## Gifted \& Talented Events at CESA 3

Selected $5^{\text {th }}$ and $6^{\text {th }}$, and $7^{\text {th }}$ and $8^{\text {th }}$ grade students will compete in spring math competitions hosted by Pecatonica Middle School this year. Last year we had a strong showing in both events with our $5^{\text {th }} / 6^{\text {th }}$ grade placing $2^{\text {nd }}$ among six schools in the Curie Regional.

In October a small group of $6^{\text {th }}$ graders went "Geo-Caching" with other area schools and GT advisor Mrs. Schaller. They did really well and held their own against area high school students. In December, a small group of middle school science students, with their teacher, Mrs. Skiborski, will learn how to build wind turbines.

Six Pecatonica high school students attended the annual University of Wisconsin - Platteville's Women in Engineering Day on Monday, October 26. Kara Craig, Rose Schmit, Mackenzie O'Connell, Rachel Brokish, Elisa Sullivan, and Krin Broshous, along with science teacher Mary Barr explored the many areas of engineering and other STEM fields offered at UW-Platteville. Female scientists and inventors discussed their paths into STEM careers from high school through college. At lunch there were career talks by Platteville professors and local female engineers. Pecatonica students built electrical circuits, created computer animations, experimented with the stored energy in a rubber band, and built windmills.

## Fifth Grade Happenings at Pecatonica Elementary School in Hollandale

One of the instructional methods that Pecatonica Elementary has been focusing on is differentiating the curriculum so that students who excel in one or a few areas have continued opportunity to grow and be challenged beyond the regular curriculum. Last school year, the district focused on revising and clarifying the Gifted and Talented policy for students in grades 3 and above. An example of this in process:

During the first quarter, $5^{\text {th }}$ grade has students reading and prepping for the Battle of the Books, a gifted and talented event hosted by CESA 3 in Fennimore. Mrs. Gronski offers a weekly "Mini-maker" stations in her classroom that extend the learning. For example, students were given three stories which shared a common theme. All were stories of people from other cultures and how they bonded together to solve a problem. The extension offered was an "illustrators study." The artwork in each book was completed by the same illustrator and it used reclaimed materials. Students experimented with this art and then completed a project that was displayed in the classroom and in the library.

Fifth grade was also the recipient of a 3D Printer, donated to the Elementary School by Chris and Jennifer Wetteland. Jennifer is a former Pecatonica Area School District Board Member. 3D printers incorporate science, technology, engineering, and mathematics by having students "write programs" or code the printer into creating anything they can imagine. 3D printers are used to create prosthetics, building materials like bolts or screws, sculptures or figurines from plastic. You can essentially build anything you want. All you need are the raw materials and the imagination and you can create it with a 3D printer.

## Veterans Day Celebrations at the Elementary School and Middle/High School

One of the highlights of the fall semester for many in both the Elementary Building in Hollandale and the Middle School-High School in Blanchardville, is the annual Veteran's Day Celebrations. Putting together a celebration of this caliber is a group effort. At the elementary school, various grades make decorations, hand-write invitations to the event (including breakfast) to Veterans and their spouses, as well as prepare songs and dances for the program. Led by the music director, Melissa Ashebrook and $5{ }^{\text {th }}$ grade teacher, Mary Sutter, the program always delivers on its promise to be one that many Veterans, spouses, and community members look forward to each year.

It's against the law.
Pecatonica High School has partnered with the Bureau of Prevention, Treatment, and Recovery (Division of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services) in the Wisconsin Department of Health Services to spread awareness of underage drinking. We all know that underage drinking is illegal. In addition to the long-term health consequences, it is one of the leading causes of death among teenagers.

The Parents Who Host campaign promotes safe prom and graduation events by discouraging underage drinking parties hosted by parents, family, and friends. Pecatonica High School will promote the following activities as a part of the PWH campaign:

- Provide information about PWH;
- Our guidance department and principal's office will provide outreach to the media including press releases and presentations to local groups;
- Work with local law enforcement, including targeted operations to prevent teenage drinking parties;

There are several local ordinances and even State Law that addresses underage drinking. If adults willingly or unknowingly "host" underage drinkers they can be sued for liability. If there is an accident or fatality as a result of this hosting, they can be held for criminal charges. There are so many "ifs" in these situations. The best way to keep yourself and teenagers safe is to not host parties and to report parties where underage drinking is occurring to the authorities.


Remember to continue to save the "Box Tops for Education" coupons on marked boxes and submit them to the elementary school. The money is used for special events at the school and various supplies that fall outside of the school budget, such as incentives for positive behavior within the building or on the busses and playground.

## A Review of the Pecatonica Area School District Attendance Policies

The attendance policy for the elementary building and the secondary building (grades 6-12) are essentially the same as in years past: Students are allowed 10 excused absence over the 180 days that school is in session. Excused absences include:

Doctor/ dentist or medical visits
"Family reasons"
Funeral leave
Personal illness
Inclement weather or impassible roads
School-imposed absences (such as suspension)
Once a student reaches the 10-day threshold, absences no longer are excused unless they are for medical reasons and are accompanied by a doctor's note stating that the student is under medical care. Students are always expected to make up the work they miss, and if the absence is expected (such as for a family reason) they must fill out a "planned absence form" for the secondary building to collect future assignments.
"Unexcused absences" are those that fall outside the parameters above. The school administration works directly with the student on a case-by-case basis. However, a student would become habitually truant if they are absent from school without an acceptable excuse for part of all of five or more days on which school is held during a school semester.

Parents receive notification of attendance after five and ten absences and the notice does include these guidelines. However the school district may refer a student for "habitual truancy" for excessive unexcused absences. Habitual truants are referred to the juvenile courts within the county of residence in accordance with state law and the provisions of the school district's truancy plan. This policy is in accordance with the Wisconsin State Statutes on compulsory attendance for public school students.

For any questions on this policy, please contact the building principal.

Just a reminder that the schools will be closed December 23 ${ }^{\text {rd }}, 2015$ through January $3^{\text {rd }}, 2016$. School resumes on Monday, January $4^{\text {th }}$. While the students are out there may be limited staffing in the building offices over the Christmas and New Year holidays.

## AP Courses and Boost Consortium and Curriculum at Pecatonica High School

Pecatonica High School has taken a good look at its curriculum offerings for the next few years and is excited to offer new opportunities for its students.

The High School is revamping their Advanced Placement (AP) Course Offerings for the 2016-17 school year. Instead of offering AP Statistics next year, the district will offer AP Calculus. The school also has an addition of a "new" computer science department with Doug Pibal and Mandi Peterson in the lead roles. Ms. Peterson will teach middle school and intro high school computer courses, while Mr. Pibal will teach introductory coding and advanced computer sciences and coding to high school students.

Along with five other area school districts, Pecatonica participates in the "Boost" Consortium for distance education. The school districts involved each teach a distance learning course - usually an AP course - and students in other districts sign up for it and participate in the course in a distance learning classroom on their home campus.

The BOOST Consortium schools are exploring ways in which they can incorporate courses from Southwest Tech another postsecondary options to potentially offer curriculum tracks such as a certified nursing assistant (CNA), medical terminology, and other tech-related courses. Stay tuned as we develop more opportunities for Pecatonica high school students in this area.
