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"To balance the needs of ALL members of the RSU #38 school community while maintaining fiscal responsibility"

Team Directives:

- 1) Little to no increase in overall spending (target of 1 to 2%)
- 2) Increase transparency and equity of spending practices.
 Instructional line spending based on number of students in a building with additional allocation for Title 1 schools. (MTVES, WES and RES)
- 3) Class sizes of 15 20 elementary, 18 22 middle, 10+ high school
- 4) Positions may not be automatically filled.

- We don't want the budgeting process to become contentious between the towns and the district.
- As a part of the administrative team we will continue to have meetings to discuss the factors affecting our budget and review requests as a team based on the overall goal.

Co and Extra Curricular

- Add Coaching/Advisor Positions HS Cross Country \$4,100
- Increase MS/HS Supplies (inflation increases) MS \$500, HS \$1,000
- Add Uniform lines for MS/HS (establish a rotation for teams) MS \$4,000 / HS \$8,500
- Add medical fees for football/lacrosse \$650
- Add officials fees for football/lacrosse \$10,000
- Co-curricular equipment (Upgrades to Theater program) \$2,000

Total: \$30,750

Decreases: co-curr dues/fees, contracted maint. (savings from indoor restrooms)
 Reduction in these lines: \$4,000

Net increase: \$26,750

Transportation additional requests

- Professional Development- \$9,000 4 CDL course for new Bus Drivers
- Drugs & Alcohol Testing- \$1,000 Increased testing to remain compliant with federal laws
- Tech Supplies and Software- \$1,500 printer for cards for card reader
- Supplies- \$5,200 Due partly to reclassification of Equipment, in the previous year we were not at full capacity, and increase of supply cost.
- Equipment- \$21,500 new radios & engine hoist
- Online Subscription- \$5,500 Traversa our routing software
- New position- \$23,300 part time transportation admin assistant

Total increase including new position: \$67,000
