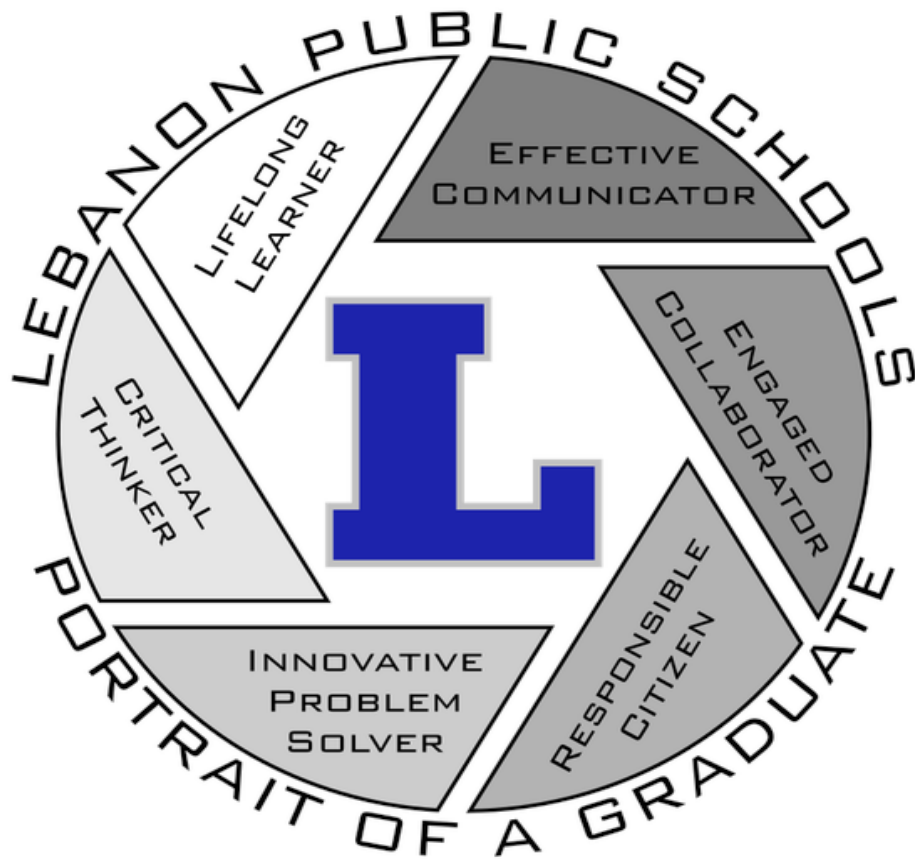


Why Us?

The Lebanon Public Schools, in partnership with families and the community, will prepare students to be contributing members of a diverse global society. We are committed to providing a safe, nurturing, rigorous and student centered learning environment.

The Lebanon Public School District consists of three schools: Lebanon Elementary School, Grades Pre-K-4; Lebanon Middle School, Grades 5-8 and Lyman Memorial High School, Grades 9-12. The Pre-K program is accredited by the National Association for the Education of Young Children. Lyman Memorial High School is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges. Lyman also is home to the Lebanon Regional Agricultural Science & Technology Center, established in 1959. Students in each of the schools are provided a rigorous academic program designed to promote excellence and high achievement for all students in all grades.

Here are some highlights from our schools and departments!



Lebanon Elementary School (LES)

LES provides academic and social development instruction and celebrates the arts with opportunities that support the whole child. Our school celebrates student accomplishments and talents through a variety of opportunities throughout the school year:

- Connecticut Association of Schools (CAS) Leadership Conference-January 2022-eight students participated
- Connecticut Association of Schools (CAS) Celebration of the Arts-Recognized two students with outstanding performance in the visual and performing arts
- Invention Convention-February 2022-41 students participated this year and 6 students were chosen to represent LES at the Connecticut Invention Convention
- LES will host four musical performances this school year
- LES partners with PTA to create fun and enriching activities that supports school engagement (Goodies with Grandparents, book fairs)

Lebanon Middle School (LMS)

LMS is a community of learners that has a familial environment, a wealth of clubs, activities and sports to offer. Growth for the whole child is a focus with lessons to help students develop skills in our Panther Pride values. Students are encouraged to become Respectful, Responsible, and Good Citizens.

- A number of extra curricular activities encourage the development of the whole child, attending to the particular needs of pre and early adolescents.
 - Three sports are offered each season.
 - Clubs include Newspaper, Yearbook, Ecology, Students & Mentors, Homework Club, Math Club, Ski Club, Jazz Band, Show Choir and Drama
 - Opportunities for student government or service include; Peer Educators, Student Council, Lebanon Junior Honor Society, and LMS Live (student broadcast of morning announcements).
- A robust reading incentive program encourages students to find their own reading niche. Summer reading, holiday reading bingos, timely books shares for current topics and events, and our own LMS Little Free Library program, foster an interest in independent reading.

Lyman Memorial High School (LMHS)

Small School, Big Opportunities

We at Lyman Memorial High School strongly believe that our small size is our greatest asset. We get to know our students with small class sizes and faculty, staff and administration spend time with students to promote a positive school atmosphere. Students have opportunities to shine in a tremendous variety of ways through strong academics and the arts, extracurricular opportunities like clubs, organizations and athletics. We work very hard to develop well rounded students prepared to take on life's challenges. Lyman offers numerous opportunities for students to explore their interests by offering over 50 clubs every year, including debate team, guitar club, origami club and so much more. We also have 12 different sports between the Fall, Winter and Spring, including our State Champion Volleyball Team! Finally Lyman currently has 11 sending towns and will be increasing to 12 for the 2023-2024 school year, allowing for students in neighboring towns to experience a small school atmosphere with big opportunities.

Curriculum, Instruction & Assessment

LES - Workshop models that allow for inquiry, choice, and celebration; Evidence-based math instruction - i-Ready; Intervention support in both math and reading.

LMS - Math Pathways and support through the iReady platform; Introduction to World Language; Multi Tiered System of Supports in Language Arts and Mathematics; Evidence-based math instruction - i-Ready

Lyman - Rigorous Academic Programs - Opportunities to earn college credit
Real World Experiences - drone, turf management, agriculture, manufacturing, technology, fitness for life; Academic and Social Emotional supports such as Math Hub and Social Emotional Learning evidence-based curriculum ONEder.

Special Education Services

The Lebanon Public Schools Department of Pupil Services strives to assure that all students with disabilities between the ages of 3 and 21 have appropriate programs of instruction and related services designed to meet their individual needs. Special education instruction and related services are provided at all grade levels, by certified and/or licensed professionals. Programs for students

with disabilities are designed to support participation in the general education school program, whenever possible. Our goal is for all students to reach their fullest potential.

Facilities

The facilities team consists of both a full time director, and maintenance technician. Their primary focus is maintaining a safe, clean and healthy learning environment for both staff and students. Recent district improvements include solar systems at the elementary and middle schools. LED lighting upgrade throughout the school district. We pride ourselves in offering the use of our facilities to our town and other programs. Our community benefits from using our cross country trails as well as the sports fields and courts. We also have an Agricultural Barn that is home to several animals that we take care of and a Greenhouse that is used for instructional purposes and to grow plants and vegetables.

Technology

Technology team of three with one Director of Information Technology and two full time technicians. Being a smaller district the IT team is able to provide hands-on support and training to staff and also provide support for student devices. One to one computing for all students from grades K-12. Kindergarten and First receive iPads for use in this grade. Second thru twelfth grade receive chromebooks. All devices are managed and repaired by the IT department. All classrooms are equipped with an interactive whiteboard. This may be a Smart Board or an interactive tv. These devices give teachers another tool to add to the teaching experience. Robust WiFi network. This Wifi network is available at all the three schools and can easily handle the class sizes with speeds up to 400mbps. This network is a compliment to our 1-1 computing.
