#### Correction to the November 14, 2016 Minutes, 10. Superintendent's Update, c. Track Repair:

c. <u>Track Repair</u>. Quote was included in the packet. The high jump and runway will be replaced with new Tuflite surface in the color of red as well as respraying the entire oval and chute. The lines will also be repainted. The cost will be \$60,900.

#### 7. Superintendent's Update:

a. <u>BOE Adopts Resolution to Approve Sales of Bonds.</u> Dustin Avey with Piper Jaffray, explained the process of selling the bonds. Winning bidder was Commence Bank with an interest rate if 3.04%. Adoption of the following Resolution for the selling of the bonds:

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE ISSUANCE, SALE AND DELIVERY OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS, SERIES 2016, OF UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 310, RENO COUNTY, KANSAS (FAIRFIELD); PROVIDING FOR THE LEVY AND COLLECTION OF AN ANNUAL TAX FOR THE PURPOSE OF PAYING THE PRINCIPAL OF AND INTEREST ON SAID BONDS AS THEY BECOME DUE; MAKING CERTAIN COVENANTS AND AGREEMENTS TO PROVIDE FOR THE PAYMENT AND SECURITY THEREOF; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN OTHER DOCUMENTS AND ACTIONS CONNECTED THEREWITH.

Jim Combs and Brent Fowler moved and seconded the motion to adopt the resolution. Motion carried 6-0.

- b. <u>Lease Purchase Update</u>. Mr. Reed met with Citizens Bank, no interest rates have been given yet. It was suggested by Treasurer Shea Hewitt to wait six months before making any final decisions on a lump sum payment toward the lease purchase amount.
- c. <u>Recommendation for Interview Team of CMAR.</u> Mr. Reed recommended having Sarah Sipe with Landmark on the interview team for hiring a CMAR. BOE agreed. BOE members also decided on having all members present for the interview. A special meeting will be held on January 5, 2017 at 10 a.m. in the Superintendent's office.
- d. Shared Belief Statements. Tabled.
- f. <u>KESA Update</u>. Mr. Reed reported that the District is ahead in the accreditation plan. Relevance and Relationships has been decided on as the beginning topics of the five year plan.
- g. Senior Project Application. Application was included in the packet for BOE members to review.

#### 8. Capital Outlay Projects.

- a. <u>Track Completion Nov 30th.</u> The track repairs are completed. It was suggested by United Sports Systems to sloop the edges along the runways so that water can run off and extend the life of the track. The estimate for the edging would be \$12,000.
- b. <u>Bus Sale Update</u>. Mr. Reed informed the BOE members that bus 111 and 107 have been sold. Bus 111 was sold to Buhler for \$3,500. Bus 107 was sold to Pratt-Skyline for \$1,500.
- c. <u>Capital Outlay Project Long Term Plan 5-7 Years</u>. A list of projects was included in the packet. Derek Zongker suggested possibly purchasing a section of bleachers for the north side of the upper deck in the gym.
