

-known to use his powers to coerce people to fall in love.


People were afraid of this being who had the power to make people fall in love. He had the ability to cause destruction through the strongest feeling, love. This caused a poor deception of Greek Mythology.



## NOTTING HILL


## RATING: SA SA SA



# What 2022 will look like (according to 1922 Experts)

Obviously, we all know what daily life looks like in 2022 (so far). Most of us have a daily routine that is filled with work, school, and hobbies. Cars line up for miles on end rushing to get to a specific place, and planes roar by overhead flying at 500 miles per hour. This is nothing new to those of us who see this everyday and are accustomed to this way of life, but experts in 1922 had no idea what the future would hold; despite this, they definitely had their own opinions about what it would look like.

In a recent article, Akron Beacon Journal discussed an English author, W.L. George (1882-1926), who "was nothing short of a visionary when he imagined the amazing, remarkable world of 2022." Many of his prophecies came true, such as "commercial flying will have become entirely commonplace. The passenger steamer will survive on the coasts, but it will have disappeared on the main routes, and will have been replaced by flying convoys," and "the movies will be more attractive, as long before 2022 they will have been replaced by the kinephone, which now exists only in the laboratory. That is, the figures on the screen will not only move, but they will have their natural colors and speak with ordinary voices." George also believed that "As regards the United States in particular, it is likely that the country will have come to a complete settlement, with a population of about 240,000,000." While many of his prophecies did, in fact, become reality, some were a little more farfetched than others. George wrote in an article, "It is conceivable, though not certain, that in 2022 a complete meal may be taken in the shape of

four pills. This is not entirely visionary; I am convinced that corned beef hash and pumpkin pie will still exist," Can you imagine a world without real meals? Hundreds of thousands of people would lose their jobs in the restaurant industry because there would no longer be a need for fancy food that is expensive when there's an easier, faster, and healthier option available. Not to mention how different grocery stores would become, along with farms and food festivals. George also predicted that "the people of the year 2022 will probably never see a wire outlined against the sky: it is practically certain that wireless telegraphy and wireless telephones will have crushed the cable system long before the century is done." Of course, we know that pills are not consumed for the purpose of dietary supplements and telephone poles still line the streets transfering millions of text messages every day, but it is laughable to imagine a world with these subtle but crazy differences.

New York professor Ferdinand Shuler predicted that in 2022, "Manhattan [will be a] Utopian metropolis of sky-scrapers, moving sidewalks and canals instead of streets. Rolling sidewalks operated by electromagnetic power would connect buildings, anti-gravity screens would prevent airplanes from falling out of the sky, luxury airships would have elevators, rolling floors, swimming pools and 'practically every convenience,' and trains would travel on glass plates and reach speeds of 200 mph." (Shown in the picture above) Shuler was presumably expecting technology to develop astronomically in the span of 100 years.

A scientist named Charles P. Steinmetz studied electrical power in 1922, and he believed that humans would find a way to harness the sun's energy. He described, "I could imagine a great structure under glass of magnifying power which could concentrate the sun's rays." It is incredible to say the least that this technology was actually created and is often used today. (In case you missed it, he was predicting the invention of solar panels) While many of the predictions made a century ago have not been made yet, that is not to say that they never will.


## JOSHUA TREE NATIONAL PARK

# The Saint Valentine's Day Massacre

The Saint Valentine's Day Massacre occurred in Chicago on Valentine's Day in 1929, when seven men associated with Al Capone's rival George "Bugs" Moran were shot in a garage on Chicago's North Side. The seven men were shot by several men dressed in police uniforms.

The Saint Valentine's Day Massacre has remained unsolved but many people have linked it to Al Capone because his rival George "Bugs" Moran was on his way to the garage where the men were shot, Bugs missed getting shot by a matter of minutes which made people believe Al Capone could have been attempting to eliminate another one of his rivals.

Al Capone would kill by gunning down his enemies in a very similar way the killings were committed.

## Who was Al Capone?

Al "Scarface" Capone took over in 1925 when he started slowly becoming a legendary crime lord. In the 1920s gangs were at an all time high, especially when alcohol became illegal, many mobsters started bootlegging, mobsters also ran prostitution rings and gambling where they began making alot of money. By 1927 Al Capone had a net worth of around \$100 million and it was estimated that Capone made around 60 million dollars a year but nobody knows for sure because the term money laundering is actually from Al Capone because he would set up laundromats across the city to cover up his earnings.

The way Al Capone slowly gained power over all of Chicago was by taking out each one of his rivals at a time. At one point authorities counted up to 64 murders in one year. Although the FBI at the time knew about some of Al Capone's doings they were unable to catch him because the FBI had much less power than they have today, and one thing the FBI did not have jurisdiction over was Chicago's gang activity.

Al Capone even had a house on the nearby lake Wawasee, the house wasn't very glamorous because he used it as a hideout a lot, he also used to stay and dine at the infamous Barbee Hotel. Al Capone committed many crimes but it is still unknown to this day if he was responsible for the infamous events that happened on that fatal Valentine's Day in 1929.

## True Crime with Kelaney

Paul Bernardo and Karla Holmolka met in 1987 at a Hotel Restaurant, Bernardo was 23 at the time while Holmolka was only 17. According to witnesses they said the couple hit it off instantly which was shocking because neither Bernardo nor Holmolka had ever been like that towards anyone before. They had the picture perfect relationship, seeing each other on a regular basis. Bernardo was committing crimes on a regular basis which were never even linked to him until 1993 after a DNA test.

By December 23rd, 1990, Holmolka and Bernardo were engaged and that's when Bernardo admitted that he had feelings for Holmolka's younger sister, Tammy. That night as a Christmas gift Holmolka surprised Bernardo with Tammy who was rendered unconscious, but unfortunately the young Tammy fell into an overdose during the event. Holmolka and Bernardo quickly cleaned her up, put her in new clothes, and put her in her bed before calling the police.

The overdose was caused by the chemicals that were used to knock her unconscious. Tammy's death was ruled as accidental because when it was questioned what happened Bernardo and Holmolka told everyone that Tammy wanted to drink what they were drinking so they let her have some but she just kept drinking more and more.

There were chemical burns on Tammy's body but not even the doctors thought to question the burns because no one suspected that Bernardo or Holmolka could have done anything to Tammy, it was just a "tragic accident".

On June 15,1991, Leslie Mahaffy came home late but when she got to her house, her parents had already locked the doors. Bernardo was out looking for a license plate to steal when he caught sight of the 14 year old Leslie. She approached Bernardo asking him if he had a cigarette. Bernardo swiftly shoved Leslie in the back of his car and blindfolded her.

Holmolka and Bernardo then videotaped the crimes against young Leslie. She fatally passed after Bernardo strangled her, although Bernardo later claimed Holmolka overdosed her. Leslie's body was then encased in several different cement blocks.

On June 16th, Holmolka and Bernardo had family over for Father's Day, while Leslie's remains were still in their basement. Later that day Bernardo and Holmolka took turns throwing the cement blocks into Lake Gibson.

Bernardo and Holmolka got married on June 29th, Leslie's remains were recovered as well that same day after a father and son spotted one of the cement blocks and called the police. The only way they could tell the remains were Leslie's was through dental records.


On April 16,1992, Holmolka and Bernardo had been driving around St. Catherine's looking for their next victim. Holmolka went up to 15 year old Kristen French when Kristen was in a church parking lot, on her way from school. Holmolka asked Kristen for directions and when Kristen was distracted Bernardo came up behind Kristen and forced her into his car. Kristen's parents quickly reported her missing when she didn't show up home from school. Police found Kristen's shoe and a torn map in the church parking lot, the police also was able to get several witness testimonies.

Over the next three days Holmolka and Bernardo again videotaped their crimes and kept Kristen drugged to keep her compliant. Kristen was strangled by Bernardo while Holmolka watched, Kristen's body was found in a ditch in the town of Burlington which is 45 minutes from St. Catherine's. On May 15th, The Green Ribbon task force formed to investigate the murders of Leslie and Kristen.

On December 27th, 1992, Holmolka went to police covered in bruises claiming Bernardo beat her with a flashlight. Holmolka also told police about the murders but said that Bernardo did everything. The police gave Holmolka a plea deal charging her with a 12 year sentence in exchange for her testimony against Bernardo. On September 22nd, 1993, Police got ahold of the tapes and quickly realized Holmolka was not a victim, she was an accomplice.

The plea deal already happenend, it was too late to ever charge Holmolka and it is now known as the "Deal with the Devil". There was a media ban over the trial so nobody knew what was happening. Holmolka was on stand for 17 days and according to people that were in the court room, when police played the tapes of the girls everyone became ill saying it was scarring and someone even ran out of the room. Bernardo was charged with life in prison, while Holmolka got out in 2005.

Holmolka has now changed her name completely, has gotten remarried, and has sons now. Holmolka is a completely free woman and she is not even recognizable, she also has no contact with her family since they cut her off after they found out what really happenend to Tammy.





# Audrey Hepburn

She's Holly Golightly from *Breakfast at Tiffany's*, Sabrina Fairchild from *Sabrina*, Eliza Doolittle from *My Fair Lady*, Princess Ann from *Roman Holiday*, Regina Lampert from *Charade*, and Jo Stockton from *Funny Face*. Who is she?

She's Audrey Hepburn.

Born in Brussels, Belgium in 1929, Audrey Hepburn's childhood was mired in war, starvation, and tragedy. At the age of ten, Hepburn's father decided to relocate her to the Netherlands in the hopes of avoiding the dangers of World War Two. While still managing to attend school and learn ballet, Hepburn was limited in the joys of life as the war caused endless food shortages and constant death. After the war, Audrey Hepburn continued to study ballet, moving to Amsterdam and, later, London. By her twenties, Hepburn had gained experience in modeling, dancing, and acting. It was while filming a movie called Monte-Carlo that Hepburn drew the attention of the writer of Gigi, the newest stage adaption added to Broadway. Bringing in high compliments for her role in the breakout Broadway film, Hepburn's name began to be known throughout the acting world. Her next project took her to Rome, where she played the lead role in a film titled Roman Holiday. Winning an Academy Award for best actress, Audrey Hepburn's career was rapidly elevated to astonishing heights. Starring in films and plays like Ondine, Sabrina, Funny Face, War and Peace, and The Nun's Story. Through her career, Hepburn became a fashion icon, infamously representing the designer Hubert de Givenchy. After starring in Breakfast at Tiffany's, Charade, My Fair Lady, and Wait Until Dark, she took a break from acting to focus on her family. Hepburn eventually retired from acting to pursue her new career as an ambassador for UNICEF. For the rest of her life, she would continue her humanitarian work until her cancer-related death in 1993. Audrey Hepburn was an amazing woman, mother, actress, and humanitarian, but, most of all, she is a reminder that adversity does not have to limit your potential or your ability to change the world for the better.


