


Riverside Allergy Awareness (Mr. Meek)

How did the environment of the classroom help you succeed?


What learning activities helped you succeed?

Facility Options

Comprehensive Facility Study-Preliminary Meeting

The Board is looking at all options trying to determine what is in the best interest of the students, staff and, community along with being economical long-term. They are reviewing whether the HVAC systems can be retrofit (to furnish the current system with updated parts) or replaced (to put an entire new system in place-this is what was originally was proposed). The Board is working with various contractors to vet proposals to perform the needed work to make sure the system gets through the next year. This will be a balancing act as they do not want to spend unneeded resources on repairs if the retrofit or replacement

The Board has committed to doing the work to get various plans presented and then one approved by the public. This will include taking the time to review more options and be fully transparent with the community to address all the questions and issues they may have. At this point, however, the community has not reached consensus on what it wants to do with facilities long-term. So, the Board must take lead and provide a viable option that the majority can support both short-term and long-

The district is currently working with Studio Melee Architects to complete a Comprehensive Facility Study and provide information on several potential options to move forward. Some preliminary options and plans have been drafted for the administration and Board Facility Committee to review.

The scope has now been expanded from just fixing the HVAC systems to a determining of a long-term approach to all the facility issues in the district. This process is likely to take, an extended period and the district will not be pursuing any issue at the November election.

We would emphasize that any plan moving forward should be designed to keep the needs of our students at the forefront and unify Riverside taking into consideration the "Three Communities United as One" mentality. The plan should allow for Macedonia, Carson and Oakland to continue to retain and attract students and families to Riverside.

When completed several options will be presented to staff and community in several Listening Session to gather further input on several options. Each option with be presented with an estimate cost and how the district would finance each option.

Current Facility Options Under Review

Concept A-(Two Buildings) Move all the Grade K-5 students to one site-the current building in Carson (Riverside Child Care and Preschool off-site)

Approximately 305 students in Carson

Concept B-(Two Buildings) Move all the Grade PK-4 students to one site-the current building in Carson and Move 5th Grade to Middle/High School

Approximately 280 students in Carson

Approximately 350 students in Middle/High School

Concept C-(Two Buildings) Move PK-5th Grade to Oakland Elementary School

Approximately 336 students in Oakland

Concept D-(Two Buildings) Move 5th Grade to Middle/High School Building and PK-4th Grade to Oakland Approximately 280 students in Oakland Elementary School

Approximately 350 students in Middle/High School

Concept E-Build a New Building attached or on the site with the Middle/High School

Items to be addressed Moving Forward:

- Drop any three building options
- Utilize all under utilized space in current buildings
- Include Pre-School and Riverside Childcare onsite in all options
- All new construction (if needed) be at the Middle/High School Site Need to include HVAC Replacement or Retrofit in each proposal
- Need to Consider Location of Bus Barn if vacating Oakland
- At all sites need to consider need for playgrounds, parking lots and office space
- Need to take into consideration debt passed on to future Boards
- Need to decide about roof at Oakland Elementary-no matter what option chosen
- Additional classroom space at Oakland should be from remodeling the gym area and building a lower cost addition that would be the gym and lunchroom
- Others??



DURING THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER RIVERSIDE PK-5 IS LEARNING AND PRACTICING HOW TO SHOW BULLDOG POWER IN THE

HALLWAY

DISCUSS WITH YOUR STUDENT WAYS TO SHOW BULLDOG POWER IN THE HALLWAY THIS MONTH



Second graders have been learning about matter. They did an experiment to test which toilet paper was the best. They each made a claim about the strongest and the most absorbent of water. Then, they got to find evidence to prove their claim. They used their sense of touch to rate toilet paper from roughest to softest. They also tested the strength by putting 10 drops of water on the toilet paper and placing quarters on top. The last step was testing how many drops of water it could hold before water leaked to the desk. The students LOVED investigating to find which was the

best! In Mrs. Hart's class they found that the best toilet paper was Charmin Ultra Soft for texture, strength, and absorbency. The least soft, strong, and absorbent toilet papers was a tie between Angel Soft Ultra and Dollar General. (Thanks, Barb Hart)







Which toilet paper is the best? (Lisa Hummel)

The students brought in rolls of toilet paper to test for softness, strength, and



absorbency. They made claims and used the results from their experiments to write their evidence like a scientist. The texture test was opinion based. For absorbency, they used a suspended toilet paper to see how many droplets of water it takes for it to leak. For strength, they used suspended toilet paper again and stacked pennies on top until it ripped.

The students decided that the overall best toilet paper was the paper that was both strong and soft. They didn't think absorbency

was too much of a factor. The toilet paper the evidence showed that was the best using those two categories was Cottonelle Ultra Clean Care.


6-12th grades would be given \$2000 to do as they wish as part of her "Do Good Deeds" holiday she made up. Nicole was in the first graduating class of Riverside.






Make-up Days

They are reviewing whether the HVAC systems can be retrofit (to furnish the current system with updated parts) or replaced (to put an entire new system in place-this is what was originally was proposed). The Board is working with various contractors to vet proposals to perform the needed work to make sure the system gets through the next year. This will be a balancing act as they do not want to spend unneeded resources on repairs if the retrofit or replacement becomes inevitable. The Board has committed to doing the work to get various plans presented and then one approved by the public. This will include taking the time to review more options and be fully transparent with the community to address all the questions and issues they may have. At this point, however, the community has not reached consensus on what it wants to do with facilities long-term. So, the Board must take lead and provide a viable option that the majority can support both short-term and long-term. The district is currently working with Studio Melee Architects to complete a Comprehensive Facility Study and provide information on several potential options to move forward. Some preliminary options and plans have been drafted for the administration and Board Facility Committee to review. The scope has now been expanded from just fixing the HVAC systems to a determining of a long-term approach to all the facility issues in the district. This process is likely to take, an extended period and the district will not be pursuing any issue at the November election. More information can be found attached to the agenda.
