Our last stop is Mrs. Levitt's 6th-grade social studies class where her students are doing a project entitled "Voices from the Past". In this activity, the students write a letter to their loved ones in the form of a postcard from the perspective of a soldier living in Valley Forge. They learn about the hardships they faced as well as the patriotic faces that boosted morale and eventually led the Continental Army to victory.

Did you know that many of the Premier League fixtures, matchups, have been postponed? Why? Because of Covid-19 outbreaks. Covid is affecting a numerous number of players which is causing a lot of games to be postponed. The Premier League, the top soccer league in Britain, has took action and still is taking action on the subject. We will talk about what the Premier League has done so far in this Covid retrospect.

In the 2021/2022 *Premier League handbook,* it included Covid protocols. In addition, as the new season started for 2021/2022, they let fans enter the stadium, adding even more pressure to make sure they don't have to close the stadiums down again.

Due to this issue, in the Premier League handbook, they state that they would "Only permit the rearrangement or postponement of a league match in exceptional circumstances." This statement means that the Premier League will only allow you to postpone a match under their circumstances. One of these circumstances is that the team must have less than 14 players for a postponement. But the issue with this, more recently, is some of the teams have started to abuse these rules. For example, Arsenal requested that the Tottenham - Arsenal fixture would be postponed. In this scenario though, only 1 player was affected by Covid-19. But, Arsenal only had 14 players, which called for a postponement.

As a result of this, on December 20, 2021, the Premier League hosted a large board meeting about if they should take a break from the Premier League. This board meeting included the managers of teams in the league. But, since less than half of the people at the meeting agreed for a break from the Premier League, the league continued.

In conclusion, it is important that the Premier League continues to try to limit covid affecting their league. Although it may be difficult, as it has proven to be, they must try to limit Covid outbreaks, or else this situation will grow even worse than it was during that time.
