Purpose of the A+ Student Manual

The Purpose of this manual is to provide a clear understanding of the various aspects of the A+ Scholarship Program as established by the Outstanding Schools Act of 1993. There are many aspects of the law that established the A+ Scholarship Program that require Trenton High School to establish policies and guidelines. It is the responsibility of the A+ Coordinator to administer the A+ Scholarship Program in a fair and consistent manner. All A+ students must be treated fairly and equitably.

The first step of participation in the A+ Scholarship Program is the signing of the A+ Scholarship Participation Agreement by the student, parent, and Trenton High School Principal/A+ Scholarship Coordinator. It is then the responsibility of the student to continue to meet the requirements to be certified as an A+ student upon graduation. The A+ Coordinator will meet with each high school class annually to review the A+ requirements.

The funding for financial incentives is dependent upon Trenton High School achieving redesignation each year and the availability of state appropriations from the Missouri General Assembly. It is the responsibility of the A+ Scholarship Coordinator to certify to the State of Missouri the students who have achieved A+ status upon graduation. This manual is designed to present in a clear and consistent manner the guidelines and policies to be followed by the A+ Scholarship Coordinator.

Benefits of the A+ Scholarship for Students

Graduates from Trenton High School who meet the A+ requirements will be eligible for reimbursement of tuition and general fees to a community college or public vocational/technical school of their choice in Missouri. Also, many Missouri four-year colleges and universities offer their own scholarships to A+ eligible students.

Students will receive this scholarship incentive from the State of Missouri, not the Trenton R-9 School District. These incentives will be made available by the State of Missouri only after the student has made a good faith effort to secure all available federal post secondary student financial assistance funds that do not require repayment. A student must complete twelve semester credit hours each term and maintain a 2.5 cumulative GPA to continue receiving the scholarship. Students remain eligible to receive A+ scholarship funds for up to four years after graduation from Trenton High School or until they receive an associate's degree.

Student Eligibility

To be eligible for the financial incentives of the A+ Scholarship Program, a student must be certified as an A+ student by Trenton High School. As the official representative of the A+ Scholarship Program with the Department of Education of the State of Missouri, the A+ Scholarship Coordinator has the responsibility to certify if a graduate of Trenton High School has met the criteria of certification. The High School Principal will then verify all qualifications and documentation. To be certified as an A+ student, an individual must do the following:

- ➤ Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident.
- ➤ Sign an A+ Student Participation Agreement.
- ➤ Attend an A+ designated high school for three years prior to graduation.
- Maintain at least 2.5 G.P.A. on a 4.0-point scale.
- Maintain at least a 95% attendance record overall throughout high school.
- > Perform 50 hours of unpaid tutoring or mentoring for academically younger students.
- Score proficient or advanced on an Algebra I End of Course Exam or meet other criteria established by the Coordinating Board of Higher Education
- ➤ Maintain a record of good citizenship and avoid the unlawful use of drugs or alcohol throughout high school.
- ➤ Make a good faith effort to first secure all available federal post secondary student financial assistance funds that do not require repayment.

A summary sheet advising the parent of student progress toward achieving A+ school status will be sent each semester. The school will attempt to send this report with the semester report card.

Enrollment Requirements

- To be A+ eligible, students must be enrolled in an A+ designated high school for three years prior to graduation. These do not have to be consecutive years and do not have to be the three years immediately prior to graduation. For example, a student may enroll in A+ High School 1 his freshman year, Non-A+ High School his sophomore year, and A+ High School 2 his junior and senior years and qualify.
- Students, however, do need to be enrolled in that institution(s) for at least 80% of the instructional days over those three years. For example, (using the above case), if the total number of instructional days in those three years is 525 (175 days per year), the student must have been enrolled in a minimum of 420 of the 525 days (80 percent) over their freshman, junior and senior years to meet the three-year attendance requirement. This is regardless of institution(s).

Tutoring/Mentoring Requirements

This section of the manual explains the tutoring or mentoring of academically younger student's requirement of A+ students. The law states that A+ students must perform 50 hours of school-based, unpaid tutoring or mentoring for younger students. The student must have signed an A+ Participation Agreement before entering tutoring.

The THS A+ Scholarship Coordinator in determining this requirement will use the following policies:

- Tutoring/mentoring must be school sponsored.
- An A+ Tutoring/Mentoring log must be kept by the student and turned into the A+ Office.
- The hourly Mentoring/Tutoring log must be signed by the school sponsoring official in charge of that tutoring or mentoring.
- Unless specific permission is given by the A+ Coordinator, all mentoring/tutoring experience must be school related.
- The A+ Student or the sponsoring school may terminate the mentoring/tutoring experience by the permission of the A+ Coordinator.
- The student is expected to be present at the agreed upon day and time for tutoring/mentoring.
- If an absence must occur, the A+ Student is expected to notify the adult in charge of the A+ tutoring/mentoring experience.
- If tutoring/mentoring opportunity is canceled by the school, the adult in charge is expected to notify the A+ Student.

Algebra I EOC Requirement

Beginning with the high school senior class of 2015, students must attain a score of "Advanced" or "Proficient" on the official Algebra I end-of-course exam. Students who are unable to attain such a score may still establish eligibility through other criteria established by the Coordinating Board of High Education. These criteria are revised annually. Please check with the A+ Scholarship Coordinator for the most recent information regarding alternative qualifications provisions from CBHE.

Attendance Requirement

This section of the manual explains the attendance requirement of the A+ Scholarship Program for students at Trenton High School. The attendance rate must be 95% for the accumulated time between the start of the freshman year at Trenton High School until graduation. The following guidelines will be in effect:

- The accumulative attendance information will be maintained in the student records database in the high school office.
- Each semester a report showing the accumulative attendance record information will be sent to parents of A+ Students. The school will attempt to send this report with the semester report card.
- After receiving this information, a student and parent can appeal for days missed by using the "A+ Attendance Appeal Form" available in the A+ office.
- Students that have had specific health histories (<u>Reason for absence</u>, item 1.) must make sure that medical documentation (doctor's letter) is provided with the A+ Appeals Form.
- Those submitting a request for an A+ waiver of days missed shall provide the A+ Scholarship Coordinator with official documentation of the following:

Reason for absence

<u>Documentation</u> Principal's or Doctor's letter

- 1. Serious illness, hospitalization, serious accident
- 2. Death of immediate family members (parents, grandparents, siblings.)
- A student will not receive a waiver if any absence is due to any of the following:
 - 1. Truancy
 - 2. Skipping class
 - 3. Personal/Family vacations
 - 4. Transportation problems (unless the transportation was school-provided)
 - 5. Suspended from class or school for any reason.

- The A+ Scholarship Appeals Committee will be composed of the following:
 - 1. High School Principal
 - 2. High School Guidance Counselors (2)
 - 3. Trenton R-9 District Patron
 - 4. A+ Advisory Committee member
 - 5. A+ Scholarship Coordinator, as facilitator and non-voting member.
- The A+ Scholarship Appeals Committee shall meet twice per year or as deemed necessary.

The A+ Coordinator will act as facilitator and non-voting member of the Appeals Committee. After the A+ Appeals Committee reaches a decision, the A+ Coordinator or High School Principal will notify the parents. The decision of the A+ Scholarship Appeals Committee can be appealed to the Board of Education by contacting the Superintendent of Schools. Any and all additional appeals will be conducted following policies set by the Board of Education.

Citizenship Requirement

Participation in the A+ Scholarship Program is an honor and a unique privilege for Trenton High School Students. Students pursuing the A+ scholarship must maintain a record of good citizenship and avoid the unlawful use of drugs/alcohol and adhere to all guidelines as stated in the A+ Citizenship Policy.

Certification of good citizenship will be based upon the official discipline record maintained in the High School office and convictions that are verifiable and/or a matter of public record. The A+ Scholarship Coordinator will be responsible for certifying the accuracy of the student's discipline record and A+ citizenship status.

DISMISSAL

The following offenses will result in the immediate removal from the A+ Scholarship Program:

- 1. Possession, use, sale or transfer of alcohol or drugs.
- 2. Possession of drug paraphernalia.
- 3. Convicted of a felony that is verifiable and is a matter of public record <u>or</u> criminal activity as defined by the Safe Schools Act.
- 4. False fire alarm/bomb threats and misuse of emergency equipment.
- 5. Vandalism of school property.
- 6. Theft at school or school activity.
- 7. Serious sexual misbehavior/harassment.
- 8. Expulsion from school

PROBATION

Disciplinary offenses, other than an offense that causes immediate removal from the A+ Program, will result in the student being placed on probation. The probation period will be for the remainder of the student's high school career.

- Any student placed in Out of School Suspension will be placed on probation for the first offense. A second offense will immediately remove the student from the A+ Program.
- Any student exhibiting a continuous pattern of disruptive behavior as recorded in his/her discipline record will be placed on probation.

Good Citizenship outside the school setting is of equal importance. Records from law enforcement that are a matter of public record or as established under the Safe Schools Act will be used to determine good citizenship. This information will be used to determine citizenship and probation will be administered as follows.

• Any student receiving a misdemeanor conviction that is verifiable and a matter of public record will be placed on probation. A second offense will result in immediate removal from the A+ Program.

CITIZENSHIP APPEAL PROCESS

The following process may be used by students/parents to appeal a disciplinary decision:

- Students/parents will have 30 days to appeal a decision that is made relating to removal or probation of the A+ Program. Anyone making an appeal should use the "A+ Appeal Citizenship Form" available from the A+ Coordinator.
- The basis of the appeal must be submitted in writing through the office of the A+ Scholarship Coordinator.
- Upon receiving a written appeal the A+ Scholarship Coordinator will convene the A+ Scholarship Appeals Committee composed of the following:
 - 1. High School Principal
 - 2. Guidance Counselors (2)
 - 3. Trenton R-9 District Patron
 - 4. A+ Advisory Committee Member
 - 5. A+ Scholarship Coordinator, as facilitator and non-voting member.

The A+ Coordinator will act as facilitator and non-voting member of the Appeals Committee. After the A+ Appeals Committee reaches a decision, the A+ Coordinator or High School Principal will notify the parents. The decision of the A+ Scholarship Appeals Committee can be appealed to the Board of Education by contacting the Superintendent of Schools. Any and all additional appeals will be conducted following policies set by the Board of Education.
