

- Will collect and review all options-to determine what is most economical long-term for the district before making any decisions about moving forward
- Key decision for the HVAC Systems: Retrofit or Replace-Will collect advantages and disadvantages to determine what makes most sense for the district before making any decisions about moving forward
- Will do the work to get a plan approved that is in the best interest of the students and staff as well as most economical long term for the district
- 4. # Next Steps

- What minimal cost options are available to ensure heating and cooling in Oakland and Carson for short-term
  - Portable Heating (Temporary Boiler) in Oakland for 2019-2020 school year
  - o Temporary use of individual units in each room at Oakland and Carson as needed
  - Boiler Tune-up at Oakland & Carson
  - Boiler Burner Replacement at Oakland & Carson
  - o Install new control system with minor limited repairs HVAC System in Oakland

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Effective April 1, Riverside is pleased to offer PayForIt to our parents to pay fees, fines and lunch balances online. Parents will also be able to check payment history, review purchases and set up automated email reminders.



# What is PayForlt?

PayForIt (PFI) is a Secure Online Payment system which simplifies payment, collection and balancing of funds for School Districts. It enables parents to pay fees, fines and fund accounts quickly and easily online. PayForlt allows parents to opt into and manage email reminders about their student's accounts.

# Benefite

- ✓ Using PFI, secretaries spend less time taking cash at the serving lines, so students have more time to eat. Additionally, there is not a chance of lost lunch money from home to the serving lines or building offices.
- Payments can be made by credit card or electronic check 24 hours a day, 7 days a week at the parents'
- Parents can review what their students are actually purchasing along with account balance information.
- PFI supports increased communication between the school & the parents.

- Parents can opt to receive an email when a family balance dips to a certain threshold (set by the parent).
- Parents can opt to use an automatic payment feature which replenishes their family account(s) when a balance dips to a specific level (specified by the parent).
- School messages are automatically emailed to parents.
- A continuous online survey is provided to monitor parent feedback and ideas.
- Student information is automatically transferred from year-to-year and from school-to-school.
- Parents can manage more than one student account. PFI is PCI, or Payment Card Industry, compliant and maintains industry standard SSL certificates. This ensures all data is safe & secure as defined by the industry.

# How to slan up

## Log on to www.payforit.net.

Select the "Sign Up" option from the menu. The screens will guide you through the process to establish your

- 1. The internet convenience fee will be charged at 4.00% per credit card charges and \$1.75 per electronic
- 2. You will be prompted to enter your contact data, password, payment information, etc.;
- You will need to indicate which student(s) to attach to your account. Student names must be entered exactly the same as they appear in JMC (Riverside's student information system). Students are already loaded in the PFI system from JMC so the names must match exactly. PFI utilizes the same student ID number already used throughout Riverside's student information system. If you are unsure of your student's ID number, you can check it in your JMC online access account, or contact your child's building.
- 4. Once you have an account, you can choose to pay lunch balances, fees and fines at school using a credit

Once all information is entered. PFI will email a validation code for you to confirm the registration. Once confirmed you can begin using PFI as often as you'd like.

How Do I ... Each major function used in PFI, has online help available under the menu option of "How Do I ...". The "How Do I" provides step by step instructions as well as screen examples.

FAQ: When starting to use PFI, it is a good idea to review the Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) available within the Help



The Board is looking at all options trying to determine what is in the best interest of the students, staff and, community along with being economical long-term. They are reviewing whether the HVAC systems can be retrofit (to furnish the current system with updated parts) or replaced (to put an entire new system in place-this is what was originally was proposed). The Board is working with various contractors to vet proposals to perform the needed work to make sure the system gets through the next year. This will be a balancing act as they do not want to spend unneeded resources on repairs if the retrofit or replacement becomes inevitable. The Board has committed to doing the work to get a plan present and approved by the public. This will include taking the time to review more options and be fully transparent with the community to address all the questions and issues they may have. At this point, however, the community has not reached consensus on what it wants to do with facilities long-term. So, the Board must take lead and provide a viable option that the majority can support both shortterm and long-term

Six days in and what a great start to our school year. Staff members are working building relationships with their new students and working on routines for their classrooms. A few tears are always shed, but everyone has begun moving and getting used to the new schedules. After the first couple days, it looks just like a regular school day. When you are talking to your children about the new school year, make sure to ask them about schedules and what their daily routine looks like. For many of them, it is new and can be scary, but we always make it through and it gets better. When you have questions, please do not hesitate to contact your child's teacher or school to get those questions answered. At the Oakland Elementary (PK-2nd) and Carson Elementary (3rd-5th) schools, we are working on continuing for Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports, or PBIS where we use specific lesson plans to teach students about positive behaviors in various areas of the school: hallways, lunchroom, buses, recess, and a few other areas. The first few days of school we took time to teach each student our expectations for these areas around the school so that each student sees and hears the positive expectations for behavior. We are excited about this new opportunity to teach our students some new expectations and also some new ways for us to celebrate our great students!

There have been a few changes this summer as we have moved 3rd grade to Carson and we revamped a few classrooms there to help with the new students in the building. We have a playground on the way and we will be asking for volunteers soon to get together and build the playground for our students to start using. In the next 1-2 months there will be a significant change in the Northeast corner of our property as we build a playground and then put in a basketball court for the students to use.

Over the last few years in my newsletter articles, I stressed having open and honest communication with your child's teachers, myself, anyone associated with the school, or a question about a school policy. Over the past few years, it has become increasingly easy to get on social media and ask questions about the school, your child's classroom, or something that happened at school. In my experiences, this type of discussion has led to a lot of wrong information, a misunderstanding about your question or concern, and sometimes hurt feelings over the wrong information. I would always suggest that you contact your child's teacher first, phone or email, or check with me to get your answer before using social media. If you want your child's experience and your experience to be the most positive, talk with them when an issue comes up. Be open with problems that your child is having at school, even if your child asks you not to talk to the school. Send emails or make phone calls so that everyone who is in contact with your child is on the same page. We want everyone in the community, all families, students, and staff to have the best Riverside experience that they can!






