The month of February was chosen in honor of Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln, who were both born in this month - both men were symbols of freedom. President Abraham Lincoln issued the Emancipation Proclamation, freeing slaves -- leading to the creation of the 13th Amendment. Frederick Douglass -- An abolitionist who was born into slavery but became one of the most famous intellectuals of his time, advising presidents and lecturing to thousands on a range of causes, including women's rights.

Black History Month started as a single week by the visionary Carter Woodson. He launched Black History Week as an initiative to bring national attention to the contributions of black people throughout American history. It became a month-long celebration in 1976 by President Gerald Ford.
