

After reviewing guidance from the Iowa Department of Education on Use of Facilities that was released on May 20, 2020. School facilities will remain closed until July 1, 2020. Driver Education Guidelines for COVID-19 Prevention

COVID-19: The current public health crisis is having an impact on teen driver's education across the state. To help driver's education programs continue to provide education during this time, we are allowing virtual classroom instruction for driver's education. In addition, certain requirements in administrative rule 761-634.4 have been temporarily waived to provide flexibility for driver education providers seeking to continue providing the classroom instruction virtually during this time. The waiver also allows a student to begin the classroom portion of a course after they pass the instruction permit knowledge test, but before they have obtained their instruction permit.

Riverside has contracted with Dave Kuhl from Missouri Valley. He has sent information to the students who have registered and will be holding a Parent Meeting on Tuesday June 2, 2020. The Zoom link has been sent to the students at their school email address. If you as a parent need the link your student should have the information.

Driving will be scheduled by Dave Kuhl and his staff under the following guidance:

- Riverside Transportation Department will supply the vehicles
 - o Students must check their temperature at home prior any driving session, and stay home if it is 100.4 or above
 - Students will socially distance as much as possible in the vehicle
 - o Students are encouraged to bring hand sanitizer and disinfect hands on a regular basis
 - o The vehicle touch points will be wiped down as students change to driver position
 - They are not required to wear a mask/face covering during the driving time. Students can choose to wear a mask/face covering that they already own
 - o The vehicle will be disinfected before and after each driving session.
 - Parents can request individual driving by contacting the instructor

COVID-19 Return to Open Planning

Guiding Principles

As Riverside work to determine Return to Open and Return to Learn planning there are five guiding principles that remain at the forefront of every decision and action.

- 1. Health and safety is the first consideration.
- Children with disabilities are entitled to an equal opportunity for participation in any service provided by a district, including modifications and supplementary aids and supports as necessary.
- To the extent practicable, <u>strive to maintain a sense of normalcy</u> for children with disabilities during this public health emergency.
- 4. To the extent that health and safety come into tension with an administrative or procedural requirement, <u>default in favor of health and safety</u> and consider responding to the administrative or procedural requirements once this public health emergency has resolved.

Return to Open

Riverside Community School District is utilizing the guidance created in consultation with the lowa Department of Public Health (IDPH) as a resource for us to determine when and how to safely open for school sponsored activities and learning. They must be used in conjunction with all proclamations issued by the governor and guidance provided by the IDPH. This guidance follows the most recent recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) on reopening schools.

Beginning June 1, all schools may begin offering summer learning opportunities. Any school may also begin offering summer activities in consultation with public health. This includes extracurricular activities and co-curricular activities, but no sports other than those expressly permitted by Department of Education guidance or governor's proclamation (Baseball & Softball).

Summer Learning

Instruction through a Continuous Learning model is permitted. Continuous Learning may be provided on a voluntary basis, or a summer program may be provided in which students enroll and are required to attend. Instructional and activity-based camps are also permitted. Instruction in school facilities is permitted if done in accordance with the following mitigation requirements for Hygiene, Social Distancing, Health, Illness Reporting, Cleansing, Sanitizing and Disinfecting.

The first meeting with a group of volunteer teachers from Grades PK-5 was held on Friday June 5, 2020. We discussed lowa DOE Guidance and possible ways to reinvent summer learning under this new guidance. The teachers were able to share their ideas and concerns as to how to move forward. We are going to identify those students that would most need summer learning based upon the research on COVID-19 and summer regression. Each teacher will be assigned a number of students to interact with either Remote or Face to Face under CDC recommended guidelines for Return to Open. More information will be available soon. This will be offered for students PK-5.

When will Riverside Childcare reopen?

We are analyzing the survey data to see what our options are for reopening the Center. I will be meeting with Cami Larison, RCC Director, to look at our options for reopening or not. We still are working on a possible reopening date of June 15, 2020.

COVID-19 Return to Open Planning

Guiding Principles

As Riverside work to determine Return to Open and Return to Learn planning there are five guiding principles that remain at the forefront of every decision and action.

- 1. Health and safety is the first consideration.
- Children with disabilities are entitled to an equal opportunity for participation in any service provided by a district, including modifications and supplementary aids and supports as necessary.
- To the extent practicable, <u>strive to maintain a sense of normalcy</u> for children with disabilities during this public health emergency.
- 4. To the extent that health and safety come into tension with an administrative or procedural requirement, <u>default in favor of health and safety</u> and consider responding to the administrative or procedural requirements once this public health emergency has resolved.

Return to Open

Riverside Community School District is utilizing the guidance created in consultation with the lowa Department of Public Health (IDPH) as a resource for us to determine when and how to safely open for school sponsored activities and learning. They must be used in conjunction with all proclamations issued by the governor and guidance provided by the IDPH. This guidance follows the most recent recommendations of the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) on reopening schools.

Beginning June 1, all schools may begin offering summer learning opportunities. Any school may also begin offering summer activities in consultation with public health. This includes extracurricular activities and co-curricular activities, but no sports other than those expressly permitted by Department of Education guidance or governor's proclamation (Baseball & Softball).

Summer Learning

Instruction through a Continuous Learning model is permitted. Continuous Learning may be provided on a voluntary basis, or a summer program may be provided in which students enroll and are required to attend. Instructional and activity-based camps are also permitted. Instruction in school facilities is permitted if done in accordance with the following mitigation requirements for Hygiene, Social Distancing, Health, Illness Reporting, Cleansing, Sanitizing and Disinfecting.

The first meeting with a group of volunteer teachers from Grades PK-5 was held on Friday June 5, 2020. We discussed lowa DOE Guidance and possible ways to reinvent summer learning under this new guidance. The teachers were able to share their ideas and concerns as to how to move forward. We are going to identify those students that would most need summer learning based upon the research on COVID-19 and summer regression. Each teacher will be assigned a number of students to interact with either Remote or Face to Face under CDC recommended guidelines for Return to Open. More information will be available soon. This will be offered for students PK-5.

Draft Plans

In-Person - School starts on August 24, 2020. Students report every day to their usual classes: OES 8:30 AM-3:25 PM-Early Dismissal-Wed 2:25 PM, CES 8:20 AM-3:25 PM-Early Dismissal-Wed 2:25 PM, and MHS 8:20 AM-3:20 PM-Early Dismissal-Wed 2:20 PM. Teachers operate as usual. School will operate under CDC guidelines of disinfecting, social distancing and cloth face shields.

On-Line - School starts on August 24, 2020. No students in the building. Staff could be required to report daily or on a schedule. All learning is required and instruction should equal in-class instruction (rigor / activity). Students still need to be assessed. Grades will be determined and distributed. Attendance will still need to be taken.

Hybrid - School starts on August 24, 2020. Students will report to school in a yet to be determined alternative setting. Students may be reporting in smaller settings, on alternating days, alternate times, and/or with athome instructional components. School will operate under CDC guidelines of disinfecting, social distancing and cloth face shields.

Timeline

- By June 30 We will communicate to parents that three plans are being discussed and provide a brief
 overview of the three plans to allow parents the time they need to plan for each scenario.
- 2. On June 30-Big Picture plan will be submitted to Iowa DOE to meet state compliance.
- Groups will still meet to put all final operational details in place for start of school on Monday August 24, 2020

Riverside Community School District Baseball/Softball Practice Guidelines for COVID-19 Prevention

Starting June 1st, 2020 Riverside will allow baseball and softball practices to begin following the guidance of the Governor, lowa Department of Education, and the athletic associations. Extra-curricular activities are a choice to participate in. We completely understand if you do not wish to participate during this time. If you choose to participate the following mitigation efforts are required to help ensure player, coach, and spectator safety:

- ☐ Posted signage indicating no one should attend or participate in practice if they currently have symptoms or have been in contact with anyone with a confirmed COVID-19 diagnosis in the last 14 days.
- ☐ No dugouts may be used. Players' items should be lined up against the fence at least six feet apart. (Practices Only)
- ☐ Parents must remain in their cars or drop off and pick up players after practice. Players reporting to and leaving practices and games are not allowed to congregate in parking lots and must follow social distancing guidelines. Parent contact with coaches should be done through email, phone calls, or other electronic communication if at all possible.
- Players should use their own gloves, helmets, and bats as much as possible.
- ☐ Coaches are responsible for ensuring social distancing is maintained between players as much as possible. This means additional spacing between players while playing catch, changing drills so that players remain spaced out, and no congregating of players while waiting to bat.
- ☐ Players must bring their own water/beverage to consume during and after practice. No shared drinking fountains, portable hydration stations, or coolers may be used.
- ☐ Coaches must sanitize shared equipment before and after each practice.

Coaches will use a disinfectant spray to sanitize all shared equipment and areas before and after practices. We have ordered and are waiting for the delivery of (4) electromagnetic handheld sanitizing fog machines. These sanitizing machines, when they arrive, will be used to quickly and safely disinfect all equipment, dugouts, bathrooms, and more. We hope to have these arrive mid-June and they will replace the use of disinfectant sprays from a bottle when they arrive.

- Q Players and coaches should check their temperatures before attending practices. This needs to be done at home before attending practice and is the responsibility of the athlete.
- ☐ Anyone with symptoms of illness is not allowed to practice. Parents or players please contact your coach if you have symptoms of illness and need to miss practice. Coaches are required to have players showing symptoms of illness to not participate or attend practices
- ☐ Coaches should be knowledgeable of their students with pre-existing health conditions and work with school nurses or other health officials to take additional precautions as needed. If you have a child that has pre-existing health conditions please notify your coach immediately.
- Players should be encouraged to provide their own hand sanitizer. We ask that all athletes for baseball and softball have their own personal hand sanitizer for practices and games.
- ☐ Coaches must ban the spitting of sunflower seed shells. NO SUNFLOWER SEEDS AT PRACTICES OR GAMES.
- ☐ Coaches are responsible for tracking absences for the purpose of noting potential COVID-19 cases.
- ☐ Public health will be contacted if a positive case of COVID-19 is reported.

On June 15th, 2020 baseball and softball competitions may begin. We are currently working on and waiting for extended guidance from the athletic associations on the game expectations. More information will be shared in the near future on competition guidelines that will be in place.
