What is on the April 5 Ballot? Two Questions

Based on the positive feedback from the district-wide community survey, the School District of Wild Rose School Board unanimously approved **two referendum questions** for the April 5, 2022 ballot.

Question 1 authorizes \$15,600,000 for educational improvements, including a classroom addition, renovations, safety, and security improvements, building infrastructure and site improvements at the Elementary School; as well as renovations, safety and security improvements, accessibility updates, and infrastructure, site and outdoor athletic facility improvements at the Middle/High School.

Question 2 authorizes \$2,300,000 for HVAC upgrades, including air conditioning, at the Middle/High School.

Assumptions: Debt borrowings are amortized over 20 years at a planning interest rate of 3.75%. Mill rate based on 2021 Equalized Valuation (TID-OUT) of \$868,239,570 with annual growth of 1.00% thereafter. Impact represents the estimated change in the mill rate over the projected 2021-22 mill rate of \$0.60 for the energy efficiency exemption levy. Prepared by RW Baird.

MILL RATE DROP: The District's share of property taxes is calculated using a mill rate. Since 2013-14, our tax mill rate has dropped **nearly 25**%. Our tax rate compared to schools in our conference is near the bottom, and is well below the state K-12 average of \$8.67.

Dear School District of Wild Rose Residents:

Over the past year, the School District and the School Board conducted long-range facilities planning to better understand the current state of our buildings and grounds, infrastructure, and learning spaces. Although both the Elementary and Middle/High Schools are well-maintained and structurally sound, significant educational and capital maintenance needs were identified in the comprehensive facilities study.

On April 5, 2022, District residents will have the opportunity to vote on two referendum questions to address these needs:

Question 1 – \$15,600,000 to address improved safety, security, and accessibility, aging infrastructure, and outdated educational spaces at both the Elementary and Middle/High Schools.

Question 2 – \$2,300,000 for HVAC upgrades including air conditioning at the Middle/High School.

Why Now?

- No major educational improvement projects since 1997
- Aging building systems such as roofs and mechanicals need updating
- Improve the safety and security of both building entrances
- Improve educational spaces to reflect current teaching and learning
- Provide more hands-on / career-ready skills for our MS/HS students
- · A financial window of opportunity with existing debt falling off


The plan is also based on staff and community input from the Fall 2021 survey:


- 68% of all resident respondents to the community survey indicated support for a referendum to fund the recommended plan.
- 68% of all resident respondents to the community survey would support a referendum to fund air conditioning at the Middle/High School.




- Relocate/renovate Main Office to create a secure entrance to better monitor and control visitor access.

Project Timeline

If voters approve the referendum questions on April 5, 2022, the District will begin the architectural design process right away. The entire project is expected to take approximately two years to complete with targeted key milestones along the way.
