Using SMART529 savings

SMART529 savings can be used for:

- Traditional four and two year colleges
- Accredited vocational and trade schools
- Graduate and doctoral programs
- K-12 private school
- Other qualified school-related expenses such as fees, books, supplies, computer equipment, room and board

Tax benefits

- Earnings within your SMART529 plan grow free from federal taxes
- Distributions used for qualified expenses are federal income tax free
- West Virginia taxpayers may deduct contributions to a SMART529 from your federal adjusted gross income on your state income tax return

More ways to save

- Open a new account before a child's first birthday and receive a \$100 contribution to your child's account with the Bright Babies program
 - Also open to any adopted child who has not yet celebrated the one-year adoption anniversary
 - Child must be a West Virginia resident
- Family and friends can contribute to a child's SMART529 Account with a "Gift of College" gift card, available online.

- Open an account at SMART529.com or by mail
- Available only to WV residents
- No minimum initial investment

Plan features

- Account owner maintains control
- Beneficiary can be changed from one family member to another
- An account can be opened in anyone's name, including your own
- Anyone can contribute to a SMART529 account, including friends and relatives

Investment options

- Age based portfolios
- Static portfolios
- Stable value portfolio
- Index equity portfolio
