
Congratulations to Coach Mike Watt

A New System

SMC High School and Junior High Adopt Community System

Community System is a system set in place to help facilitate a culture of inclusivity, authentic Catholic values, peer to peer relationships, leadership skills, and a support system every day for students. We call it community because within each house, or homeroom, if you will, there are freshman through senior and these are designed to build greater bonds with each class, so in turn a much stronger community. We have many traditions here at Colgan, and we intend to keep those traditions alive and add another layer and depth with this community system. The students named their communities St. Padre Pio, St. Teresa of Calcutta and St. Maximilian Kolbe. The three communities are

made up of three smaller houses in each community, with about 15 students in each house. Those houses meet every day, sometimes for 50 minutes, and others for just ten minutes. This system has two school captains both seniors, each bigger community

has one captain who is a senior, and each house has a senior, junior, sophomore and freshman captain. The captains are to lead their peers in a variety of ways that all fall under the four pillars of stewardship, formation, hospitality, service, and prayer. They can be creative during house time, like going outside and playing a game of kickball with their house or watching a Fr. Mike Schmidt video and discussing it. This really allows students to grow in their leadership skills! They learn how to lead their peers better, how to be handle a variety of personalities, how

to communicate with their teachers on a different level, and authentically learn how to love others despite their differences. The soft skills we hope they learn like collaboration, interpersonal communication, problem solving, and time management will set them up for success after graduating from St. Mary's Colgan and set a great example for others their age in this culture. Those who are not leaders within this system will still gain awesome experiences that will really help shape their lives. They get to learn collaboration with their peers, doing activities they may not want or feel the most comfortable doing for the sake of the house, as well as having a voice with school issues or world issues and be able to be heard in their smaller group house. The community system is also a great opportunity for

the teachers! The teachers get the unique liberty each day to be with and speak with the students in their house, not from a teacher perspective, but strictly from a relational point of view. The junior high is also participating in this system, by having one community as a whole, but four houses. The junior high has named their community St. Philomena. This will help even more the transition from junior high to high school and give each student the experience of this system and preparation to lead and be led. Above all, the community system is to stay true to the mission of our parish and school which is to form disciples of Jesus Christ. There is no better way to evangelize than through relationships and allowing the students the space to act as Christ in their houses every single day. We hope and pray every kid that comes to St. Mary's Colgan leaves knowing they are known, loved, and cared for by so many, especially our Heavenly Father.

Ron Wilbert graduated with the St. Mary's class of 1958. He went to Kansas State College of Pittsburg now Pittsburg State, for one year before going to work at The White Grill at 18th and Broadway, where he served as the cook, curb hop and whatever needed done. In 1962, Ron enlisted in the Army and spent the next six months active duty at Fort Leonard Wood, followed by six years in the National Guard. Also in 1962, Ron, in partnership with Jim Wilbert, Bob McVickers and Larry Sims, opened MoKan dragstrip between Pittsburg and Joplin. Ron and Jim continued to own and operate the quarter mile drag strip until 1999, before selling it. The dragstrip continues to hold weekend races. On September 10, 1966, Ron and Melva Beasley were married at Our Lady of Lourdes. Ron worked for Foodtown supermarket laying out newspaper ads for their 27 stores in Kansas and Missouri. In 1985, Ron opened Wilbert Engraving north of

Pittsburg in Franklin, which he continues to operate. He engraves plaques, medals, trophies and makes magnets as well as does other engraving.
