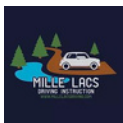
EMR Full Course

PRESCHOOL CLASSES

Preschool open enrollment begins April 1st!

We have preschool classes serving children ages 3 (by September 1st) to start of Kindergarten.

Little Miners (3 yr olds) ★★★★★

These classes are full of developmentally appropriate activities just right for your 3 year old.

Child must be 3 years old by September 1 of the current school year and potty trained in order to attend.

The class offers learning opportunities that foster growth in the following areas: cognitive, communication, motor, self-help, and social-emotional development.

Interested families should contact staff at the CRES Little Rangers Family Center for more information.

Little Rangers (School Readiness) ★★★★★

These classes provide children with opportunities to participate with other children in a school setting in order to prepare them for success in Kindergarten.

Children must be 4 or 5 years old by September 1 of the current school year in order to attend.

Class activities include self directed learning centers, circle time, learning stations, art projects, music, finger plays, snack, small and large muscle time in the gym or outside, if weather permits.



Both the Little Miners & Little Rangers programs are rated as 4 star Parent Aware programs.

A 4 star program is the highest rating and means:

These programs have demonstrated all One-, Two-, and Three-Star practices, AND commits to ongoing quality improvement by using **most** of these best practices:

- Responds to unique cultural customs and needs of children and families
- Offers activities that encourage family participation and help children transition to kindergarten

Ranger Care

Community Education offers before and after school childcare during the school year in the Family Center at the CRES Elementary School.

Ranger Care is for students that are enrolled in preschool classes at CRES and for students in grades K-6.

ECFE Fabulous Fridays

- Fabulous Fridays is a multi-age daytime Early Childhood Family Education class.
- This class is designed for learners age birth to kindergarten entrance and their caregivers.
- The classes are offered in two sessions (fall & spring) and held on designated Fridays.
- Each session includes 15 classes & is offered on a sliding fee scale of \$60 or less based on household income. *No family is turned away due to an inability to pay.*

Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE)

Early Childhood Special Education is a program that provides early intervention and preschool special education to young children, age birth to Kindergarten, who show developmental delays in the general areas of speech and language, large and fine motor skills, social and emotional behavior, cognitive and/or adaptive skills, or have vision or hearing loss.

After a child receives a formal evaluation to identify specific needs, trained ECSE teachers and specialists will work with the caregivers and child to develop his/her greatest potential.

From birth to age three, these Special Education services are delivered to the child primarily in his/her home or child care center. From age three to Kindergarten, children receive these services in the CRES Family Center.

Parents have the right to request an educational evaluation if they have concerns about or suspect delays in their child's development. It is provided through the school district educational services at no cost to the family.

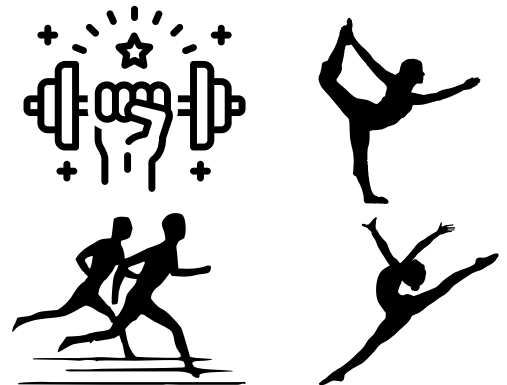

RANGER UPDATE

Hello Crosby-Ironton School District Residents!

I wanted to take this opportunity to update you all on some key areas within our School District.

Strategic Plan: A year ago, 30 community stakeholders met for three months to examine the results from surveys that were administered to students, staff, parents and community members. The results from those surveys were used to develop the school district's strategic plan.

Our Vision: *Empowering Students for Lifelong Success*

Our Mission: *Learning Through Relationships*

Our staff has been working on the goals that are outlined in the strategic plan. Throughout the year, we have seen progress monitoring reports presented by a number of our teachers. The areas of focus this year have been:

1. *We will achieve the goals of the World's Best Workforce (WBWF) for all students in the school district.*

Progress: Our staff has identified learning gaps and areas of high achievement. AFTT and credit recovery programs are just two examples of strategies being used to increase student academic achievement at C-I.

2.1 Develop a process to listen to the student voice.

Progress: Our students have repeated many of the same comments they expressed in a survey administered a year ago. In addition, the student voice was solicited for feedback on the design of the school renovation project. The students have also communicated their vision for the school lunch program.

2.2 Foster positive relationships through a collaborative working environment with all employees.

Progress: All employees attended a day-long training event back in October that highlighted the need to respect differences in people. The staff continues to have monthly conversations about methods to cultivate positive relationships.

Covid: This year, there has been an average of four students and two employees who were absent due to Covid each week. These individuals quarantined at home for five days and then returned to school wearing a required mask for five days. We were able to keep our school open this year, thanks to everyone following the protocols!

School District Budget: While our school district continues to be about one million dollars in debt, we are also able to balance the district's budget with Covid dollars from the federal government. These federal dollars will no longer be available when the district assembles its 2024-2025 annual budget. This is why the district is on the trajectory to go to the voters in November of 2023 for an operating referendum.

Phase III Construction: Demolition will begin at the beginning of June, as the school district begins the third phase of construction, using the funds from the \$29.5 million bond referendum that was held in November of 2019. Projects this summer will include:

- 6th grade pod at CRES
- Media Center at CRES
- HS Commons
- HS Commons' Restrooms
- HS locker bay
- HS Media Center

There are four student ambassadors who give tours of the student manufacturing company called, "Ranger Made." Be sure to call to schedule a tour today!

CRES SCHOOL STORE



In Technology and Innovation class, 6th graders are learning about entrepreneurship. They are putting their new skills into action as they design and create items for the CRES School Store. This includes learning how to use a vinyl cutter and heat press to create t-shirts, hats, and stickers, using their CAD skills to 3D print items that their fellow students can use, using a laser engraver to burn designs into keychains, coasters, and other wood products, and more!

Ranger Made is a new \$3.6 million state-of-the-art student managed manufacturing company located inside Crosby-Ironton High School that was built and equipped as part of the 2019 Bond Referendum.
