Notice: The GISD Board of Education has called a bond election to be held on May 7th, 2022. The bond package is designed to accommodate the growth in our district and plan for the future.

The key areas of focus in the bond include a new elementary school, land purchase for a future high school, additions to the middle school that will include a full size gym and dining area, and additions to the high school that will include more classrooms and expansions to the locker rooms and Fine Arts program.

Other district wide improvements include addressing the drainage deficiencies at the softball field and along Tiger Lane, as well as a roof replacement at the high school.






Why Do Things Go Viral?

Academic UIL

Academic UIL was held Wednesday, March 23 in Bonham. Just in case you didn't know that we have an Academic team, let me tell you, WE DO! These students represent us in academic contests against other schools in our division. If a student or team advances to the State level, they become eligible for scholarships. Many colleges and universities like seeing that a student was on the academic team.

It is required to have a minimum of three or four on a team to qualify as a team. However, if there are not enough to make a team, a student may go as an individual and place that way.

All contest exams are timed, and have very strict rules.

We had three teams representing Gunter in the Mathematics division: Number Sense, Calculator Applications, and Mathematics. All of these are quite challenging!

The Calculator Applications is a thirty-minute contest comprised of 70 mathematical problems that are solved with a handheld calculator. There are 35 numerical: (21 stated and 14 geometry questions). Our team had four team members with two alternates. The team was represented by Viviana Galvan, Kamber Puebla, Drew Smith, and Kiana Swinfen. The alternates were Hayley Hegeman and Jackson Rue.

The Mathematics contest consists of a 40-minute, multiple-choice exam with 60 questions designed to test the knowledge and understanding in Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, AP Calculus (BC) and AP Statistics. Our team was represented by Alexis Marks, Kendel Marks, Dylan March and Drew Smith. The alternate was Kiana Swinfen.

The Number Sense contest involves a ten-minute, 80 question mental math test covering all high school mathematics courses. Short cuts need to be developed and practiced in order to compete and finish the test. No calculators or writing problems are allowed, you may only use your brain. Skipping a problem or getting an answer wrong is a deduction in points. Our team was represented by Landon Langley, Dylan Marsh, Kamber Puebla, and Jacson Rue. Alternates were Hayley Hegeman and Drew Smith.

The Copy-Editing contest contains three sections that must be completed in 15 minutes total: Part 1 – Each contestant selects the correct answer from the choices given – 20 questions. Part 2 – Each contestant identifies four errors in each of the five sentences. This year we were represented by two individuals: Alexis Marks and Kendel Marks.

The Ready Writing test is a long contest. Contestants are given two hours to write expository compositions. They have a choice between two prompts, each an excerpt from literature publications (both past and present) or speeches. This year we were represented by Christi Grayard.

The Spelling and Vocabulary contest consists of three parts. Part I: a 15-minute section of 30 multiple-choice items focused on vocabulary and proofreading. Part II & III: the hand-written spelling of 70 words pronounced aloud to the contestant, as well as a tiebreak section of 20 additional pronounced words. The words all come from a list provided by UIL. We were represented by Drew Smith.
