Our school will be the first junior high school in the district to do participatory budgeting. What if I am not sure if I want to do music at Carson Jr High?

Remember when your children wouldn't eat the food you made for them? You always said, "Try it before you decide you don't like it." Music is the same way. You should sign up for music even if you are unsure. If at some point you decide that music is not for you, drop the class. It is much easier to drop something after trying it, than to join late when you decide you miss it.

How is music different in junior high?

While the actual act of playing your instrument is similar, the social network and safety net that high school music provides is very different from elementary. From day one, your child will be musically and personally mentored by successful older students who have a vested interest in their success. They will have dozens of new and like-minded friends within weeks and have experiences musical and otherwise that are unlike anything they have experienced in elementary school.

Can I do music and sports?

YES. There might be occasional conflicts, but know that our faculty works hard to resolve as many conflicts as possible before they occur and to work collaboratively to solve them when they arise.

How much out of school time is required?

There is VERY little time required outside of the traditional school day. Some ensembles require very little (less than standard homework) while other ensembles require more substantial commitment. Generally, the greater the level of commitment, the greater the reward and memories. Regardless of the ensemble, a year-long calendar will be provided well in advance to help you plan for these events.

ATTENDANCE

Tardiness interrupts learning for everyone in the classroom. Students who are tardy miss the very important beginning of class. Good Attendance and punctuality are skills for success in life; that is why we emphasize both. Here are some of Carson's tardy policies:

- Students who arrive late to school MUST check in through the attendance office
- Tardies will be excused for Court appearance, Medical, dental or counseling appointments
- Tardiness caused by missing the bus, sleeping in, babysitting, accompanying other people to appointments, etc. will not be excused
- Students who arrive 10 or more minutes late to any class will be marked absent to that class
- After 3 unexcused tardies to class a consequence will be issued

Students must attend at least 90% of class sessions in a semester in order to receive a passing grade and/or credit.

COUNSELING

It is time for Pre-registration again. We are currently visiting the 6th grade classes of our feeder schools which are: Adams, Emerson, Eisenhower, Roosevelt, Webster, Whittier and Whitman. During our visit, we are distributing the pre-registration worksheets and giving general information about the elective class offering so that students can pick the elective classes that they want to take next year. We will soon go to the classes of our 7th grade students to register them for elective classes in early February. Westwood counselors will be meeting with 8th grade students through their English classes on January 23rd to begin the registration process with the 8th graders by distributing registration materials and giving general information about elective classes at Westwood.

Dates to remember: Carson 6th grade parent night is Thursday, February 1st from 6:00 p.m. to 7:30 p.m. Westwood's War Eagle Welcome is also Thursday February 1st from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m

CTE

This is a new semester start for all the Career and Technical Education (CTE) courses at Carson Jr High. The skills the students learn are career oriented and marketable for their future careers.

Intro to Technology (IT01) students are learning how to correctly measure and read rulers so that they can begin

their first woodworking project - The Oven Stick. This introduces the students to safety procedures, measuring and accuracy and the tools of the class. The students then will move onto their Wooden Treasure Boxes that they will have to design and build including using the CNC engraving machines.

Intro to Technology - Woodworking (IT14) Students are also learning to measure accurately so that they can build on paper, then a foam prototype and eventually their wooden CO2 racing cars.

Intro to Technology - Electronics (IT23) Students are learning the basics of electronics and soldering. They will soon apply these skills to their own personal circuit kits. The kids will have many components including speakers and lights.

Intro to Engineering - Automation and Robotics (IT-20) Students will use either VEX or LEGO parts to build a working robot that can be coded to move through many types of mazes and courses. The students will learn Robot C programming language a specific type of C+ computer coding. The students will be facing numerous problem solving situations where there will be in guide book and the students will have to try many techniques to solve for solutions to get their robot and code to work.

Intro to Engineering - Design Modeling (IT-25) Students are learning how to both CAD draw blocks and basic designs and then to change the software into a downloadable STL file for the 3D printer. They will progress to much harder projects and much more skills as the semester continues.



Department News

ENGLISH

The English Language Arts Department will continue working on various units and skills to support our standards. Seventh grade ELA has started the third semester with a Mythology unit. The students have been engaged with various types of myths, fables, and legends, all while working with text-dependent questions and using the text to provide evidence of their thinking. The students will soon be working with understanding and identifying figurative language, analyzing poetry, writing poetry using specific guidelines, and finally, an oral presentation of their poems. Additionally, the students will end this quarter working with an argumentative essay. Topics will include the harms or necessity of child labor; the prevention or non-prevention of bullying, and whether we as humans have a greater responsibility in taking care of this planet. The students will be engaging in specific skills connected with an argumentative essay; some of these skills are reading and annotating informational text, citing text evidence to support ideas, writing a thesis statement, writing a counterclaim and refutation, and using transitions effectively to connect and strengthen ideas.

Eighth grade ELA has started a new unit focused on career exploration. Students have spent time researching possible careers of interest, including required education, salary, and availability of jobs. Carson Junior High's team of counselors have provided career and technical education presentations for the students, and Westwood High School teachers will be coming to visit and share insight on programs and classes offered on campus to further student career goals. All of this soon to be followed by eighth grade students picking their classes for freshman year!

MATHEMATICS

Happy new year from the Math Department! As we begin this new year we want our students to be focused on learning and preparing for the AzMerit testing that will take place in late April and early May. One way students can receive extra help is by attending tutoring. All math teachers provide tutoring before and after school. Have your child check with their teacher for specific schedules or you can just ask the office for our schedules.

If you have internet access at home, students can improve their math skills by working on Imagine Math. Imagine Math is a web-based learning system that we use in our math classrooms to reinforce math concepts that students may be lacking. It combines live teacher support, unique student motivation, and engaging adaptive instruction that helps students learn and love math.

Lastly, we invite you to join us for math and science activities during our Astronomy Night which will be held on February 20, from 6:00- 8:00 p.m. in the Carson gym.

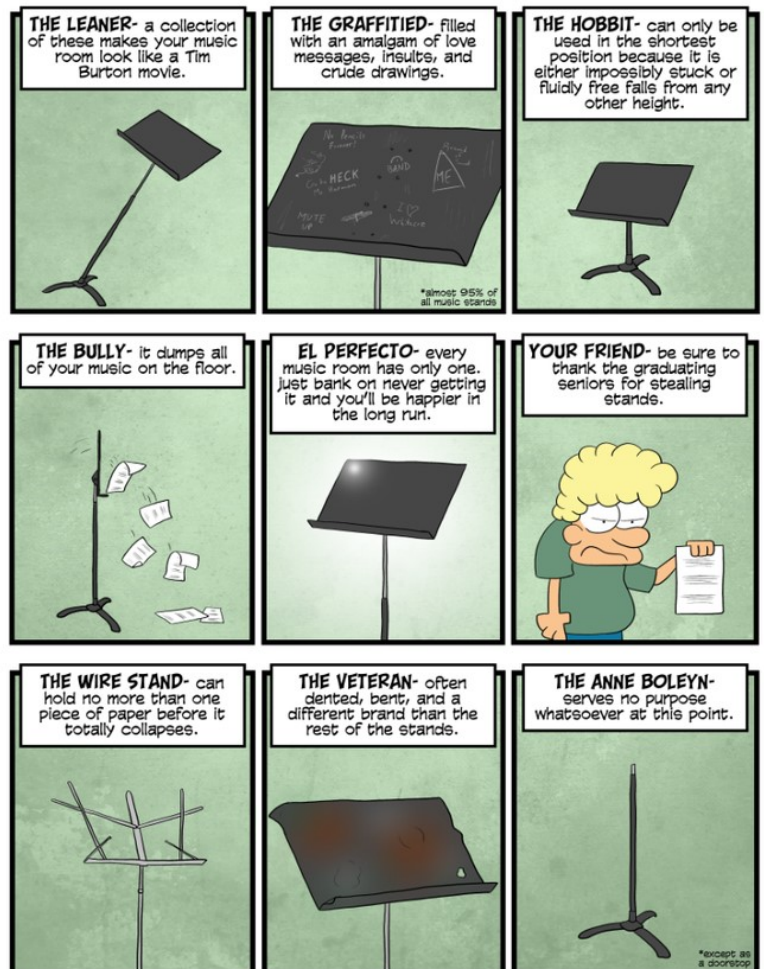
PERFORMING ARTS

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

7th and 8th grade science fair participants are completing their projects. They will be interviewed Wednesday February 7th. Good Luck!

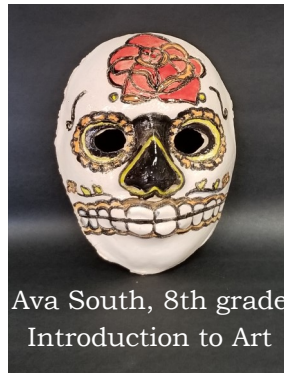
SOCIAL STUDIES

7th grade Social Studies spends the third quarter digging into the Industrial and Progressive Eras. The students have a wonderful opportunity to discover how the Industrial Era, while rich in invention and development, led to many social and political problems in America. They will then be able to follow along with the different Progressive Era reformers as they try to correct and improve these problems. We continue to work on our Cornell note process and questioning strategies, while also integrating Document Based Questions, creative assignments and projects. The Honors classes will be getting into research and development on their National History Day projects.

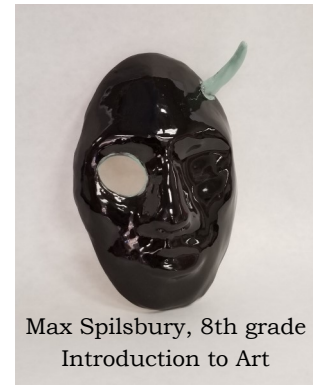
8th grade Social Studies has begun the quarter with a brief review of the Great Depression, and are now underway with our World War II unit. Students will have the opportunity to see the war unfold, completing an annotated timeline of the causes of the War. They will then spend some time learning about the events of the war, focused on Europe, the Pacific, and the home front. Students truly enjoy learning about this part of history and how different groups of people contributed to the war effort and how the world changed forever. 8th grade will then move forward in history, working through the Cold War Era. The Honors classes will take some time in and out of the classroom to compare events of the 1940s and 1950s to current events. They will find parallels and trends in politics and society, research them, and report on their events.

WORLD LANGUAGE

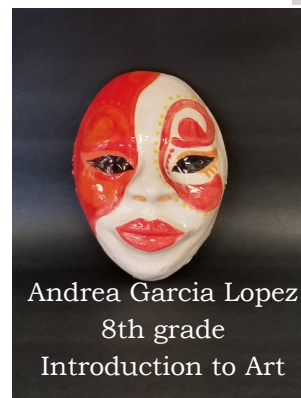
