We have recently seen an increase in students misbehav-

ing on the school bus. Please speak with your child(ren) about the expected behaviors on the bus: stay in their seats, face the front, hands to themselves, appropriate language, inside voice, and respect others. Students who do not follow these expectations will be suspended from the bus and may be removed from the bus permanently. Hopefully we can work together to resolve these issues.

The district is happy to announce that we will be launching a new anonymous reporting system. It is called StopIt Solutions. Students and families can report issues to the school that they feel need to be reported. Issues like bullying, harassment, and if a student might be in danger. It is an app that students can download on their phones. It will also be used as a communication tool to let students know information like school delays, sports/activities cancellations, and other news. More information will be going out to families in the coming weeks.

ExCEL Winners

Aliah Warga and Nicholas Kulla are this year's ExCEL Award representatives from Upsala. ExCEL stands for "Excellence in Community, Education and Leadership" and is a unique recognition program sponsored by the MSHSL. It is for high school juniors who are active in school activities, who show leadership qualities, and who are model citizens.



Our classes have been very busy this year! Our welding class has learned all of the fundamentals of the different welding processes and have been busy exploring the new technology pieces that we have: the new Arclight plasma table and the waterjet. These students have lots of ability and embrace the use of technology as well as being good welders!

Our woods class last semester made lots of beautiful projects and also completed a shed that the preschool will be using to store toys outside. This was a great experience, most of the students had not done any construction type of work, and we all learned a lot! This spring sees a continuing class of experienced woods students and a new class of intro to woods, (mostly sophomores) that did not get to make a woods project in eighth grade, because of covid. We will work hard to catch up on some basic woodworking skills and safety in using machines.



Eighth grade had a good introduction to the world of Agriculture and also all completed a wood project last fall, so we are caught up with those skills! We had a Freshman Intro to Ag Science class that learned forestry, animal science, and soil conservation. We capped off that class with getting those students into the wood shop also, which was very rewarding! They really appreciated that opportunity and many want to take woodworking classes again! Ag Food Science last semester earned a chemistry credit learning how food ingredients react with each other to make tasty things happen in the kitchen, and applied that knowledge and learned new skills and techniques to pull that information all together.

Animal Science/Veterinary Technology is learning about animal diseases, processes and systems of the body, medical terminology and functions of organs so far. As the semester progresses we will be doing work with live animals to learn about examinations for health, how to give injections and treatments and animal handling and restraint. We have had discussions about animal welfare and animal rights nearly every day!

This spring our seventh grade class will be working hard in the greenhouse, doing our usual magic to make customer dreams come true with veggies, hanging baskets and beautiful ornamentals. Along the way we will learn lots of plant science basics, labs that teach plant care and design of arrangements. Students will be coached in customer service and sales, and learn how to ask questions as they consult with customers to meet expectations. Seed and plant supplies are super tight this year, but we have things pretty well in line to produce what we need. We usually open the first Saturday in May, stay tuned for more information on when spring sales start! Information is posted on the Upsala School Greenhouse Facebook page.



Our FFA chapter is in a bit of a rebuilding year, since during covid restrictions we were not able to compete in person for two years, and also were unable to attend many gatherings. So, not a lot of teams competing this year. Some young members did compete in Livestock Evaluation in September for the first time and definitely enjoyed it! Evie Aleckson, Sierra Bense, Keyona Carlson, Victoria Wiechman and Hailie Luedtke were on the team.

We did a great fruit sale in November/December with wonderful community support! Our chapter was the host for our Region FFA Horse Judging event in November, unfortunately this advisor was out with emergency surgery that day. Our wonderful FFA Alumni stepped in to help make that event a total success! Over 125 students and advisors attended that event which was held at Rocking R Farm near Foley.



We are getting our chapter members together with some fun activities! We had some students attend the FFA Fall Leadership Rally and took all of the Ag Classes (more than 50 students) to the FFA Winter Leadership rally in Brainerd in February.

In January, our chapter got together for a fun night of moonlight bowling, which was a great time! For National FFA Week in February, our chapter leaders worked extremely hard to plan and deliver fun and educational activities each day of FFA Week, capped off

on the last day with Ag Olympic games for the entire 7-12 classes. For the elementary students, FFA members did fun and informative activities with classes such as making butter, soil pudding cups, reading books to classes and held a scavenger hunt for the whole school!

As soon as FFA week wraps up we will be planning our petting zoo for this spring, which the community really loves!

We want to thank Tractor Supply of Little Falls with a kind donation of welding supplies, Central Minnesota Builders Association for a grant to purchase a new router and Kreg table for the wood shop, Sunrise Ag cooperative for a grant for our FFA chapter that we can use to defray the cost of FFA jackets and costs for events and leadership camps. We have had some real blessings. Also a shout out to Kremers construction for the timely repair of the greenhouse, we would not be able to do class this spring without your help! Many blessings we have had this year!


ONE ACT PLAY






