encourage and implement the practice social distancing in any interaction with staff members.

#### Therapeutic Options over Closure
