

























## <u>Kindergarten Readiness</u>

Readiness for school is preparing a child so they are able to benefit from the goals, expectations, and activities of a Kindergarten program. The process of learning how to be an active learner is a critical step in preparing a child for the school environment and lifelong learning. Children who are ready for school show a curiosity and excitement for learning and asking questions.

## Students entering Kindergarten should also have the following skills:

· Name Writing

Children practice writing their name with a capital letter at the beginning and lowercase letters for the

## · Direction Following

- Begin to show self-control by following rules
- Have the ability to follow 2-3 step directions
  When given directions the child can start on the task

#### · <u>Reading Readiness</u>

- Child has been introduced to letters and the sounds they make
- Begins to recognize the letters in their own first and last name and maybe the sounds of some of those letters
- Child is read to <u>daily</u> by adults or older siblings

#### · Math Skills

- Can count to 10 and recognize numbers 0-10
- Identifies basic shapes (circle, triangle, square, rectangle, oval)
  Understands terms such as up, down, next to, top, bottom, last, between, etc.

As we have done the past few years, kindergartener's have a unique first week to start their school year!

We will host half of the students on Tuesday \* Wednesday while the other half will attend on

Thursday \* Friday. The purpose of this staggered start is to transition our kindergarten students into the year with a smaller group of students while providing more individualized time with their teacher. We will focus on routines, locations, and simply getting familiar and comfortable with their new surroundings.

Blue Group: attends Tuesday, September 6th & Wednesday, September 7th

White Group: attend Thursday, September 8th + Friday, September 9th

Both groups will attend two full days the first week of school with bus transportation being provided (regular bus stop, regular bus assignment at the regular times for arrival and dismissal). The students will participate in their regular school day schedule both days.

If you plan to drop off and/or pick up your child on the first day of school, you may walk your child to the main entrance on the first day of attendance. Their classroom teacher or a class paraprofessional will greet them and walk them down to their classroom. Every day attendance for your student will resume on Monday, September 12, 2022.

## Early Childhood Screening

The early years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how children are doing between the ages of 3 to 4 years. It identifies, at an early stage, possible learning or health concerns so that children can get needed help before starting school. Early Childhood Screening is not an IQ test or a kindergarten entrance test, although it is required by state law for children before starting kindergarten. Screening is a fee review of you child's vision, hearing, height, weight, development and immunization records.

Children are screened by trained staff at Mora Elementary School. If you need a screening please call the ECFE Office at 320-679-6225

<mark>- Has the ability to work on a given task <u>without</u> an adult sitting with them</mark>

## Social Skills

- Separates easily from parents
- Is willing to try new activities
- Expresses his or her feelings and emotions in an appropriate manner
- Keeps hands, feet, and other objects to self
- Maintains personal space

## <u>Personal Skills</u>

- Is able to take care of bathroom needs
- Can button and zip pants or coat
- Is responsible for personal belongings
- Able to blow nose independently
- Is beginning to work on shoe tying
- Washes hands independently
