



As March comes to a close, it starts to get brighter outside for longer periods. This is due to Daylight Savings, a time that happens two times of the year when we turn the clocks back in November and turn the clocks forward for spring.

The rising questions are, why do we need daylight savings, and when was it first created?

In 1895, New Zealand scientist George Vernon Hudson and British builder William Willett presented a paper to the Wellington Philosophical Society, proposing a 2-hour shift forward in October and a 2-hour shift back in March.

There was interest in the idea, but it was never followed through.

Daylight Savings was first used by Canada. On July 1st, 1908, the residents of Port Arthur, Ontario -now known as Thunder Bay- turned their clock forward by one hour to begin the start of the first daylight savings.

Taking a page from Canada's book, many other countries followed suit and began using Daylight Savings Time.

In 1966, the Uniform Time Act was established in the U.S. This act officially made daylight savings start on the second Sunday in March and end on the first Sunday in November, with the time changes taking place at 2:00 a.m. local time.

During this time people will either move their clocks forward or back one hour.

Although, the question still stands, why did these countries feel the need to turn their clocks forward and backward every year?

Well, it's simple really, Daylight Savings was created to solely make better use of daylight, and save energy. Scientists believed this system would be beneficial to everyone, and it has.

Over 70 countries partake in Daylight savings every year impacting billions of people worldwide.

Taylor Swift THE MUSIC INDUSTRY

Growing up we listen to all different types of music. We discover genres such as pop, indie, rock, country, and so much more. We find artists and explore the different cultures of music.

When listening, we often become entranced with certain singers. These musicians check all the boxes for you. You often feel a close connection and love towards them, feeling like you know them personally when in truth millions of people feel the same way.

Over the years many of these artists are forgotten about, however, some artists make their way into music history. These people make a new beginning to music. They become known to the entire world.

Whether you love her or not, Taylor Swift is recognized as one of the most thriving musicians of our time, advancing the music industry to a whole new level.

Taylor Swift began her country music career at the ripe age of 14, signing a songwriting career with Sony music publishing in 2004, and later signing a deal in 2005 with Big Machine Records.

Swift then released her first album, *Debut*, in 2006, and quickly became a rising country star. The young singer-songwriter later explored country-pop in her 2008 album *Fearless*. She was described as a crossover artist, a singer who uses two genres in their work.

While Swift was extremely successful with her country music, she took it to a new level when she started working with pop.

Teens all across the country fell in love with the star. Later on, in 2019 and 2020, Taylor Swift self-released her albums *Evermore* and *Folklore*. These indie songs became extremely popular and introduced many of her fans to the genre.

Sadly, fame comes with its downfalls. In October 2020, Scooter Braun, Swift's former publisher, sold Swift's previous work to the Disney family's investment firm, Shamrock Holdings, for \$300,000,000.

According to Swift, the terms of the sale to Shamrock allow Scooter to continue to profit off Taylor's music for "many years."

This deal was done without her permission and was a huge loss personally and professionally.

Later that year, Swift went on Good Morning America to reveal that she is re-recording her old albums that were sold.

In April 2021, she officially released *Fearless (Taylor's Version)*, which went on to go No. 1 on Billboard's Hot 200 albums chart during the week of April 24, 2021.

Later on, in 2021, Swift released *Red (Taylor's Version)* with her ten-minute song "All Too Well" along with a short film centered around the song.

The song also made chart history, becoming the longest-running song, 10 minutes and 13 seconds, to reach the Hot 100 chart.

Swift completed 53 weeks on number 1 with the song, making her the third artist in music history to achieve this.

The star holds the record with music legends such as The Beatles and Elvis Presley.

While Taylor Swift's career wasn't always easy, she inspired so many people with her music.

Her songs are often called poetry due to how intricate they are. In many of these songs she takes a simple phrase and describes it with so much elegance.

Swift is a strong woman who took all her setbacks and turned them into something beautiful.

She has composed music in genres such as country, pop, and indie. And she has continuously been successful in all of these genres.

Taylor Swift is also very resilient and innovative. When Scooter Braun sold Taylors music without her permission instead of giving up, she thought outside of the box, starting her journey of rerecording her music.

These albums not only became a huge success, but they made music history.

The Most Disliked Woman in America

True Crime with Kelaney

Caylee Marie Anthony was born on August 9th, 2005. She was the daughter of Casey Anthony and granddaughter of George and Cindy Anthony. Baby Caylee's father is unknown but died in a car crash according to Casey Anthony. She hid her pregnancy almost the entire time so it was a surprise when her parents found out, but they have claimed that even though Casey Anthony was a teenager they supported her completely. Baby Caylee was raised in Orlando with her mom and her grandparents.

On June 16th, 2008, Anthony drove off after an argument she had with her parents. She told her mom that she was taking Caylee to Jacksonville, Florida. On July 15th, Anthony's car was impounded, when her parents got to the car, there was the overwhelming scent of decay. George and Cindy Anthony were both familiar with the smell due to their careers in healthcare and law enforcement.

Mrs. Anthony called one of her daughter's friends and asked them to take her where Casey was located. When they arrived, however, Mrs. Anthony found out that her daughter was not even in Jacksonville but instead was staying with a boyfriend. And when Casey was asked about her daughter Caylee, she didn't answer.

Later that day, Anthony's mom called the police three times out of concern. When finally questioned by the police Casey Anthony told them that Caylee had been with a babysitter named Zenaida Fernandez-Gonzalez, whom she called Zanny the nanny. Casey Anthony shared that Fernandez-Gonzalez took Caylee on June 9th meaning that Caylee was missing for 31 days without ever being reported.

Anthony then led police to an apartment claiming that it was where Zanny lived but police found out that apartment was actually abandoned. Anthony then told police she had a job at Universal Studios and proceeded to walk the police around Universal Studios for two hours and even waved at random people pretending to know them. They eventually walked into a dead end and it was then that Anthony admitted that she does not actually work there and was making it up. She was arrested for lying to police and child neglect.

The Trial

Cadaver dogs were able to sense that there had been a dead body in the back of Anthony's impounded car, chloroform and decomposition were found in the air of the car and they were able to find a piece of Caylee's hair that tests showed was linked to a decomposing body. On December 11th, Caylee's body was found in the woods. She was in a laundry bag, and also covered in duct tape, both of which the Anthony family owned. Forensics was unable to prove a cause of death due to the level of decomposition. To this day it Baby Caylee's case is labeled publicly as a "homicide of undetermined means".

On May 24th, 2011, the trial began. The prosecution was hoping to push the death penalty. They made their opening statement and showed images and proof of how Anthony was partying the entire time Baby Caylee was missing, but soon after these statements were made the defense quickly overshadowed them. In the opening statement the defense claimed that Anthony's dad, George, has done some very bad things which included letting Baby Caylee drown in the pool before trying to hide the body.

The prosecution presented quite a bit of incriminating evidence pointing to Casey Anthony including a Google search on the home computer for chloroform that was made 86 times during the hours Mr. and Mrs. Anthony. Mrs. Anthony claimed she had been home and made the search after one of their dogs ate bamboo and she was trying to search 'chlorophyll' when 'chloroform' popped up. Casey Anthony was ultimately found not guilty for first degree murder, aggravated child abuse, and aggravated man slaughter of a child, but she was found guilty of four misdemeanor counts of misinforming law enforcement.

Casey Anthony was given a four year prison sentence but was released after one year. She was released on July 17th, 2011, and afterwards cut off communication with her entire family. In 2012, law enforcement was able to extract her deleted search history from the Anthony family computer, which they were unable to do in the prior years. The search was for "full proof strangulation" and the search was deleted the morning of Anthony's arrest. Cindy Anthony still believes her daughter is innocent while her husband, George believes she is guilty. The public, however, has definitely made up their minds.


