Granville Woods was an African-American engineer born in 1856, in Columbus, Ohio.
He worked in the railroad industry throughout his teens. Then in 1880, Woods started
his own development and manufacturing company. Nine years later, he filed his first
patent for a new version of the steam boiler. Granville Woods went on to file nearly 60
more patents and invented over 15 appliances for railroads. His contributions
revolutionized railroad transportation. Woods eventually died on January 30, 1910, but
his legacy lives on.
