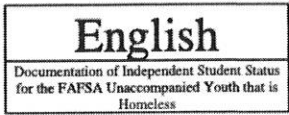

¹ "Youth" is defined in the 2016-2017 FAFSA notes as age 21 and under. However, per the July 29, 2015, Dear Colleague Letter issued by the U.S. Department of Education, applicants between the ages of 21 to 24 and who are unaccompanied and homeless or self-supporting and at risk of homeless qualify for a homeless youth determination, and will be considered independent.
