Riverside Moves Forward to Address Facility Issues

Since the voters rejected two attempts to pass a Voter-Approved Physical, Plant and Equipment Levy (PPEL) to replace the HVAC systems at the Oakland Elementary and Carson Elementary schools, the Riverside School Board has been studying all potential facility options to address the ongoing issues. Through this process they have been trying to determine what is in the best interest of the students, staff, and community along with being economical long-term. They have reviewed proposals to have the HVAC systems retrofitted. This work would include furnishing the current system with updated parts and replace some equipment to make the system functional. The Board worked with various contractors to vet proposals to perform the needed work. They also contracted, required by Iowa law, an engineer and architect. The planning has been a balancing act as the Board does not want to spend unneeded resources on the project.

First Priority-Short-term-HVAC Retrofit at Oakland Elementary

- Monday April 20, 2020-School Board held a Public Hearing for Plans, Specifications and Form of Contract for Oakland Elementary HVAC Retrofit Project
- Monday April 20, 2020-School Board approved Plan to Retrofit HVAC System at Oakland Elementary School
- o Tuesday April 21, 2020-Project was announced for Bid
- Monday April 27, 2020-School Board has set a Public Hearing for 6:30 PM to refinance \$6,000,000 SAVE (Sales Tax) Bonds
- o Monday May 25, 2020-Project to be awarded to low bidder
- Tuesday September I, 2020-Expected Completion

The \$6,000,000 is current Secure an Advanced Vision for Education (SAVE) Debt on the new building. This funding stream was formerly known as the statewide school infrastructure sales and services tax and known as the local option sales and services tax for school infrastructure. On the recommendation from the district Financial Advisor the district will refinance the current SAVE Debt. This takes advantage of lower interest rates in the municipal bond market. The savings will be used for purposes identified by our voter approved Revenue Purpose Statement-infrastructure development. The money is committed to making the immediate repairs to the Oakland School HVAC system. No longer a replacement just repairs/retrofit to keep the building functional. This will not increase taxes.

The Board has committed to doing the work to get various long-term plans presented and then one approved by the public. This will include taking the time to have everyone review all options and the Board being fully transparent with the community to address all the questions and issues. The Board is taking the lead and will determine a viable long-term facility option that a majority can support. The district has contracted Studio Melee Architects to complete the Comprehensive Facility Study and provide information on several potential long-term options to the public. We would emphasize that any plan moving forward should be designed to keep the needs of our students at the forefront and unify Riverside taking into consideration the "Three Communities United as One" mentality. The plan should allow for Macedonia, Carson and Oakland residents to continue to retain and attract students and families to Riverside.

 facility options and further develop the pros and cons of each. Will move forward by setting up Zoom
 meetings with staff with input collected with a Survey.

- On Hold-Meeting 5: Final community presentation and ranking.







School Closure for the 2019-2020 School Year

As you may already know, Governor Reynolds expanded the closure of schools in Iowa for the rest of the 2019-2020 school year. Even with the closure, we are committed to continuing our efforts to provide continuous learning opportunities to our students.

When will the school year end?

Even though learning has looked different over the last four weeks, opportunities have still been provided for students. Because of this, the State of lowa has approved or forgiven these days, and the days moving forward. We will plan on ending the school year on the regularly scheduled dismissal date of May 22, 2020.

Continuous Learning:

On Wednesday April 8, 2020, the Riverside Community School Board School Board approved the Response and Emergency Suspension of Policy Resolution and the Continuous Learning Plan that included implementation of Voluntary Educational Enrichment Opportunities for all students.

Voluntary - All activities are optional, no grades may be given or changed, attendance is not taken.

This decision was made using feedback from staff. It was determined that many students have roadblocks that limit or prohibit learning during this time. The state has given the directive to choose the route that is the best for the district as a whole and negatively impacts the least number of students. Many of our students and parents/guardians do not have the structure, time, or resources that would allow them to meet the demands of required services.

Governor's Recommendation on School Closure

lowa schools will remain closed for the 2019-2020 year. The Spring Sports Season has been cancelled. The district will need to complete and submit a return to Learning Plan by July 1, 2020 to the lowa Department of Education.

Riverside Guiding Principles During School Closure

As Riverside continues to navigate our current situation and work with the lowa Department of Education and lowa Department of Public Health, there are five guiding principles that remain at the forefront of every decision and action.

- 1. Health and safety is the first consideration.
- 2. Children with disabilities are entitled to an equal opportunity for participation in any service provided by a district, including modifications and supplementary aids and supports as necessary.
- 3.To the extent practicable, strive to maintain a sense of normalcy for children with disabilities during this public health emergency.
- 4.To the extent that health and safety come into tension with an administrative or procedural requirement, default in favor of health and safety and consider responding to the administrative or procedural requirements once this public health emergency has resolved.
- 5.Parents must be involved in any decision about an individual child's placement or services under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), Early ACCESS, or Section 504.

When will the school year end?

Even though learning has looked different over the last four weeks, opportunities have still been provided for students. Because of this, the State of Iowa has approved or forgiven these days, and the days moving forward. We will plan on ending the school year on the regularly scheduled dismissal date of May 22, 2020.

Continuous Learning

On Wednesday April 8, 2020, the Riverside Community School Board School Board approved the Response and Emergency Suspension of Policy Resolution and the Continuous Learning Plan that included implementation of Voluntary Educational Enrichment Opportunities for all students.

Voluntary - All activities are optional, no grades may be given or changed, attendance is not taken.

This decision was made using feedback from staff. It was determined that many students have roadblocks that limit or prohibit learning during this time. The state has given the directive to choose the route that is the best for the district as a whole and negatively impacts the least number of students. Many of our students and parents/guardians do not have the structure, time, or resources that would allow them to meet the demands of required services.

Our planned learning activities, though voluntary, allow students to continue to move forward academically through the remainder of the school year. They can attend sessions with teachers via Zoom or other online tools, watch educational videos our teachers have created, and complete assignments and supplementary activities provided by our teachers. Even though we are not taking attendance and cannot provide grades or extra credit points, we can provide feedback and help students work through their learning to be better prepared for next year. Attendance isn't required, but we highly encourage all students to participate in whatever learning opportunities they are able, to help them be better prepared for next year.

Parents/Guardians, if you would like to require or encourage your students to complete learning activities, you are more than welcome to and we would be able to provide you with any participation data that we collect on your child. We want to work with you to provide a meaningful learning experience for all students. Those who participate will have an opportunity to be better prepared for next year.

How will we get students personal belongings back to them?

Administration and Program Directors have met and have outlined the basics of our plan. The Building Administration will finalize plans for each building. The state issued verbal guidance that we will follow, and they have also advised having school legal review our plan before implementation. The state will be announcing formal written guidance in the future. A formal plan with sign-up sheets with times to come to the building and pick up students belongs and then distribute to students and parents will be ready soon.

How will we get school equipment back from students?

We will be working with Callie Kallsen to set up library book drop-off stations during the Meal Service each Monday. Many schools and now we are considering allowing computers to stay home through the summer. This could help us provide summer enrichment activities prior to the start of next year. More on this later.

Will meals last throughout the summer?

The meal program ("Grab N Go" on Mondays) will continue if the federal program will allow. Right now, that is through May 22, 2020. Unless this program is expanded, we will switch to not providing meals during the summer because we as a district do not qualify for the summer food program. These are the federal guidelines for this program. We will on April 27, 2020 start having parents sign permission slips if the food is delivered. This will be completed by email. Each person requesting delivery will need to supply us an email address so we can collect a permission form including the names of the students getting the meals.

The four distribution centers are:

- Oakland Elementary School-Door F-East Door on North Side of Building
- Riverside Middle/High School-Front Doors
- Carson Elementary School-Door C on West side of building
- Post Office in Macedonia on Main Street-School Vehicle will be park on Main Street

Distribution Dates Meals will be Mondays (May 4, May 11, May 18)

What will my student's grade be for their classes this spring?

Students will receive credit for their 2nd semester classes at the letter grade they had when school first closed on March 16. The state does allow us to give credit for assignments/test/quizzes/projects that were assigned prior to that date but will not allow the school to post the grade until school ends. Students who are missing any assignments will be allowed to turn them in to teachers any time between now and May 22, and the grade will be entered on May 25, 2020. Students, please contact your teacher(s) to see if you have any missing assignments. We will continue to evaluate and discuss senior grades and credits towards graduation eligibility and communicate with students and families. The due date for Seniors to complete work is May 1, 2020 for Riverside classes. Students who are taking Concurrent Enrolment (college credit classes) must meet the requirements determined by the credit granting institution. The final determination of determining final credits and final grades will be based upon any additional guidance received from the Iowa Department of Education. We are told this guidance should be ready by next Tuesday (April 28, 2020)

Will my student move on to the next grade?

Students will move on to the next grade. Some conversations have already taken place this year regarding the retention of a student. Those conversations will still take place to determine that individual student's progression.

Will we have Prom, Spring Sports, Club Activities, or Summer Sports?

Due to the extended closure, the earliest we would start sports or other activities would be June 10, 2020. Spring sports have been cancelled by the Athletic Associations for this year. We will not schedule any summer sports, summer workouts/practices, activities until we have guidance that indicates we can resume these activities safely. Prom has been tentatively scheduled for Saturday June 27, 2020.

What about Graduation, Spring Sports Banquet, National Honor Society Induction and Scholarship Night? We have met with Senior students and staff from the MS/HS and made preliminary plans for these events. We will be making sure these plans adhere with guidance from the CDC and the IDPH. We will be announcing these plans once legal counsel has approved them. We hope to go public soon.

When will Riverside Childcare reopen?

With the school closure we will continue to rely on guidance from the CDC and IDPH. Riverside Childcare will remain closed until June 1, 2020. We will review guidance on a regular basis and keep you update.

Riverside 5th grade students had the opportunity to complete a pay it forward project made possible by the Realtor Foundation of Iowa. Our students donated the \$500 grant to our local food pantries. The cash and food items were donated to the food pantries in Oakland and Macedonia. The students thought that helping those in our community was important, especially during these times.





Special School Board Meeting Monday April 27, 2020

Agenda

Public Hearing-6:30 PM---Proposed Issuance of Approximately \$6,000,000 School Infrastructure Sales, Services and Use Tax Revenue and Refunding Bonds---The \$6,000,000 is current Secure an Advanced Vision for Education (SAVE) Debt on the new building. This funding stream was formerly known as the statewide school infrastructure sales and services tax and known as the local option sales and services tax for school infrastructure. On the recommendation from the district Financial Advisor the district will refinance the current SAVE Debt. This takes advantage of lower interest rates in the municipal bond market. The savings will be used for purposes identified by our voter approved Revenue Purpose Statement-infrastructure development. The money is committed to making the immediate repairs to the Oakland School HVAC system. No longer a replacement just repairs/retrofit to keep the building functional. This will not increase taxes.

lowa Code Section 423F.4(2) requires that the Board of Directors hold a public hearing on the proposed issuance of sales tax and refunding bonds, and that the electors be given fourteen days following the hearing in which to file a petition with the Board Secretary requesting an election on the bond issuance. The petition must be signed by eligible electors equal in number to not less than one hundred or thirty percent of those voting at the last preceding election of school officials under lowa Code Section 277.1, whichever is greater. If a valid petition is not filed within the fourteen-day period following the public hearing, no action may be brought questioning the legality of the bonds, the authority to issue the bonds, or any of the proceedings in connection with the issuance of the bonds.




