

Muldrow Public Schools Child Find

Child Find is a component of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) which requires an ongoing process for locating, identifying, and evaluating children suspected of having a disability who may need special education and related services. Muldrow Public Schools will provide a free appropriate public education to all children with disabilities, ages 3-21, residing within its boundaries.

In full agreement with these concepts, Muldrow Public Schools provides special education services which includes specially designed instruction and related services for students who have one or more of the following disabilities according to federal criteria and who also have demonstrated educational need for special education services:

- Specific Learning Disability
- Speech/Language Impairment
- Orthopedic Impairment
- Other Health Impairment
- Intellectual Disability
- Emotional Disturbance
- Autism
- Multiple Disabilities
- Traumatic Brain Injury
- Visual Impairment
- Hearing Impairment (including Deafness)
- Deaf-Blindness
